

THE FRILLS OF GENEALOGY

The genealogy hobby generally consists of two activities: researching and recording. Of the two, researching is probably the most interesting and the most rewarding. The recording of notes on the various forms and the follow up indexing and documentation is less fun. Indeed, it can be a chore. There are, however, a few innovations that could be put to use which can result in overcoming a chore while at the same time making your records more interesting and appealing to family and friends be they genealogy "bugs" or not. These are some of the frills of genealogy which may be time-consumers, but may make the difference between just another family tree and one with the sparkle and animation of the traditional Christmas tree.

Color The Lines. The lines on a pedigree chart connect parents to offspring. This is well known to the genealogist and fairly obvious to anyone else viewing such a chart. Color-coding those lines adds a whole new dimension to the chart. Not only does the color brighten the page, but it can give immediate information about the source and its reliability which forms that tie of parent to offspring.

In Part I, Chapter V of the American Society of Genealogists' book "Genealogical Research: Methods and Sources", Volume I there will be found a chart entitled "General Rules for Judging the Reliability of Genealogical Evidence". It puts various sources of evidence into 10 classes or categories. By applying a color code to each of these categories and coloring the lines on the pedigree chart accordingly, it becomes immediately apparent what the source was which provided the parent to offspring connection.

As an example, suppose we learned from a published genealogy that our ancestor #12 was the son of #24 and #25. A published family genealogy is category seven and let us assume we assigned the color orange to that category. We can now draw an orange line parallel to the existing black line that connects ancestor #12 to #24 and #25. The situation can be much more complex at times. As another example, suppose we know that #12 was the son of #24 because of some church record (category four); that #24 and #25 were married because it was so stated in a published genealogy (category seven); and that family tradition handed down through the generations (category nine) had always identified #25 as the mother of #12. Now we would deal with three different colors; one from #12 to #24 to identify category four, one from #24 to #25 to identify category seven and one from #12 to #25 to identify category nine. Obviously a page could become almost cluttered with too much color. An alternative is to let one color represent categories one through three, another represent four through seven, etc. In this manner there would probably be no more than three colors on any one pedigree chart.

Compare Dates. Dates are usually found on every chart, page or form in the files of a genealogist. They are critically important and vital in the identification of each person in the record, but sometimes they may lose some of their overlooked bonus effect. Consider a comparative study of dates. You may find many interesting and revealing facts if, for instance, you determined how many of your ancestors, descendants and collateral relatives were born, married or died on the same day of the year.

To make this comparative study will take some time and the purchase

of a large size book of diary format -- one page for each of the 366 days of the year, remembering that some events will fall on the 29th of February date even though it only occurs every four years. The time involved will depend on the total number of persons you have in your records. The expense of the purchase should be nominal and the attention and interest the completed project will get at a family reunion will be rewarding. In my own experience I have found that the younger generation was more interested than the older. They were first attracted to it by seeing their names listed then were quick to notice who else in the expanded family also appeared on the same page (date). In at least two cases it was the stimulus for further genealogical research by the younger folks.

No particular format is required, but a recommended design with appropriate entires follows:

When she viewed the above page at a recent family reunion Susan B. Branden was quite surprised to see that she shared a birthday with her great garndfather, Johan C. Friberg; the brother of her great grandmother, Magnus P. Johansson and a third cousin, Grace E. Linn, who was 32 years her senior. Susan also never realized that a cousin, once removed, Arthur W. Petersen, had died on her birthday in 1976. Learning this, she immediately asked who the others on the page were and if they were relatives.

Jedediah Strong's sister married the great great grandson of John Chauncey. Obviously the two men were not blodd relatives and over 150 years separated their birth and death. In such cases as this the time and relationship is so remote it is not likely that much interest would be aroused. It could, however, be used as a contest subject. Viewers could be told that the men are distantly related then challenged to find the relationship by searching the pedigree charts and family group sheets.

Relate To History. The dates of birth, marriage and death of our various ancestors take on a whole new meaning if they are tied to history. That a relative was born, married or died in the year of 1889 may be a fact, but it is a rather sterile fact. It becomes much more noteworthy and interesting if we knew that in that same year the air brake was invented, Jawaharlal Nehru was born, Jefferson Davis dies, Benjamin Harrison became President, in Pennsylvania there was a disastrous flood at Johnstown, the Eiffel Tower was opened in Paris, John L. Sullivan became heavyweight boxing champion, and Carlos I took the throne in Portugal. These additional facts may not be earthshaking, but at least they give us a feeling for a time in history and help us to relate our ancestor to that period of time. It adds a new dimension to genealogical information.

This tie to history becomes even more interesting and meaningful as we go back further in time than the example just given. I was surprised to realize that my earliest recorded Smith was a contemporary of George Washington. For some reason I had never placed them together in history and when it became apparent to me it seemed that our early American history was not so far in the past afterall. In short, I gained a new approciation of history and it felt like my ancestors were truly a part of it.

The tool or format to be used in visualizing these relationship to national and world history is a fairly simple one. Down the left hand edge of a large sheet of paper or series of pages from a columnar pad, the years are listed approximately one inch apart to allow for multiple line entries in the various columns to the right. The actual years listed depend on the span of time in which the individual compiler is interested. The first and earliest year listed may be 1776, our independence; 1620, the Mayflower landing; 11,92, the New World discovery; or any other year of significance in history or the compiler's genealogy. The last and most recent year listed would normally be the present year.

The rest of the chart is a series of column in which various events are recorded on the line of the appropriate year. The first column should be the name of the ancestor/ancestors who were born or died on any particular year. The other columns would be labeled Discoveries, Inventions, Royal Reigns, Presidential Administrations, Births & Deaths of Famous People, Wars, Disasters, Great Records & Achievements, Statehoods, National & World Population Counts, and other categories the compiler may consider important.

When completed a portion of the chart may look like this:

After recording the various events and names on the line of the appropriate year it is merely a matter of moving from left to right on the chart and watch history unfold. Our ancestors may not have played a key role in history, but they were there when it happened and that fact tends to make both history and genealogy a little more alive and interesting for us all.
