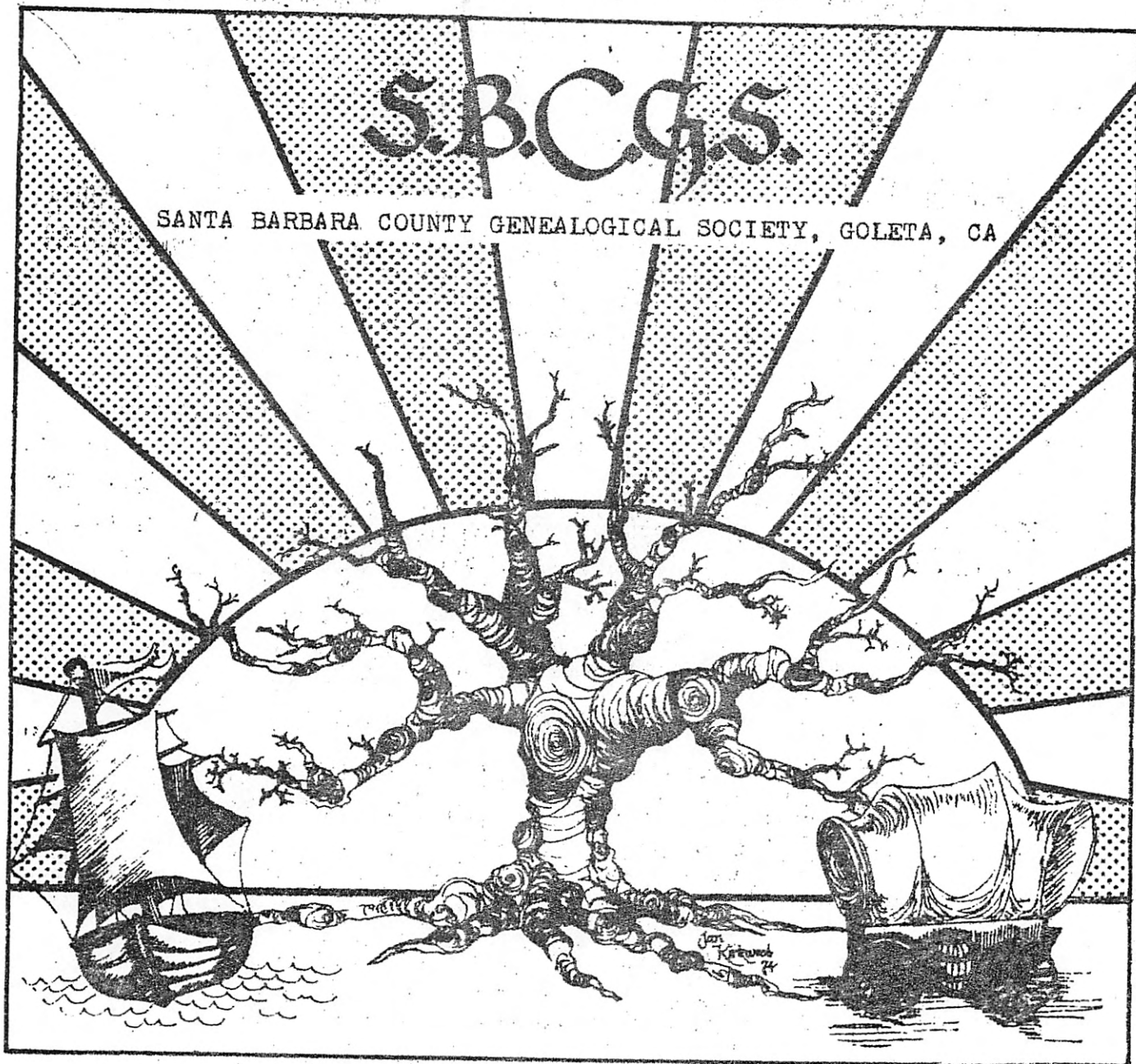

SAMUEL SHAW AND SOME OF HIS DESCENDANTS

COMPILED BY MARGAREE FRY CHURCH COX

When I first suspected that my ancestor Samuel Shaw had a brother Thomas, I began to do research on Thomas Shaw, in the hope of learning the names of their parents and from what parish in Ireland they came. In this I have not been successful. I have learned only that Samuel was born in "Northern Ireland" and that Thomas was born "near Belfast". While I have no proof that they were brothers, the more I learn of these two men, the more convinced I am that they were closely related. Upon arriving in this country, they both settled in Cumberland Co., Penna., and volunteered for service in the American Revolution from there, serving under the same officers during their initial enlistments; they both moved to Kentucky and settled in Ruddel's Mills, Bourbon Co.; they knew, and their children married into, the same families and many of the same given names are repeated among their descendants.

Several slightly different year dates have been found for the arrival of Samuel in this country, but Thomas Shaw states in his Revolutionary War Pension Application (No. 7491) that he sailed from Belfast in 1772, and I can only surmise that they came together. This is strengthened by the fact that the first property deed I find for Samuel Shaw is dated 20 Oct. 1772. He bought 286 acres, 76 perches from David English in Rye Twp., Cumberland Co., Province of Penna. for which he paid forty-three pounds, eight shillings lawful money of the Province. (At this time, Samuel Shaw was 16 years old and Thomas Shaw was 19). This property is located just over the hill from the small, narrow Racoon Valley in what is now Perry Co. One wonders why a young man coming to a strange country chose a particular location. Perhaps it was because he or his family knew someone else who had settled there. About ten years ago I had the privilege of driving through this area with Mr. Harry Lenig who is steeped in it's history. He pointed out Samuel Shaw's property to me and the properties in the Racoon Valley where lived the Blacks, Marshalls, Grahams and Robinsons, all Scotch Irish families who became related by marriage, and, who knows, may have known each other in Ireland and even further back in Scotland. This is part of the larger area called Sherman's Valley.

In Bk. 1, p. 195, Carlisle, Cumberland Co., Penna., is the will of John Black, dated 9 April 1790, in which he mentions, "my beloved wife Abigail Black". Further in the will, "also I will and bequeath unto my daughter Rebekah and her husband Samuel Shaw....." Mrs. Rebecca Marshall Cathcart in, A Sheaf of Remembrances, Minnesota Historical Society Collections, Vol. XV, 1915, says, "My maternal grandfather was Samuel Shaw; I know he lived in Carlisle, Pa., and married my grandmother there, her maiden name being Rebecca Lowry Black; I was named Rebecca Lowry after her". Actually, Samuel Shaw did not live in Carlisle, but it was the county seat of Cumberland County in which he lived.

In Samuel Shaw's Revolutionary War Pension Application (No. S31359), he states that he was born in 1756 in Northern Ireland. When asked if he has any record of his age, he answers, "I have a record of my age now in my possession, which was made by my father upon the blank leaf of a Bible". He volunteered 3 Aug. 1776, 4th

Battalion, Pennsylvania Line, Capt. Clark, Col. Frederick Watts and served until Oct. 1776. He says he was acquainted with Gen. Israel Putnam, Col. Forman and Col. Morgan. He enlisted three subsequent times and was in the battles of White Marsh and Gulf Mills, and marched through New Jersey, Pennsylvania and parts of New York. Affidavit by Jonathan Robinson, who lived in Scott Co. Ky. but whose address at the time was Washington, D. C., where he was serving as Senator from Kentucky. Jonathan Robinson married Jane Black sister to Samuel Shaw's wife. Their son, James Fisher Robinson was the 22nd governor of Kentucky (1862-3).

Also, in Penna. Archives, 6th Series, Vol. 23 - Samuel Shaw joined the 7th Battalion of Cumberland Co. Militia in 1777 formed July 31st and made up of men who lived north of the Blue Mountain. In the 2nd Company the Capt. was James Power (who married David Marshall's sister Mary), 1st Lieut. was David Marshall, 2nd Lieut. was Samuel Shaw. In Dec. 1780, all the same men are found in the 5th Battalion with David Marshall, Captain of the 3rd Company and 1st Lieut. Samuel Shaw.

Before 1786, Samuel Shaw and his wife Rebecca, moved to Allegheny Co. Pa. thence to Bourbon Co. Ky. in 1795, where he settled at Ruddle's Mills to which place Thomas Shaw had moved in 1785. This was also near the residence of David Marshall who had moved in 1785 to Millersburg, Bourbon Co. Ky. Mrs. Rebecca Marshall Cathcart, in the reference before mentioned, says, "In 1830 my grandfather Shaw having become dissatisfied with slavery, decided to remove to a free state and Illinois attracted him. He went to Quincy with his unmarried children.....his wife having died, and located on a farm three miles out of the village".

Samuel Shaw made his will 9 July 1833 and died 10 July 1833, in the cholera epidemic which was rampant that year.

Maribelle Cormack in her History and Genealogy of the Michael Marshall Family (Michael was brother to David Marshall), describes Samuel Shaw, "Rev. Samuel Shaw, a Scotch Irish Presbyterian preacher". She gives no reference for this statement so I cannot verify it.

Penna. in the War of the Revolution, Edited by John Blair Linn, Wm. H. Egle, M.D. Vol. II, Harrisburg, Lane S. Hart, State Printers, 1880 - Samuel Shaw described as a tailor. This seems consistent with a story told by my mother about his son, John Shaw. John was a very meticulous dresser, never going out onto the street without being dressed in a well tailored suit, white ruffled shirt, gloves and his silver headed cane. In consequence, people in Sidney, Ohio, called him "Gentleman John". Since most men in those days had several occupations, it is possible that Samuel Shaw preached on Sundays, farmed during the week and tailored in the winter months.

Issue not in proper order due to lack of dates -

I. Samuel T. Shaw, Sr. (son of Samuel & Rebecca (Black) Shaw was born in Pa. date unknown, went to Bourbon Co. Ky. with his family, where he grew up. He left Ky. in 1824 with his wife, name unknown, and infant son, settling in Millersburg, Bourbon Twp. Callaway Co. Mo. Here he died intestate, there existing only one brief paper concerning his estate. John Nesbit was appointed administrator on 28 Dec. 1841. On 21 Feb. 1843, Martin

Baker and Robert E. Baker were bound for \$1000.; Martin Baker appointed guardian for the four "infant orphans" of Samuel Shaw deceased. The following information about his heirs from Mrs. Richard James, Emporia, Kansas, an eager searcher of the Vivion family; an article which she sent from History of Callaway, Cole, Moniteau, Morgan, Benton, Miller, Maries and Osage Cos. Mo. Goodspeed Pub. Co. 1889; census records, settlement of estate of Samuel T. Shaw, Esq.

1. Samuel T. Shaw, Esq. (son of Samuel T. Shaw, Sr.)
 In 1860 census for Callaway Co. Mo. he was living in Millersburg, Bourbon Twp. age 36, Farmer, born Ky. He was only six months old when brought to Mo. by his parents. He married Mary J. Baker, born in Mo. ca. 1830. "Samuel T. Shaw departed this life domiciled in Callaway Co. Mo. 18 July 1905 intestate and a widower leaving as his next of kin and only legal representative Mrs. Helen Shaw McGregor a granddaughter, being the only child and heir of Thos. W. Shaw, now deceased, who was a son of said Samuel T. Shaw, deceased." Mrs. McGregor described as a non-resident of the state of Mo. and value of estate will decrease unless administrator appointed.
 - A. Thomas W. Shaw, graduated with honors 1871, Westminster College, Fulton, Mo. Went to St. Louis and pursued the study of law under Governor Charles P. Johnson, the leading lawyer and advocate of the state. Admitted to the bar in St. Louis, 1874, with highest congratulation from the court. Was building up a lucrative practice when in 1879 his health broke down and he returned to his father's farm for rest and recuperation. He became so involved in the management of the farm that he never returned to the law. He married 1st of July 1878, Mattie M. Jackson (dau. of Cortes & Julia Jackson) from Fayetteville, Ark. One dau. Helen.
2. John Shaw (son of Samuel T. Shaw, Sr.) was born ca. 1830 in Mo. In the 1860 census Callaway Co. Mo. he is listed as 30 yrs. old, Farmer, living in household of his brother Samuel T. Shaw. 1870 census, listed as 40 yrs. old with wife Nancy, 30 yrs. old, born Mo. and a son Willie Shaw, 8 yrs. old. Not found in Callaway Co. in 1880.
3. Mary Caroline Shaw (dau. of Samuel T. Shaw, Sr.) was born ca. 1832, Mo. died 7 April 1863, Mo. Married 28 Feb. 1852, Callaway Co. Mo. William H. DEATH OF JOHN SHAW - On Tuesday afternoon there died in Sidney her oldest citizen, and one of the pioneers of Shelby county, John Shaw was born on the 8th day of January 1786, in the State of Pennsylvania, near the city of Pittsburg. When about ten years old he moved with his parents to Bourbon county, Kentucky. On the 9th of November 1809 he was married to Margaret Marshall, of the old Kentucky Marshall family, the Rev. Abraham Craig officiating; and soon after moved to Ohio, settling in Highland county, near the town of Hillsboro. Early in the year 1812 he took his young wife and two children back to his old home in Kentucky, and there enlisted in the army in the company of one Captain W. Davis, and went into active service. After his discharge he settled again in Bourbon county, Kentucky, where he lived until 1830. In 1822, on the 13th of May, his first wife died, and in August 1824, he was married to Sarah Steele by the Rev. William Rainey. In the month of October, 1830, he moved with his family to Shelby county, this time leaving his Kentucky home on account of his repugnance to the institution of slavery. He settled on a farm immediately north of the present county infirmary where he lived until the year 1846, at which time he sold his farm and moved to Sidney, where he lived until the day of his death. Soon after moving to Shelby county he was elected a ruling elder in the United Presbyterian Church of Sidney, in which capacity he continued to serve as long as he lived. He had four children by his first wife - one son died in 1843. Mrs. John Wright, of Washington township, who died several years ago, was one of the daughters. Mrs. Robert Wilson and Mrs. J. T. Fry, the other two daughters, are still living. The husband of the former died in 1868. His second wife bore him no children. She died last summer in her 89th year. By comparing dates it will be seen that Mr. Shaw died in his ninetieth year. He was physically a man of strong constitution, six feet high, and as straight as an arrow until he lay down to die of old age, less than a week ago. He had a strong vigorous mind, largely endowed with practical common sense. With a gentlemanly deportment, a high sense of humor, plain spoken, strictly honest, and a consistent Christian, he lived at peace with mankind, and died at peace with his maker.

Before John Shaw moved to Sidney, Ohio, most of the children of Thomas Shaw had moved there, so John had many relatives there, which, no doubt, influenced him in choosing that location rather than going to Missouri or Illinois with his father and siblings.

John Shaw's Pension Application for service in the War of 1812, No. 1957. He was stationed at Newport, Ky. guarding British prisoners of war, which were imprisoned far inland, so they could not get back to the British ships should they escape.

Written in family notes I find, "John Shaw presented a fine figure on a horse, and mounted from the ground a few days before his death."

Joseph & Abigail (Shaw) Marshall left Kentucky in 1820 and went to Missouri where they settled on a farm near Boonville. Their daughter, Mrs. Rebecca Marshall Cathcart, in reference previously mentioned, goes on to say, "my father had financial reverses in Missouri, chiefly owing to the burning of a large barn stored with tobacco, and he decided to join my mother's family at Quincy. I was born on May 30, 1830, and in the following September my father moved to Quincy. They traveled, as all emigrants did in those days, in covered wagons during the daytime, and camped out at night. My father bought a farm in the vicinity of grandfather Shaw (Samuel Shaw), but before he was able to move onto it he was taken ill with typhoid fever and died, leaving my mother with six children, the eldest one twelve years old, and the youngest, myself, six months. Now came the time to show what a heroine my mother was; she moved to the farm with her small children that fall, and the first winter proved a terrible one for her. She and all the family had the ague, as indeed all the inhabitants of that region were subject to chills and fever; my mother had a chill every alternate day, and on the intervening well day she worked hard to get ready for the sick day. I was so ill that my aunts kept me at my grandfather's place; no one thought I would live, nor desired me to live, as it was

deemed I could not have good sense should I live; yet now I am well and vigorous after eighty-three years of active life.

In 1833 an epidemic of cholera visited the country and was particularly severe in Quincy and the surrounding district. My grandfather Shaw and my oldest brother were stricken with the dread disease, and both died the same day; my aunts were helpless from fright, and my mother had everything to do; she prepared them for the burial, and returned from the funeral to take up her burden again.....

My mother's next trial was the death of the eldest of the remaining children from fever; after this she rented the farm and moved into the village of Quincy. My first recollections begin when I was about five years old; our family numbered five, my mother, two brothers, aged nine and eleven, a sister seven years old, and myself; my sister died in her eighth year.....

My mother was a strict disciplinarian; with her to speak was to be obeyed. I remember one instance: my brother William was very easily provoked to laughter, and one day began laughing in school; the teacher demanded to know what caused him such mirth; my brother's answer did not please the teacher, and he gave him a severe whipping. My brother felt that the teacher was unjust, so he took his books and went home; mother heard his complaint, and then took down a whip and told him to return to school, which he did. The teacher afterward acknowledged he was wrong, and begged my brother's forgiveness.

My mother had two brothers who served in the Black Hawk War; one died during the war....."

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BOOK REVIEW

A CATALOGUE OF BRITISH FAMILY HISTORIES, compiled by T. R. Thomson. Charles E. Tuttle Co., Inc., Rutland, Vermont. c 1976 184 pages.

This "complete" list of British Family Histories includes the areas of English, Scots, Welsh and Irish names. It does not include "mere pedigree collections, biographies, peerage claims, publications of the Clan Societies, histories of businesses, and works published in America". So if you do not find your ancestor's name in the alphabetized contents, this by no means excludes the possibility that there may be published or unpublished material about him.

The book gives title, author, place and date of publications and indicates which work has been privately printed. A few are well-known works, some limited publications, many privately printed. They range from carefully compiled, scholarly efforts to "obviously unreliable".

There is of course a preponderance of Earls, Dukes and Lairds, with 22 books listed about the Stewarts. "More has probably been written about the genealogy of this family than any other".

But if you do not know if you have distinguished or royal blood, search anyway for your family name. Descendants of the book's subjects may have wandered this far afield with representatives of these families: AMES, BAKER, CHILD, COLE, COX, GLEN, GORDON, JOHNSON, LITTLE, MILLER, MOSS, NORRIS, PEEL, REID, RICHARDSON, ROSS, SMITH and WEST.

There is a wide range of approach from modest reality - "Those Damned Tomkineons" - to the ethereal. A 1652 volume takes the Urquhart line back "(not one instant being omitted since the beginning of Motion) since the Creation of the World until this present year of God, 1652". Who could resist the wish to read this remarkable work, whether related or not?

Geographical influences on a name are explored with "Vance in Ireland, Vans in Scotland, 'anciently Vaux' in Scotland and England, and originally de Vaux in France".

From Abbot to Yvery, the catalog makes interesting reading. However, a previous reviewer notes that "many were written for private circulation only and some are not to be found even in the British Museum". So once you have found your name, you may still have a prolonged search to find the work mentioned. A hint for English searchers says to investigate also the catalogue of the Library of the Society of Genealogists in England and also the current genealogical bibliography of the Library of Congress. Even with its limitations, this is a supplemental source of English ancestry that is well worth studying for names and for incidental genealogical information.

THE HISTORY OF NANTUCKET: County, Island, Town Including Genealogies of First Settlers. By Alexander Starbuck. Charles E. Tuttle Company, Publishers, Rutland, Vermont. ©1969. Illustrated. Maps. 371 pp.

Norsemen explored the area of Nantucket Island before it was "discovered" in 1502, and early settlers came to stay in 1659. English settlers included Quakers and in 1692, the Island was included when the Plymouth Colony and Massachusetts were united under Massachusetts rule.

A great whaling industry was developed but wars brought special problems to the seafaring people, with embargoes making it hard to provide the necessities of life, and privateers threatening lives and ships at sea. Hardships took their toll and sent many to new locations.

These were remarkably articulate people, and along with official documents in the book is a running commentary of delightful small tales in notes on every page, with mini-plots as interesting as the main historical development. It is as if every witness to the lively incidents went home to write a letter or enter the day's events in his diary. Mrs. Fanning's Diary is quoted as the authority for many stirring events.

The author is descended from an early settler and his family has obviously maintained a continued interest in collecting and treasuring details of life of the Island.

It is unfortunate that the index is not detailed to list the hundreds of names that appear in the copious notes and throughout the text, but many genealogies appear in detail. These names are found with "The First Purchasers": STANARD, LUNNER, COFFIN, COLEMAN, FOLGER, GARDNER, HUSSAY, RACY, STANBROCK, SWAIN, WORTH.

The fascinating adventures are fine reading in their own right and many have a personal interest in the heritage of these durable, resilient people. "There is hardly a section of the country where one may not run across a native of Nantucket".

THE "MARY AND JOHN": A Story of the Founding of Dorchester, Massachusetts, 1630. by Lucie Pinney Kuhns. Published by Charles E. Tuttle Company, Rutland, Vermont. ©1971. Bibliography. Index. 264 pp.

In 1630, a group of 140 people, mostly from Devonshire, Dorsetshire, and Somerset in England, sailed in the ship "Mary and John" for the new land across the Atlantic. The New England settlement was named Dorchester, in honor of one of their ministers, Reverend John White, of Dorchester, England.

THE BOOK CROSSER, continued

Their two ministers were of the Established Church of England but they too wanted more freedom, so their purpose and their experiences touched the same life trends as their wilderness neighbors.

A brief historical account is given in the book, but its main purpose is genealogical, and it is a treasure for family seekers. Well organized and well indexed, the book lists 55 ancestral charts of the "Mary and John" passengers. Well known names appear: Ethan Allen, William Deway, Jonathan Edwards, Grant, and Captain Nathan Hale are in the list. But many other names appear in the 5 generation charts of the families of descendants, now scattered through the nation.

The bibliography lists books about the history of the area and its people. Its expanse of genealogical information makes the book valuable to a wide range of readers.

A limited number of reprints have been made of the book, THE OGDYKE GENEALOGY, containing the OGDYKE-OPDYKE-O DYKE-UPDYKE American Descendants of the Jesel and Holland Families, by Charles Wilson Oddyke, originally published in 1889. 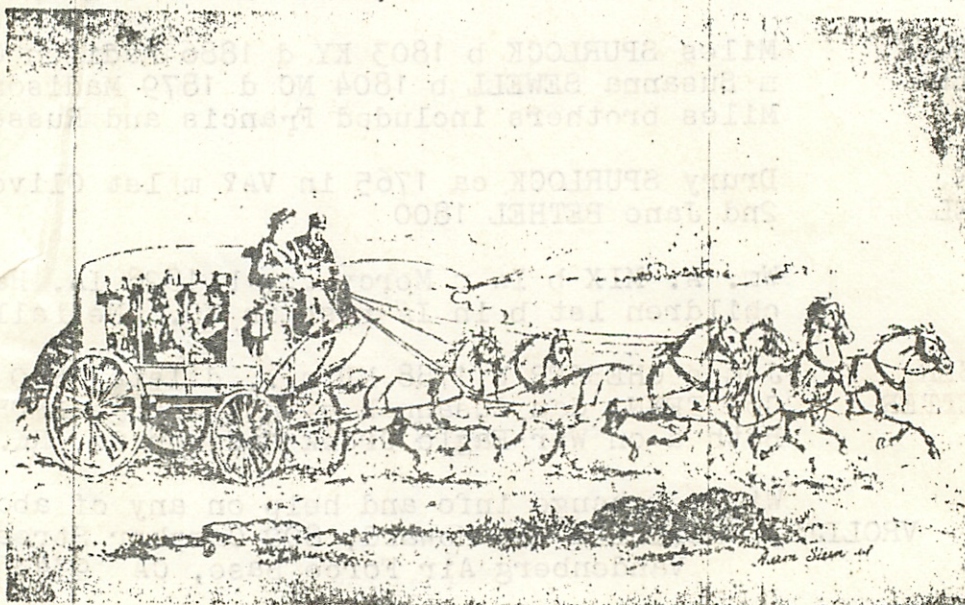
