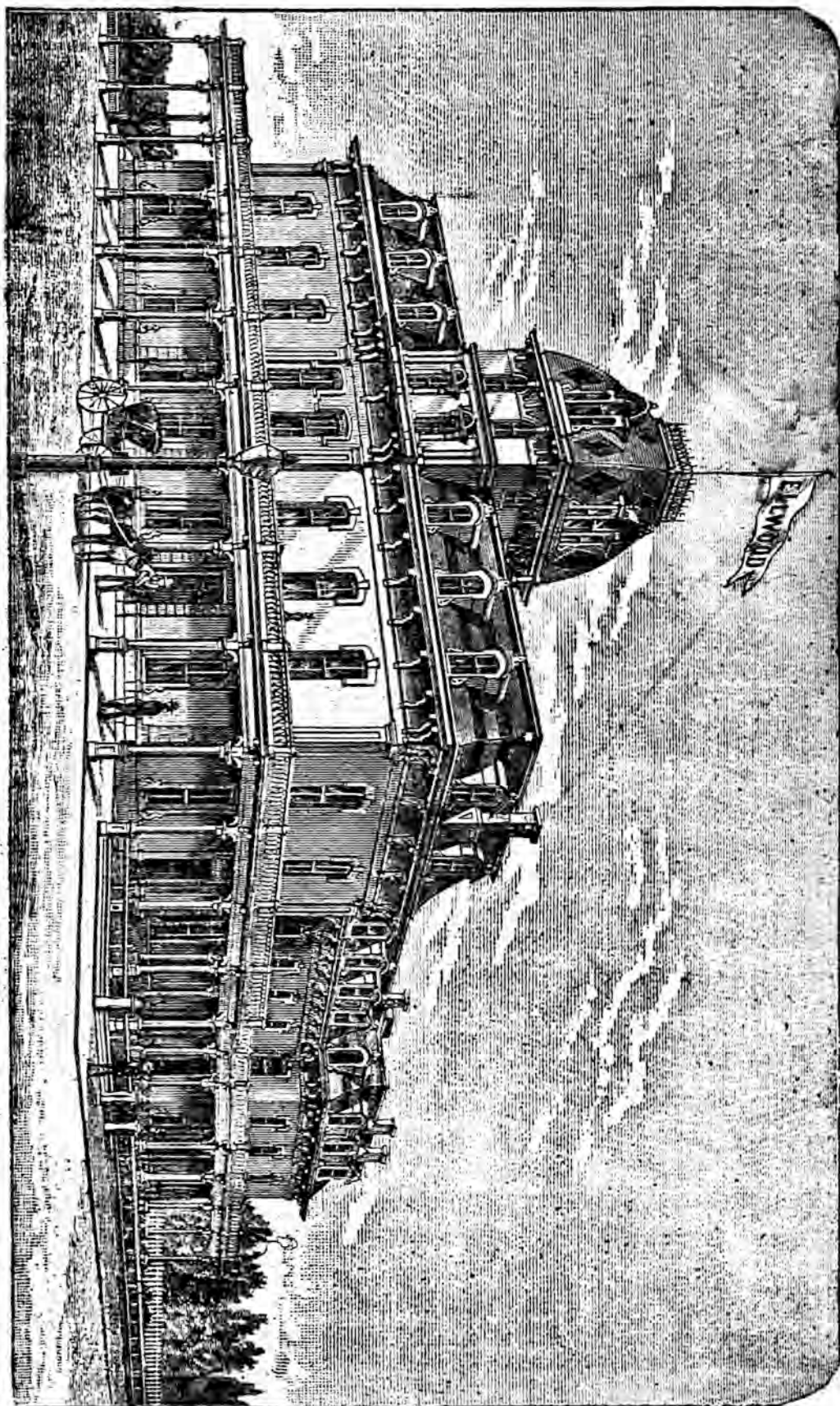

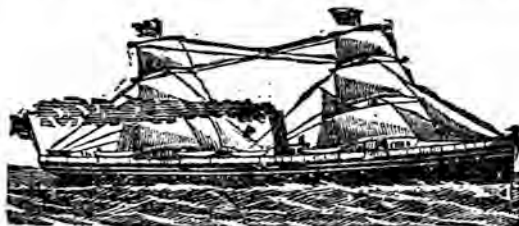

The Steamers **LOS ANGELES** and **EUREKA** sail for Santa Cruz, Monterey, San Simeon, Cayucos, Gaviota, Santa Barbara, San Buenaventura, Hueneme and San Pedro, as follows: At 8 a. m. on the 2d, 7th, 12th, 17th, 22d and 27th of each month.

Alaska Route.—The Steamship **IDAHO**, sails from Portland, Oregon, on or about the first of each month, for Port Townsend, W. T., Victoria and Nanaimo, B. 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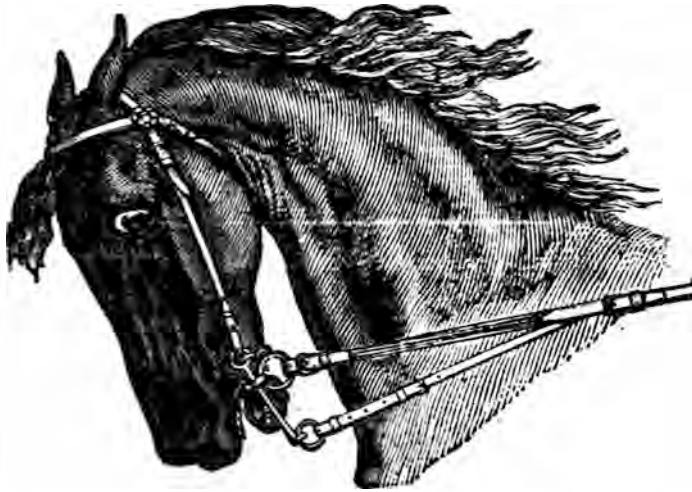

OUR DIRECTORY.

A WISE traveler once remarked that it was his invariable practice, after completing a journey, to sit down and carefully take a retrospective view of the whole route. We follow his example and look back over the ground already traversed.

The first Directory ever compiled for the City of Santa Barbara is finally completed. We have spared no pains to make the work of value and interest. The ground we cultivated was virgin soil,—no furrow had ever been plowed in that direction, to guide us, and we present the result to the people, not with any apology, since we have bestowed more labor upon it than is likely to be rewarded. But we trust to make the edition of 1887 an improvement upon the present one.

The General Directory contains 1336 names, certainly a creditable showing.

The Business Directory has the names of 298 business houses. We think this will prove a surprise to our readers. Few cities of double our size can boast so fine an array of prosperous and progressive business men as the City of Santa Barbara.

That we deserve the reputation which has gone abroad concerning us, as a place of broad and liberal culture, may be seen by a glance at our list of churches, schools, societies and fraternal organizations.

We give the first correct map ever published of the city streets, with the grand historical names properly spelled. This alone is worth the entire price of the Directory.

We hope our system of locating residences and business houses will be found satisfactory, as we had to evolve it from an entire lack of any system. In a city where the buildings are not numbered, it is often difficult to direct a stranger to any given house. But the late

action of the City Council, in causing the names of the streets to be painted at the corners will greatly simplify the matter, and our map will be found useful in combination with the corner signs.

Between the time of canvassing for names and the date of publication, several changes have occurred. Families have moved in and moved out again. Yet the Business Directory will be found reasonably complete, as few changes have lately taken place in business firms. It is perhaps unnecessary to state that transient visitors have not been admitted to the Directory. The names are those of bona fide residents.

We wish here to return our thanks to all those who have so kindly encouraged us in our novel undertaking. The public at large has taken that reasonable interest in our work which might have been expected from a sensible community. The liberal advertising patronage we have been honored with makes it a matter of propriety as well as pride to refer the reader to the advertising index as an epitome of the business strength of the City of Santa Barbara.



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THE CITY'S GROWTH.

A RECENT article in the INDEPENDENT gave a summary of late improvements in the City of Santa Barbara. Adding to the estimate there given several items then ignored, we find that the cost of buildings now going up or just on the point of completion, will amount to something over \$120,000. This is well within bounds of the actual facts. Many of the buildings are small homes, destined to receive the families of well-to-do citizens. There is nothing like a boom—no speculative residences are arising on the chances of obtaining high rents. It is simply a steadfast, healthy growth. Among others, several summer residences will be built by Northern or Eastern people, for the use of their families during a part of the year.

The most important improvements now going on may be said to be about the estero—or rather what was once an estero and an unsightly blot upon the face of the city. It had been for many years utilized as a dumping ground for all manner of refuse and presented to the stranger who approached from that side the appearance of a wilderness of old tin cans and unmentionable rubbish, except when happily covered by an inflowing tide. Upon this level the Land, Building and Improvement Company are making a race course which when completed will be one of the finest in the State. Eventually a pavilion for agricultural fairs will be added. The situation is an ideal one, on the border of the sea where cool winds may temper the hottest weather. The work of diverting the waters from the estero was done by the city authorities. The labor of filling the track has been enormous, but so energetically pursued, with such an army of men and teams, that citizens have scarcely had time to realize the extent of the work done. It is to cost when completed about \$15,000.

Lobero's Theatre is undergoing extensive repairs, having a new front added, the upper story of which will contain rooms for private

dancing parties. Other notable improvements are Nixon's new planing mill, the steam laundry, and additions to Stearns' wharf, the latter costing some \$16,000. We hope soon to chronicle the beginning of a sewer system.

Those who carefully study the personnel of the Directory will note that the city is well supplied with skilled artisans and laborers. It may also be observed that the class of idlers is not very largely represented. This is more apparent than real, since the Directory does not recognize tourists or transient people of any kind. Yet this class serves to swell our actual population to a noticeable extent. In the winter season especially the numerous hotels and boarding houses are filled to overflowing with travelers from all parts of the world. The number of those who seek Santa Barbara for health or pleasure is constantly increasing, and every year "the season" trenches further upon what used to be "the dull season." With the facilities for sea-bathing enjoyed by Santa Barbara, it is a mere matter of time when our summer guests shall be as numerous and as constant as our winter visitors. Had we not such delightful winters, we might be world-renowned for our beautiful summer weather. To an old resident there is little to choose between the two.

In speaking of improvements, the greatest of all has not been mentioned, and cuts no practical figure as yet in the Directory. Before another edition can be published, however, communication by rail will probably have been established between Santa Barbara and the rest of the world. From the headquarters of the S. P. R. R. we are assured that next year's crops may be taken to market by rail.

The classification of business houses in the Directory leaves little to be said on that point. But to citizens who have spent some years here it will show signs of material progress.

NEW DIRECTORY.

THE CITY OF SANTA BARBARA.

FOLLOWING the coast, for about 280 miles south of San Francisco, one comes upon a quiet, cozy little city. At first, it seems cut off from the rest of the world, for the high mesa rises on one side, and the rugged and lofty mountains of Santa Ynez loom up in the opposite direction and back of the city. In front beat the restless waves of the mighty Pacific. It is a most beautiful picture of charming homes, framed by the grand mountains, displaying forms and colors, lights and shades, changing with every moment and giving to the artist a continual feast of studies, lovely in the extreme.

This is the far-famed city of Santa Barbara, concerning which so many gifted men and women have written such beautiful accounts. This is the city to which men return, after travelling the whole world over, as the one spot in the universe where one might happily live and die.

A BRIEF HISTORICAL SKETCH.

The earliest authentic record of Santa Barbara is found in the narrative of Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo, a Portuguese navigator in the service of Spain, who, on the 27th day of June, 1542, just fifty years after the landing of Christobal Colon on the island of San Salvador, sailed northward from the western coast of Mexico, with two vessels, the San Salvador and the Victoria. He passed through the channel of Santa Barbara, observing upon the islands a dense population, "men and women of fair complexion." He claims to have spent months among the natives of what is now Santa Barbara county, and notes the names of forty populous villages on the mainland. After voyaging up the coast, Cabrillo returned, landing upon San Miguel island, where he died and was buried. All traces of his last resting-place have long since been obliterated by the shifting sands. Sixty years later, Sebastian Vizcaino, commanding a Spanish fleet, re-dis-

covered the channel and named it "Canal de Santa Barbara," presumably because it was reached upon the 4th of December.

Three hundred years ago, these valleys supported a swarming population. Its soil freely supplied nuts and wild fruits. Game abounded on the land and fish in the channel. The simple and indolent aborigines wore no clothing worth mentioning. All their necessities were furnished by a fertile soil with little labor, and their days were passed in calm security and animal comfort. At long intervals strange ships appeared in the roadstead. Strange men landed, procured supplies and sailed away. Gradually, it became known to the brawny rovers who sailed under the victorious banners of Spain, that California was not an island and not a peninsula, that the great river to the north did not connect with the Atlantic Ocean, and that neither the Isles of the Amazons nor the seven cities of Cibola lay in this direction.

The strangers continued to come, encroaching more and more upon the territory of the simple inhabitants, until this primitive race slowly faded away before the resistless rovers. Their day had reached its twilight one hundred years ago, when the Catholic religion and the Spanish arms had gained a firm foothold upon the Pacific Coast.

The first efforts of Christian civilization in this country were made by the Franciscan friars. The Mission of Santa Barbara was established in 1786, the eleventh in point of time among the Missions of California; that of San Diego, in 1769, being the first. After a few years of toil and privation the Holy Fathers began to grow in power and opulence. They were the temporal as well as the spiritual lords of the land. They cultivated, by the hands of their Indian converts, the olive, the fig and the vine, enjoying all the luxuries of a genial climate and a generous soil that this great and costless labor could produce. The whole race of natives were in fact serfs whose toil was repaid by spiritual blessings. Until 1830 the Fathers held undisputed sway. Missions were established all down the coast, making a close cordon from San Francisco to San Diego. In this county the Mission la Purisima was established in 1787; that of Santa Ynez in 1804.

From the year 1800 Anno Domini to 1822, (when the Spanish dominion was finally overthrown in Mexico,) were the halcyon days of the Mission system. The Fathers dwelt in patriarchal state; with regal revenues and powers. In 1825, it is recorded that the Mission of Santa Barbara possessed 75,000 cattle, 5,000 tame horses and mules, and 40,000 sheep.

But this also passed away. Mexico was in a chaotic, transitional state,—hurrying from revolution to revolution. Every new government sent new plunderers to loot the wealthy Missions. Finally, in 1833, the Mexican Government took possession of the Missions, and the greater number of them were allowed to fall into ruins. Only

the Missions of Santa Ynez and Santa Barbara were retained by the Franciscans. After the priestly dominion was followed by the military and civil rule of Mexico, now independent of Spain, Santa Barbara became a place of importance. Here certain Governors of the province resided, and here were held Departmental Assemblies, until the time of Pio Pico, in 1846, the last of the old-time Governors. In 1841 Los Angeles was the largest town in the Californias, and Santa Barbara and San Francisco were of equal size.

In 1846, the question of annexing California to England was discussed and decided negatively in an Assembly convened in Santa Barbara.

Then in 1849, came the grand event of the Pacific Coast; the discovery of gold. In the mad rush for sudden wealth, which drew the adventurous of all classes into its seething vortex, Southern California was almost abandoned. New centres of wealth and population were formed as if by magic. For twenty years this portion of the State lay in its golden sunshine, smiling and unknown. Rumors then began to spread of an unparalleled climate below Point Concepcion. Straggling invalids made their way here and wrote back ecstatic accounts of balmy, delicious airs and everlasting sunshine. In 1872, along with a crowd of health seekers from all parts of the United States, came Charles Nordhoff, an experienced journalist, whose enthusiasm and ardent praises awakened an unbounded interest in all parts of our common country, spreading even to Europe. The inhabitants of Santa Barbara awoke one morning and found their cherished valley famous!

From 1872 to 1875, nothing less than insanity ruled. Prices of property advanced, doubled, quadrupled! It was in those days that the country and climate were puffed out of all reason. Consumptives in the last stages of the disease thronged the streets and the hotels. Even private houses were filled with ghastly guests who ought never to have left their homes. The inevitable crash came, following on the heels of the Eastern panic,—and this was a ruined community.

In time, business recovered its tone, slowly but surely. The old enthusiasm gave way to a more even growth, and to-day Santa Barbara can boast of a solid and steady prosperity beyond the reach of any ordinary panic.—Mary C. F. Hall-Wood, in "Santa Barbara As It Is."

The county is still divided into the ranchos of the Mexican period. As a matter of special interest, and with the kind permission of Joseph J. Perkins, Esq., of this city, we append hereto the very valuable table compiled by him; showing at a glance these rancho divisions, with their acreage, etc. All lands not enrolled among these ranchos are either pueblo lands or unsurveyed Government lands. The city

of Santa Barbara and the suburbs of Montecito and Carpinteria are built upon pueblo lands.

OUR CITY OF TO-DAY.

Could one of those devoted men, who one hundred years ago founded the Mission, come back to the scene of his early labors, a most striking transformation would greet his eyes. Santa Barbara,

in that early time, was a beautiful valley, but thinly dotted with adobe dwellings. The people were kind-hearted though rude. The roads were poor. One might say there were no roads, but simply trails. There were few or no opportunities for acquiring an education. The place itself was wholly unknown to the world. To-day, the city of Santa Barbara boasts of the prettiest homes in the country; of a people renowned for culture, liberality and big-heartedness; of elegant school buildings; fine broad roads; of merchants whose stores and stocks would do credit to a metropolis; of two daily and three weekly newspapers; a fine Public Library, two well-conducted and prosperous banks; comfortable churches for all different religious denominations; elegant hotel accommodations, the fame of which has reached and even crossed both oceans; and above all, a matchless climate, offering ease and comfort to healthy tourists and a prolongation of life to the invalid.

During the past year many new buildings have been erected. Several of these residences are of great beauty and elegance. Prosperity is apparent on every side. There is no "boom," but a steady, healthy state of affairs, sure to be lasting in its effects. Many new families have taken up their abode with us, and every steamer brings its long list of tourists. Prices of city property are steadily mounting upward, and all signs indicate the growth and well-being of Santa Barbara.

This is as it should be. A city which offers so many natural beauties, so many charming drives, so many objects of interest, coupled with pure air and golden sunshine, blooming flowers and the finest fruits in the world, must always attract appreciative men and women from all parts of the world.

Many, coming to the city for the first time, expect to find a new town, a crude state of society. But Santa Barbara is really a very old city. Her history is rich in thrilling episodes. Would the reader understand that history? Let him read the names of her streets. In these are embodied the memoirs of grand events, which can never be forgotten as long as these names shall last. But hear them properly pronounced and you must admit their suggestive beauty. Learn but once the meaning and the history of these names and you will know the city's history.

For an example, Quinientos, the name of a street near the beach, means, in Spanish, the numeral 500. In speaking of the arrival here in 1847 of Colonel J. D. Stevenson's regiment, Chas. E. Huse, in his historical sketch published about nine years ago, gives the incident which led to the naming of this street in 1852, at the time Captain Salisbury Haley made his survey of the town: "A cannon, a brass twelve-pounder, had been landed on the beach to be transhipped to Monterey, to be placed on the fortification there. One dark night

some of the native Californians proceeded to the beach and removed this cannon to the southern edge of the estero and rolled it in or buried it in the sand. The next day search was made for it, but in vain. It is said that the native Californians tried to make the military authorities believe that some sailors from the vessel on which it was intended to be shipped had taken it aboard of a boat to carry it to the vessel and had lost it overboard on their way out. The story, however, was not credited, and the municipal authorities were ordered to produce and restore the cannon, or pay its value. As the cannon was not forthcoming, Governor Mason imposed a fine of \$500 upon the town. A list of the property-holders was made out, and each one was assessed his portion of the sum, according to his capacity to pay. A company of dragoons was sent here from Los Angeles to compel the payment of the fine. Some paid the amounts assessed against them; others would not, and so much of their property as was necessary to satisfy their assessments was seized and sold at public auction."

Commencing at the northeast of the city, the first street is called San Buenaventura. This is so named because it is nearest to San Buenaventura, and though thirty miles distant, it was the nearest village when the street was christened. Pitos street was named from the carisos or reeds growing there, from which flutes were made. Punta Gorda, because it runs into a high bluff bank. Indio Muerto, because some Indian was found dead in that vicinity. Cacique, the title of the Chief of any tribe of Indians. Carpinteria, because it was on the route usually traveled in going to the Carpinteria twelve miles east of this city. Carpinteria itself means a carpenter's shop, and was so named from the fact that a man had such a shop in that locality, near the creek which now bears that name. Mason street was named after Governor Mason, who imposed the military fine of \$500. Yanonali street takes its name from a famous old Indian bearing that name, who lived here. Montecito street pointed in the direction of the beautiful valley bearing that name. Gutierrez was called after Don Octaviano Gutierrez, who was a member of the Town Council. Haley street was, of course, named after Salisbury Haley, who made the famous "Haley Survey." Cota street was named after the Cota family living here, which has representatives to-day. Ortega was named after the numerous Ortega family. De la Guerra was named after Captain De la Guerra y Noriega.

Carrillo took its name from Don Joaquin Carrillo, the District Judge, whose house fronted upon it. Figueroa was named after Governor José Figueroa, whose bones repose in the vault of the Mission Church. He was appointed by the President of Mexico in April, 1832; landed at Monterey January 15th, 1833. Anapamu was named after an Indian chief whose sway extended from Santa Ynez to San Fernando. Victoria was named after Governor Manuel Victoria,

who took command of this Department of Mexico, January 31st, 1831. Sola street took its name from Governor Vicente de Sola, who was Governor from 1815 till 1823. Micheltorena street derived its name from Governor Manuel Micheltorena, who was appointed by the President of Mexico, and took charge of the Government, December 30th, 1842. Arellaga street takes its name from José Joaquin de Arellaga, a man of distinguished learning and who became Governor, April 9th, 1792. He remained Governor till 1794. Valerio street was named after a renowned Indian robber who lived in a cave in the Santa Ynez mountains. Yslay is named from the fruit of a tree which the Indians here were accustomed to pick for their sustenance. Pedregosa means "stony," and was so called because the creek named Arroyo Pedregosa, a stony creek, cuts through it. Mission street was so named because it was next to the Mission of Santa Barbara.

Taking the streets which run across the city from southeast to northwest; Salinas street was so named because it runs into a salt pond. Cañada, because it runs into a cañada or ravine. Soledad, a solitude, because that part of the town was solitary and uninhabited when this name was applied to it. Voluntario, or volunteer, because it runs into the hill on which Fremont's battalion of volunteers had their camp. Alisos, or Sycamore street, was named from the sycamores growing there. Milpas street was so called from the sowing ground of the Indians in that locality, "Milpa" meaning a sowing patch. Nopal street derives its name from the prickly pear, or Indian fig, *cactus opuntia* L., growing there in abundance. Quarantina street was named because some vessels were put into quarantine at the foot of that street. Salsipuedes street means "get out if you can." (*Sal si puedes*). It takes its name from the gulches and ravines which it crosses, rendering traveling on it difficult. Canal, or Channel street was named from the fact that it was the first street on that side which extended to the canal or channel of Santa Barbara. Laguna street passes through a swamp of Lagoons. Jardinez or Garden street, cuts through the garden of Captain De la Guerra and other gardens. Santa Barbara street was named after the town itself. Anacapa street points toward one of the islands of the Channel named Anacapa Island. The meaning of this Indian word is unknown. State street, is the principal street, and was so called from the State of California. Chapala street is named after a town in Mexico, from which some of the early emigrants came to this place. De la Viña street, or Vineyard street, was laid out through a vineyard planted in 1802 by Governor Goycochea. Baños was so named because it leads to that part of the sea beach where it was customary to bathe. Baños signifies baths. Castillo or Castle street, led to the hill on which was erected an old Spanish fort, mounted with cannon, one of which may now be seen standing upright on the corner of State and Cañon

Perdido streets. Rancheria street took its name from a cluster of Indian huts at that point, forming a rancheria, or settlement. San Pascual street was named after the district of country where the battle of San Pascual was fought between the American forces and the California troops, in 1846. San Andres street took its name from Andres Pico, who commanded the California forces in that battle. Chino street derived its name from the name of the "Rancho del Chino," on which the battle of San Pascual took place. Gillespie street was named after Captain Gillespie, who was in command of the American troops at the battle of San Pascual. Robbins street was named after Captain Thomas Robbins, who was the owner of the rancho of Las Positas, to which this street extends.

Clock Building. M. C. Rust, Librarian. Following is an extract from the rules and regulations:

Any resident of Santa Barbara above the age of twelve years, who shall have signed the prescribed application card, and furnished an acceptable guarantor, shall be entitled to borrow books from the Library for home use. Non-resident tax payers are entitled to the same privileges as residents of the city. Any resident of the County of Santa Barbara (not a resident of, nor a tax payer of the city of Santa Barbara) above the age of twelve years, can be entitled to the same privileges as residents of the city, by the payment of five dollars per annum or fifty cents per month, in advance. A borrower may retain a book for two weeks, but no longer, unless renewed. For each day in excess of two weeks, or four weeks if renewed, that the book is kept, a fine of five cents will be exacted. Any borrower who shall refuse to pay such fine, or who shall deface, mutilate, or write in any book, will be excluded from the privileges of the Library. All injuries to books beyond a reasonable wear, and all losses shall be made good to the satisfaction of the Librarian by the person liable; every book detained longer than four weeks beyond the time limited, being held to be lost. Borrowers must not loan their books to any one not a member of the same household. Only one book can be obtained at a time. No book delivered to a person owing a fine or penalty.

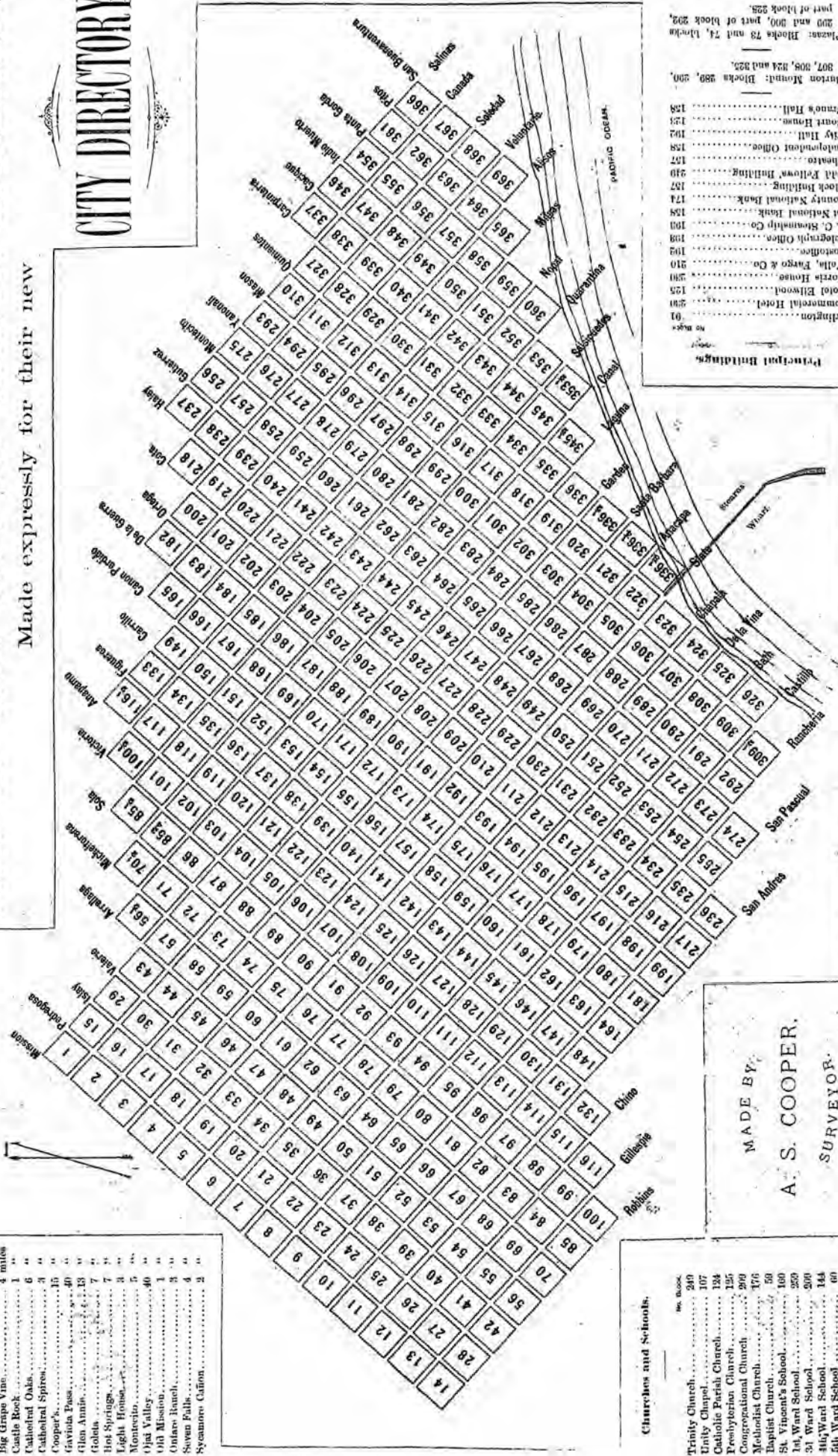

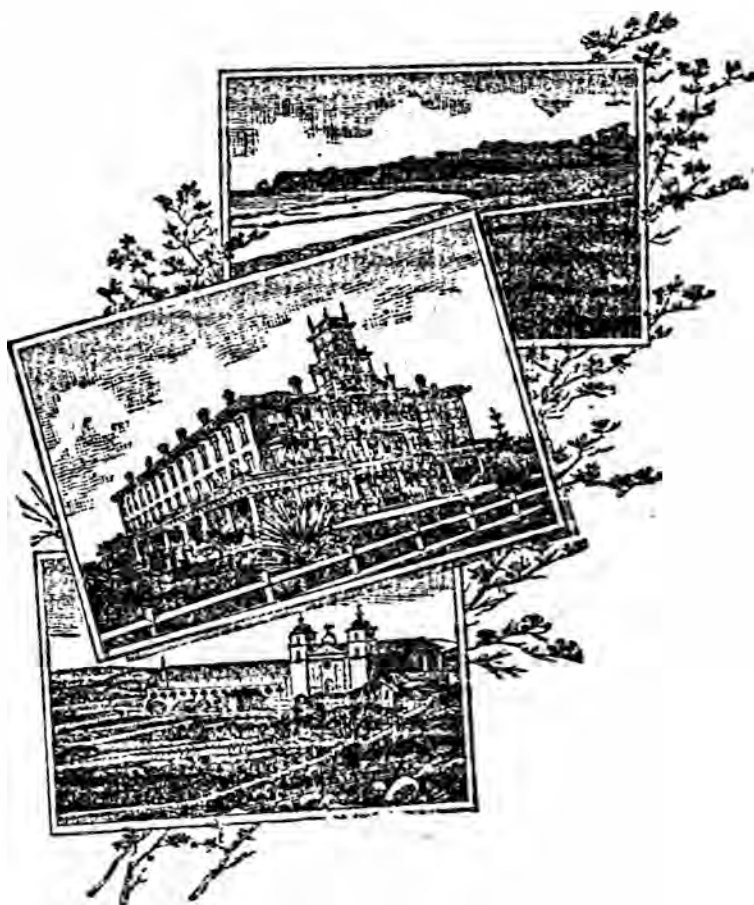
