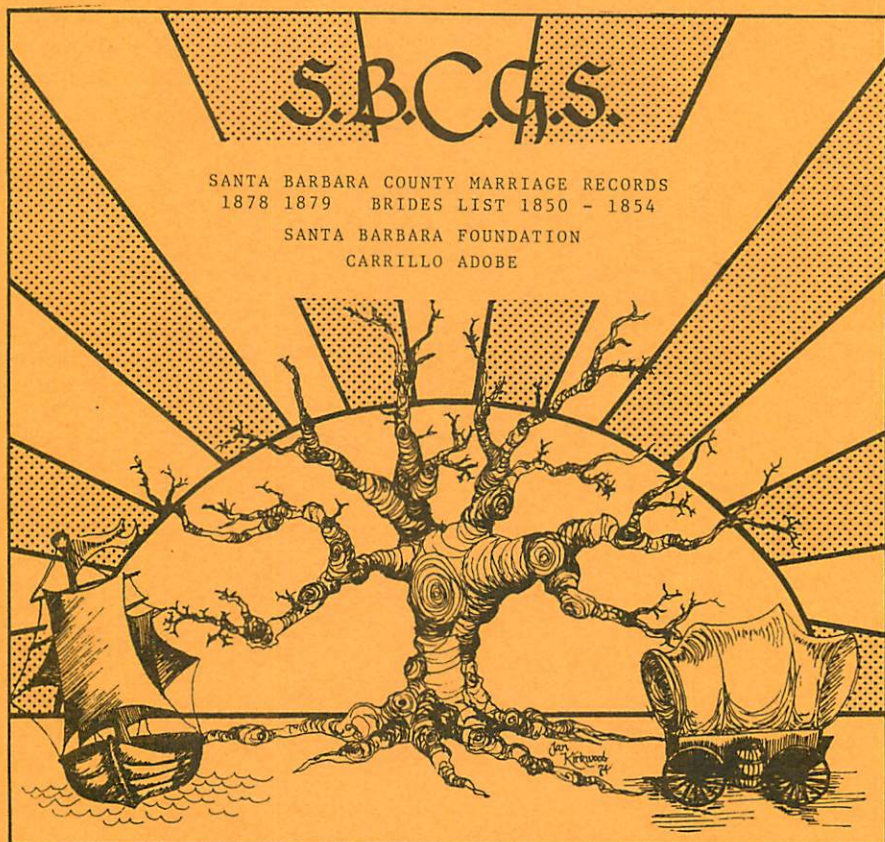

THE DOTY ANCESTRY
CROSS-COUNTRY JOURNEYS

As related by Mrs. Martin Doty to her daughter, Mary M. Moore.

Your ancestors were English, Irish and French. On your father's side, your great grandfather's name was Amasaiah Doty, a descendant of Edward Doty, that came to America in the year 1620 in the ship, the Mayflower.

Your grandfather's name was Ebenezer Doty. He was born in the town of Bennington, State of Vermont. Served in the War of 1812 at Sackets Harbor.

Your father, Martin Doty, a son of Ebenezer Doty was born in Madison County, State of New York in the year 1818. Your grandmother, the wife of Ebenezer Doty was born in Hartford County, Connecticut. Her name was Phoebe Goodel, the oldest daughter of Warner Goodel, a Baptist minister. Her mother's maiden name was Phillips.

On your mother's side your great grandfather's name was Josiah Evans, who came to America from England before the Revolutionary War. When the war commenced he joined Washington's command and served with him until the close of the war and was in no other part of the army. His wife your great grandmother's maiden name was Betsy Fitch. Her mother's name was Betsy White. Your grandfather's name was Josiah Evans. He was born in Hartford County, Conn.

Your grandmother, Mary Sweetland, was the oldest daughter of Daniel and Louvisea Sweetland who lived in the town of Manchester, State of Conn. Your grandmother was born there, and married there to Josiah Evans.

Your mother, Aurilla Evans, their youngest daughter was born in Manchester, Hartford County, State of Conn. in the year 1822. The family moved in 1823 to Madison County, State of New York to a village called Knoxville, and lived there till 1836, then moved to Knoxville, Knox County, Illinois. Your father Martin Doty and your mother, Aurilla Evans, were married in Knoxville, Knox County, Ill. November 17, 1845. You, our oldest, Mary M. Doty, was born in Knoxville, Illinois, Sept. 8, 1846. Your brother, Julius Goodel Doty, was born in Orange Township, Knox County, Ill. April 5, 1850.

We moved to California in 1852.

Mary M. Doty lived in Knoxville from 1846 to 1850, her father working at the cooper trade, making barrels. Then moved on a farm near Knoxville, her father farming and distilling peppermint until about the year 1852 in April we started for California.

The party consisting of the following people. Mr. and Mrs. Martin Doty, two children, his father and mother, Ebenezer and Phoebe Doty. Fitch Evans and wife, wife a daughter of Ebenezer and Phoebe Doty, and Fitch Evans, brother of Mrs. Martin Doty. Dudley Evans, brother of Fitch Evans. Milo Jones, brother-in-law of Mrs. Martin Doty through marriage of sister. Charley Clark and wife, two children. His wife a sister of Martin Doty. A large number consisting of the train but no other relatives.

The journey consumed about five months going by way of Council Bluffs, Iowa, traveling on the North side of the Platte River, and going north of Salt Lake, coming through the South Pass of the Rockies and came in the Northern part of California in the mines, then came straight through to about five miles north of San Jose to Edward Doty's, a brother of Martin Doty, who came to California in 1849.

Martin Doty went to farming and later run a threshing machine near

San Jose till November 1858, when with his wife and two children they started for the East by way of Panama going by boat to New York, thence to Paineville, Ohio, visiting his relatives. After two or three weeks they went to Keewanee, Illinois, visiting Milo Jones and family for some time, then to Knoxville, Ill. where they lived till April 17, 1860, when they again started for California.

Going by way of Council Bluffs, on the north side of the Platte river, and by way of Salt Lake and Carson City, Nevada and was the first train to reach Carson City that year going to California and a message was telegraphed to San Francisco announcing their arrival.

Journey consuming just three months from the Missouri river to San Jose. As far as Salt Lake there were only six wagons, three belonging to Martin Doty, who was Captain of the party.

Upon arriving at Salt Lake they were advised to travel in larger companies, so waiting in Salt Lake till more came they then had a company of thirty or forty wagons with Martin Doty as Captain.

Some incidents of the journeys across. The first time across in 1852, were stopped by Indians, who wanted a cow, but fortunately a large train were following close behind and getting word to them. They soon came up armed and the Indians hid in the grass and all passed on but for safety about three hundred wagons camped together but were not attacked. The Pony Express and stage coach were frequently met. The first time across Martin Doty had part horses and part oxen but the last time all were oxen.

They arrived at San Jose August 8, 1860, and stopped the same place as before. Farmed and threshed same as before but used steam engine to thresh instead of horse power and lived there till the Fall of 1862, when they moved to Calaveras Valley, lived there till the Fall of 1867, then went back to the old place where lived in 1860. On November 7th, 1866 his daughter married Harvey Moore, and they all farmed together and lived together till the Fall of 1869, when all moved to Hollister, Mr. and Mrs. Martin Doty living there and farming till 1879 when they moved about nine miles of San Jose, farmed there till 1883, then moved to Santa Barbara, and living there till his death in 1895.

Mr. Martin Doty was brother of Edward Doty heretofore mentioned who came across in 1849 endured great hardships and one time were so nearly choked that their tongues were swollen out of their mouths, and during that time they saw great pieces of gold lying on the ground, which was probably Death Valley. There has always been an Edward Doty in the family.

Harvey Moore and wife lived in Hollister from 1869 to 1881 when they moved to Santa Anna valley, Harvey Moore went East in 1876 to Canada and to the Centennial Exhibition.

They moved to Salinas on November 1st 1887 where he died November 29, 1887, leaving a widow and nine children respectively,

SANTA BARBARA FOUNDATION

For more than fifty years, the Santa Barbara Foundation has served the community.

The twenty-five men who met on September 19, 1928, to draw up articles of incorporation were Edward W. Alexander, Elmer J. Bissell, Rexwald Brown, Harold S. Chase, George W. Clyde, William R. Dickinson, T. Wilson Dibblee, Robert E. Easton, Charles A. Edwards, George S. Edwards, Reginald G. Fernald, Max C. Fleischmann, E. Palmer Gavit, Bernhard Hoffmann, Charles H. Jackson, Jr., Kirk B. Johnson, Seth A. Keeney, James P. Kennedy, Dwight Murphy, Francis Price, Charles B. Raymond, Thomas M. Storke and George W. Wilson.

A gift of stock was made by Major Fleischmann and, in accordance with his wishes, the Foundation's first grant went to establish a summer concert band, to be organized and managed by the Music Branch of the Community Arts Assn.

In December, 1929, Mrs. Frederic Gould deeded her home on San Leandro Lane to the Foundation, retaining a life estate.

In 1930 Major Fleischmann donated its present home, the Carrillo Adobe. With income from these sources and an additional stock gift from Major Fleischmann, the Foundation expanded its activities. A trust from the Anna Edwards estate provided additional funds to be used for activities of the Associated Charities of Santa Barbara and the Visiting Nurse Association. In 1932 band concert funds were diverted to aid the unemployed. Wholesale purchase of provisions furnished assistance to some 400 families. A contribution to the Salvation Army helped transients. A gift to the Community Chest supported a women's work room. Funds given to the Red Cross were used to make clothing from 40,000 yards of cotton fabric donated by the Federal Government. Support of the band concerts was resumed and while helping the 25 local band members also boosted community morale. In that year two student scholarship loans were made, initiating a continuing and greatly expanded program.

In 1934 the first grant was made to the Museum of Natural History, establishing a 40-year period of cooperation.

For a decade commencing in March, 1935, one of the great and consuming interests of the Foundation was the Santa Barbara Harbor, with its problems of beach erosion and sand filling the harbor, appropriating large sums for engineering advice and formulation of a plan to combat erosion.

In 1939 the Foundation established another precedent by awarding a "nonrecurring grant" to the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden, one of the community institutions the Foundation has actively supported for forty years. A grant was made to the McKinley Boys' Club for buying a building from the old Montecito Country Club and moving it to the Boys' Club property, with additional funds for operating expenses.

Mills College, Stanford and the California Institute of Technology were added to the list of academic institutions at which Foundation-sponsored men and women pursued their educations.

Santa Barbara Foundation

A new slate of officers was elected in 1940 and the new chairman urged Board members to survy the "history, status, and potentialities of the Foundation," and to give special consideration to the election of women Trustees. Plans for a dredging plant at the Harbor were implemented by Fleischmann gifts. Scholarship loans and other community projects received attention, including a "nonrecurring grant" for landscaping of the new Art Museum (the former Post Office building).

During the war years the Harbor program was at a standstill. The Harbor was under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Navy. Major Fleischmann agreed to a plan whereby the Dredging Fund would revert to general funds if it could not be used for its intended purpose within five years and urged that the Foundation direct its activities toward helping young people and encouraging civic development.

In 1945 Sterling Morton deeded his Montecito estate to the Foundation, with the reservation to his wife of a life estate.

This detailing of earlier activities is taken largely from Los Adobes, the Santa Barbara Foundation publication, Vol. 1, Nos. 1 and 2, a report to be continued in a forthcoming No. 3.

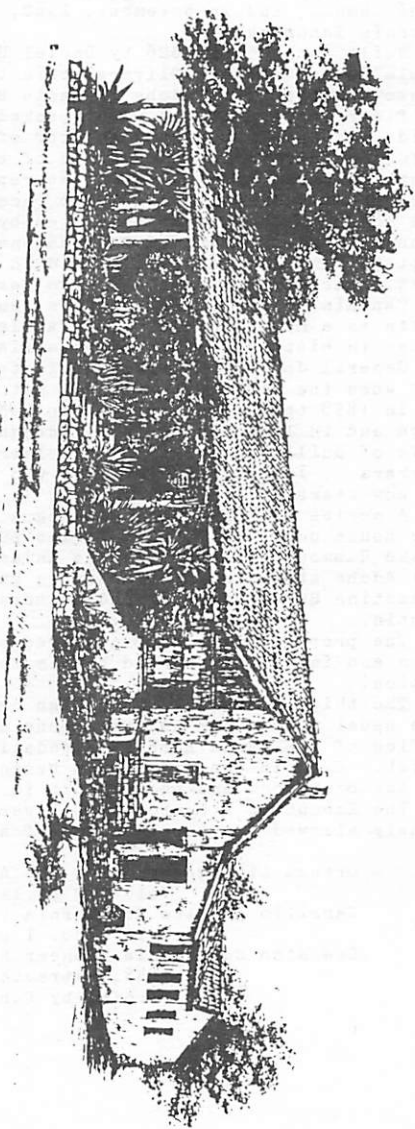
A resume of the 1978 report shows that in that year from the General Fund a total of \$536,959 was distributed: Health Care 23.1% \$123,162; Social Services 23.8% \$127,780; Education/Culture 26.3% \$141,470; Youth Activities 26.9% \$144,547 and from the Scholarship Fund \$218,085 for a Grand Total of \$755,044. Also given is a list of organizations which during the last fifty years have each received more than \$100,000 from the Santa Barbara Foundation:

General Fund

Health Care \$1,200,288 to Memorial Cancer Foundation, Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital and St. Francis Hospital. Youth Activities \$1,026,059 to Girls' Club of Santa Barbara, Goleta Boys' Club, Mission Council Boy Scouts, Santa Barbara Boys' Club, Santa Barbara YMCA, United Boys' Clubs of Santa Barbara. Education/Culture \$542,026 to Music Academy of the West, Santa Barbara Botanic Garden, Santa Barbara Museum of Art, Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History. Social Services \$216,039 to Alexander House and United Way.

In 1979 there was appropriated from the Scholarship Fund \$202,380, with an average appropriation of \$1,714. and from the General Fund \$313,245 of which \$50,000 was for camperships for youth groups.

Generally, charitable organizations with IRS letters of tax exemption that operate in and for the benefit of citizens of Santa Barbara County are eligible for consideration as applicants for assistance. Guidelines are available in the Foundation office. A telephone call for an appointment is recommended to prospective applicants. The Santa Barbara Foundation traditionally has been responsive to the current needs and interests of the community.

THE CARRILLO ADOBE

CARRILLO ADOBE

One of the stops made by visitors following Santa Barbara's Red Tile Tour is the Carrillo Adobe, presented to the Santa Barbara Foundation in 1930 by Major Max C. Fleischmann, and in November, 1960, registered as a California landmark.

Built in 1825 or 1826 by Daniel Hill for his bride, Raefaela Luisa Ortega y Olivera, this traditional California house was the first adobe in Santa Barbara to have a wooden floor instead of the usual packed clay or tile. This bride was the great-granddaughter of José Francisco Ortega, a founder and first commandante of the Royal Presidio of Santa Barbara, and was the first representative of a distinguished California family to occupy the dwelling. In the 1840s the house was purchased by a Scottish sea captain, John Wilson, who married Doña Ramona Carrillo, the widow of Captain Romualdo Pacheco, killed in the Battle of Cahuenga Pass. Richard Henry Dana in *Two Years Before the Mast*, tells of Captain Wilson's virtues as a seafaring man. His wife's gifts as a hostess were widely acclaimed. The role of the house in history was firmly established when it was chosen by General John C. Fremont as his temporary headquarters and when the first City Council met there in 1850.

In 1858 the Adobe was sold to Doña Magdalena Cota de Ortega and in 1862 passed to her daughter, Manuela Ortega, wife of Guillermo Carrillo, a celebrated mayor of Old Santa Barbara. It was this Carrillo who gave the house the name it now bears.

A series of tenants, including a Chinese laundry, occupied the house until 1917, when it was purchased by Mrs. Esther Fiske Hammond and remodeled as an art center. Once again the Adobe attracted distinguished guests, including Madame Ernestine Schumann-Heink and authors D. H. Lawrence and Mary Austin.

The property was later acquired by Major Max C. Fleischmann and in 1930 presented by him to the Santa Barbara Foundation.

The thick adobe walls and high ceilings seem to absorb the usual typewriter and telephone noises emanating from the office of the Santa Barbara Foundation. The atmosphere is quiet. Even in the midst of a business day one can step into the Boardroom and become lost in the past.

The Executive Director, Mr. Edward R. Spaulding, has graciously allowed the reproduction of a Carrillo adobe drawing.

In ANCESTORS WEST, Vol I, No. 1, p.14, appears this note:

"Hispanic surnames can be confusing to the uninitiated since they sometimes constituted both father's name and mother's maiden name. Only one instance was there any change, and that was the listing under POLI which is believed to be RODRIGUEZ DE POLI. All others are left as they appeared on record. Some of the abbreviations that were found in the records were D.(Don); D^a (Doña); MA (María Da.(Dos); or Ja. Jesús; Ygno., Ig^o, Ig^a (Ygnacio, Ignacio, Ignacia); Ant^o (Antonio); Ciudad^{no} or Cno (ciudadano or citizen); nat. de (natural de or native of). Written accents have been omitted & retained since it represents -ny instead of -n. Also found among the records is the word 'con' which links the names of the groom and bride. However, it is not translated 'to' since, in Spanish, married (to) is "casado con" or wedded, married with."

From the first issue of ANCESTORS WEST publication of a series of running indexes to records found in the Santa Barbara County Courthouse, Anapamu Street, was considered to be the core feature of the quarterly. During the early years entries commenced with the name of the groom. In order to make the listings more accessible, the editor has undertaken to provide a brides list. All marriages were at the Santa Barbara Mission unless otherwise indicated.
