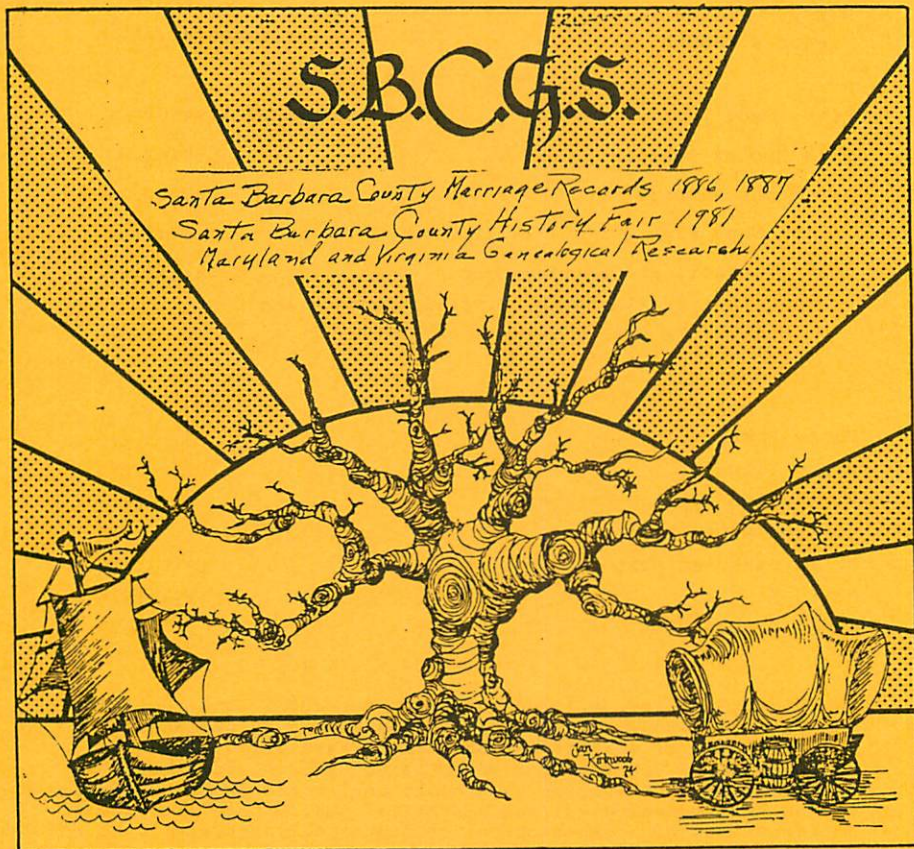

THE SANTA BARBARA COUNTY HISTORY FAIR

First Annual History Fair, UCSB, May 1-3, 1981.

The exhibition at University Center, UCSB, was a local and Community History project, supported by the California Council for the Humanities, co-sponsored by the Graduate Program in Public Historical Studies, UCSB, the Santa Barbara County Superintendent of Schools, the Santa Barbara Chamber of Commerce, with the cooperation of the various historical societies and school systems throughout Santa Barbara County, and the assistance of the Community and Organization Research Institute, UCSB. Dr. Thomas Fuller and Gayle Olson, co-directors; Michael Lappen and Michael Bransfield, Program co-ordinators.

Santa Barbara County is rich in cultural resources. There are many types of communities---agricultural, industrial, military research and development, tourist, urban. Its ethnic heritage is equally rich in diversity.

The History Fair, the first in the West, was initiated to encourage an awareness of this cultural and social complexity among students, educators and community members. High School students and educators were invited to prepare History Fair projects, Community citizens were asked to contribute their knowledge of local history and to assist students in their efforts.

The Exhibition 1981 booklet acknowledges Programmatic Support by 16 business foundations and community organizations, 21 contributors, 31 donations of special awards, assistance of 47 Friends and 44 special individual contributors. 31 educators in Santa Barbara County High Schools (public and private) participated and Students projects of over 300 students are listed.

SBCGS members Amy Marwede and Lillian Fish were among the many who visited the exhibition on Saturday afternoon and were much impressed with the overall coverage, variety, depth and diversity of the projects.

Better identification in some of the Titles is suggested, e.g. naming the family involved in Cynthia Brown's, The History and Genealogy of a Founding Santa Barbara family, and indicating whether Family History -- a title used by Manuel Garcia and Melinda Lusk--relates to a particular family or a generalized chart or other presentation of the subject. More exact titling would be desirable. Examples listed include Romero Family History, Julie Romero, Santa Barbara's Good Samaritans; The Sweetser Family, Cindy Jouett and MY Family: A Melting Pot, Jennifer Johnson. The latter was an eye-catching representation of the family of the Santa Maria student with a group photo of her parents and their 3 children (Jennifer and her brother and sister) flanked by copies of those of older generations above a huge black iron Stewpot with typed lineages on either side--Irish Kilpatrick (maternal) and German and other ethnic groups (paternal). The pot was decorated with jigsaw puzzle cut-outs of Germany, Ireland and bright colored VA, Alas, and identification of many Southern, Midwest and Western States.

CURRENT SBCGS ITEMS.

The proposed Commemorative Dinner has been postponed--negotiations for an early Fall date to be resumed after the opening of the Santa Barbara City College. Graduation festivities took precedence over the June 6th. commitment.

The Santa Barbara Bicentennial Year opened April 24 on the 199th. birthday. The Padres Quarters were rededicated--see Santa Barbara News Press photos in this issue. One of the original chapel bells graced the occasion. An ancient "mystery" cannon recently washed up on the Goleta Beach and being researched and relieved of incrustation at UCSB was on display.

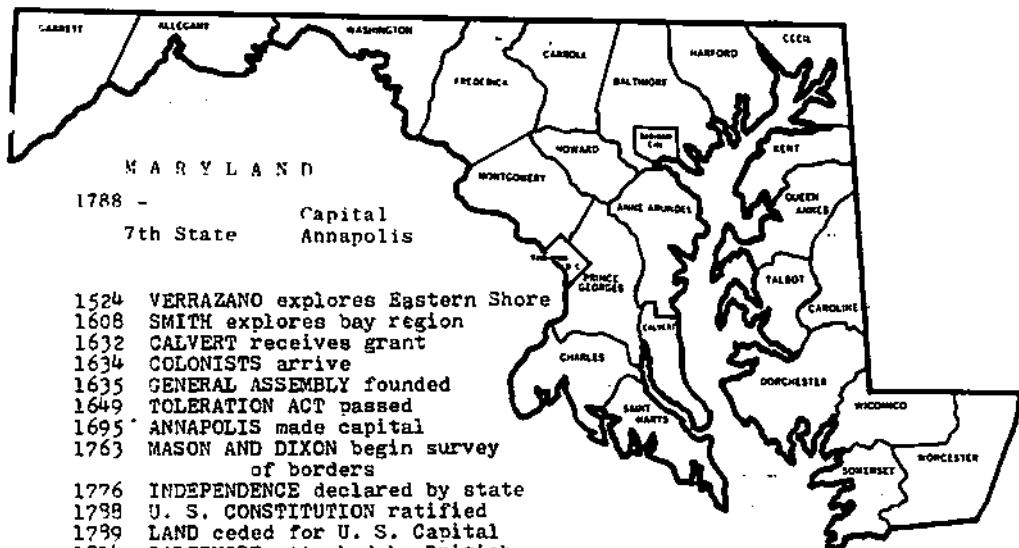

 Maryland March 25, 1634, bought an
 existing village from the Yaocomico
 Indians, naming its St. Mary's.
 The General Assembly, organized in
 1635, passed a religious toleration
 act in 1649. Completion of the Na-
 tional Pike to Ohio in 1818 and of
 the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal
 in 1829 marked a period of rapid
 growth. Many Marylanders served in
 the Confederate army during the Civil
 War, but the State remained loyal
 to the Union.

THIRD HAVEN MONTHLY MEETING

Easton, Maryland

In the year 1682, three acres of land were purchased from John Edmondson, and the erection of a house for worship was begun. Two years were consumed in its construction, as the timbers had to be hewn with a broad-axe and finished with such tools as were used in that day.

George Fox, the founder of the Religious Society of Friends, visited in this vicinity in 1673, and upon his return to England, sent a parcel of books to this Meeting. These books constituted a part of the old library, part of which is still here, and which is said to be first public library in Talbot County, and probably in this province, being established long before the Bishop of London, through Commissary Bray, introduced parochial libraries in this province.

William Penn preached here in 1700, to a large assemblage, among whom were "Lord and Lady Baltimore with their retinue". Wenlock Christison sought an asylum here from the New England persecution, and John Woolman, Lucretia Mott and other notables have visited this spot.

Continuous records of the business transactions of this Meeting have been kept since 1676 to the present time. They are of such value that they have been reconditioned by the State and are now preserved in the Hall of Archives at Annapolis. Micro films of these old minutes are in the possession of the meeting.

In 1797 the building was made wider by extending the rafters only on one side of the ridgepole. The gable or porch entrance is of later date.

The evidence indicates that nothing but whitewash has ever been used on the exterior. This building is in a good state of preservation.

When this building was erected, the author of Pilgrim's Progress was still preaching the Gospel in England. Dryden, the father of modern English prose, was in his glory, and the name of Alexander Pope had not been heard. Here the parents of George Washington could have worshipped in childhood, and Peter the Great could have heard with profit the teachings of Jesus.

"Hundred" remains from the provincial division of Maryland into Hundreds for administrative, elective and military purposes. In Anglo-Saxon times, the English Hundreds contained ten families, ten estates or 100 fighting men. 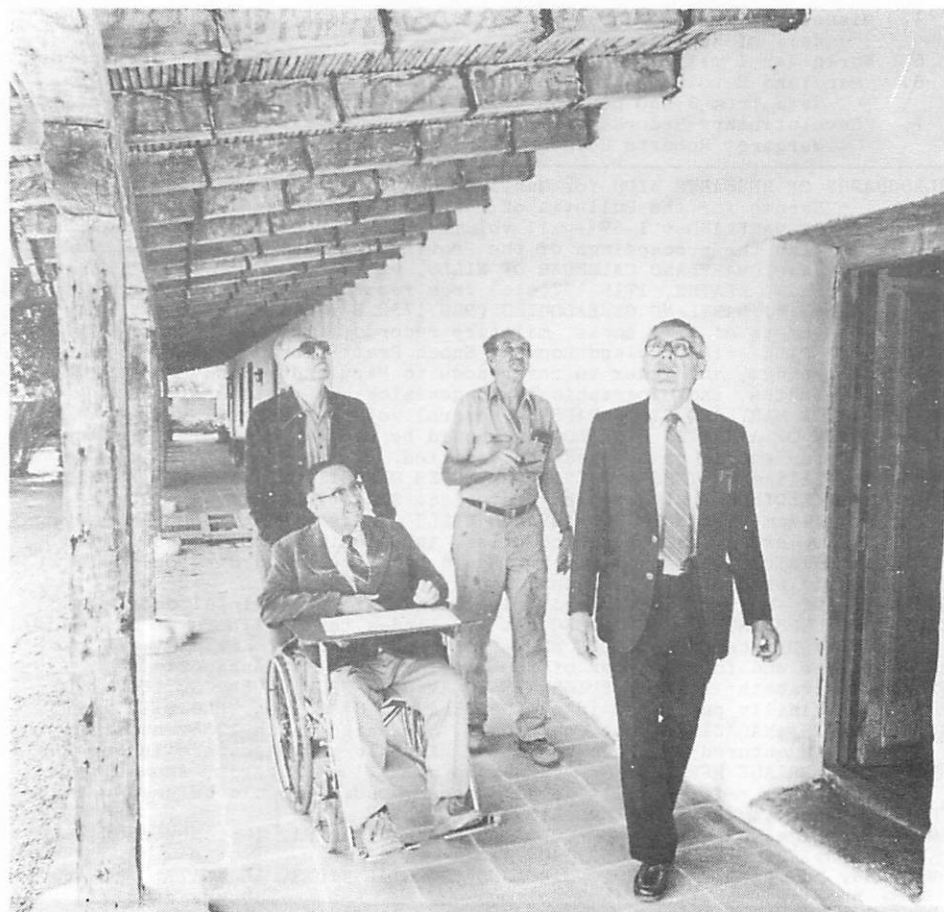

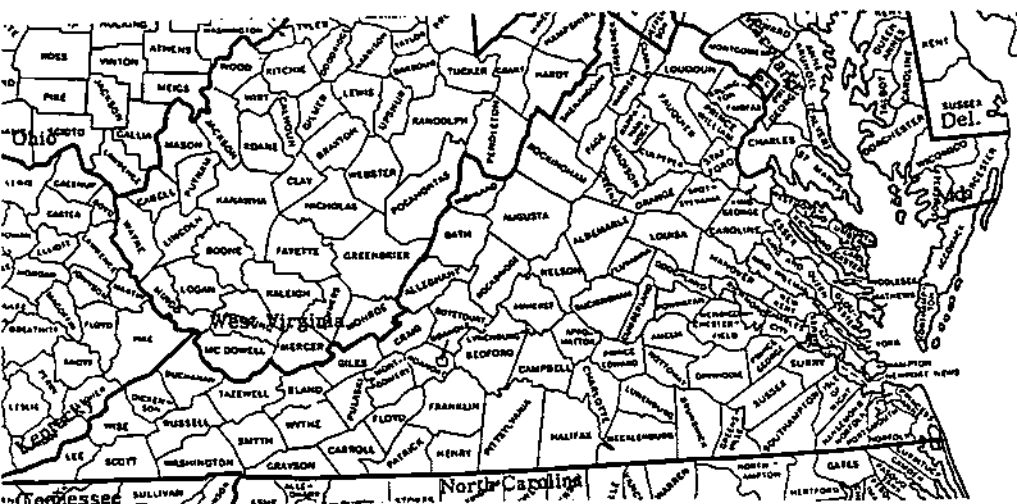

III. Vital, Church, and Cemetery Records

- A. Marriage records are the earliest available vital records and often date from the organization of the county.
 1. Originals remain in the respective counties or in the State Library and the GS has microfilmed the records to about 1860-80.
 2. Records for many counties are incomplete or are missing and abstracts for several counties have been compiled by Knorr, Fleet, Bell, et. al.
- B. Many counties have birth and death records dating between 1853-1896 but they are incomplete.
 1. Originals are at the State Library in Richmond, Virginia.
 2. Existing records have been filmed by the GS and are at SLC.
- C. State registration of vital statistics began 12 June 1912 and copies may be obtained from "Bureau of Vital Records, James Madison Building, P. O. Box 1000, Richmond, Virginia 23208 for \$2.00 each."
 1. Seven cities kept vital statistics prior to state registration: including Roanoke (1891), Norfolk (1892), Newport News (1896), Portsmouth (1900), Richmond (1900), Lynchburg (1901), and Petersburg (1910).
 2. Elizabeth City County kept its own records from 1900.

- D. Many church records relating to Virginia settlers have been preserved:
1. Church of England (Anglican--later Episcopal) records are the earliest and many have been published or microfilmed.
 2. Excellent collections of Quaker (Friends) records are also in print and on microfilm at SLC.
 3. Only a fair amount of Baptist, Methodist, Lutheran, Reformed, and other Christian denominations' records have been published or filmed.
- E. A good collection of Virginia cemetery records exists at SLC.
1. Several collections on a town and county basis have been published in DAR publications.
 2. The GS at SLC has many microfilmed copies on a town basis.
- F. The GS at SLC has an excellent collection of Virginia newspapers and published vital records abstracts taken from newspapers.
1. Typescripts of obituaries and marriages from the files of the "Religious Herald (Baptist)" and the "Southern Churchman (Episcopal)" exist.
 2. Entries from the "Richmond Inquirer" and the "Richmond Whig" exist.

IV. CENSUS-MORTALITY RECORDS

- A. The 1790 and 1800 Federal census enumerations are missing.
1. HEADS OF FAMILIES AT THE FIRST CENSUS, taken from state tax lists 1782-85, was published by the Census Bureau in 1908.
 2. VIRGINIA TAX PAYERS 1782-87, compiled by Fothergill and Nangle was published in 1940.
- B. The 1810 Federal census is incomplete with the following counties missing: Alexandria, Grayson, Greenbrier, Halifax, Hardy, Henry, James City, King William, Louis, Mecklenburg, Middlesex, Hansemond, Northampton, Orange, Patrick, Pittsylvania, Russell and Tazewell.
- C. Records 1820-1880 are public and on microfilm at SLC and the 1900 is public and available at the National Archives in Washington, D.C.
1. Mortality schedules taken with the 1850-1880 enumerations are on file at the State Library in Richmond.
 2. The GS at SLC does not presently have copies.

V. PROBATE-GUARDIANSHIP RECORDS

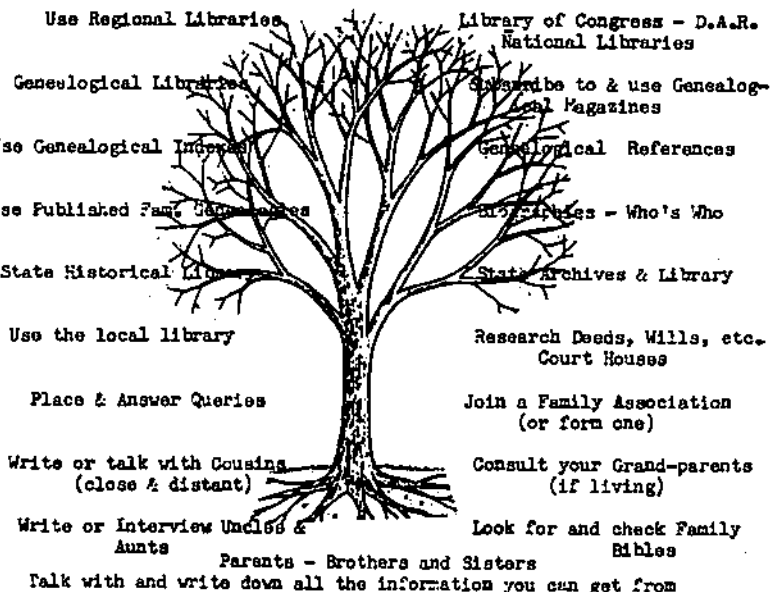

WHERE DO I START AND HOW DO I RESEARCH MY FAMILY TREE?

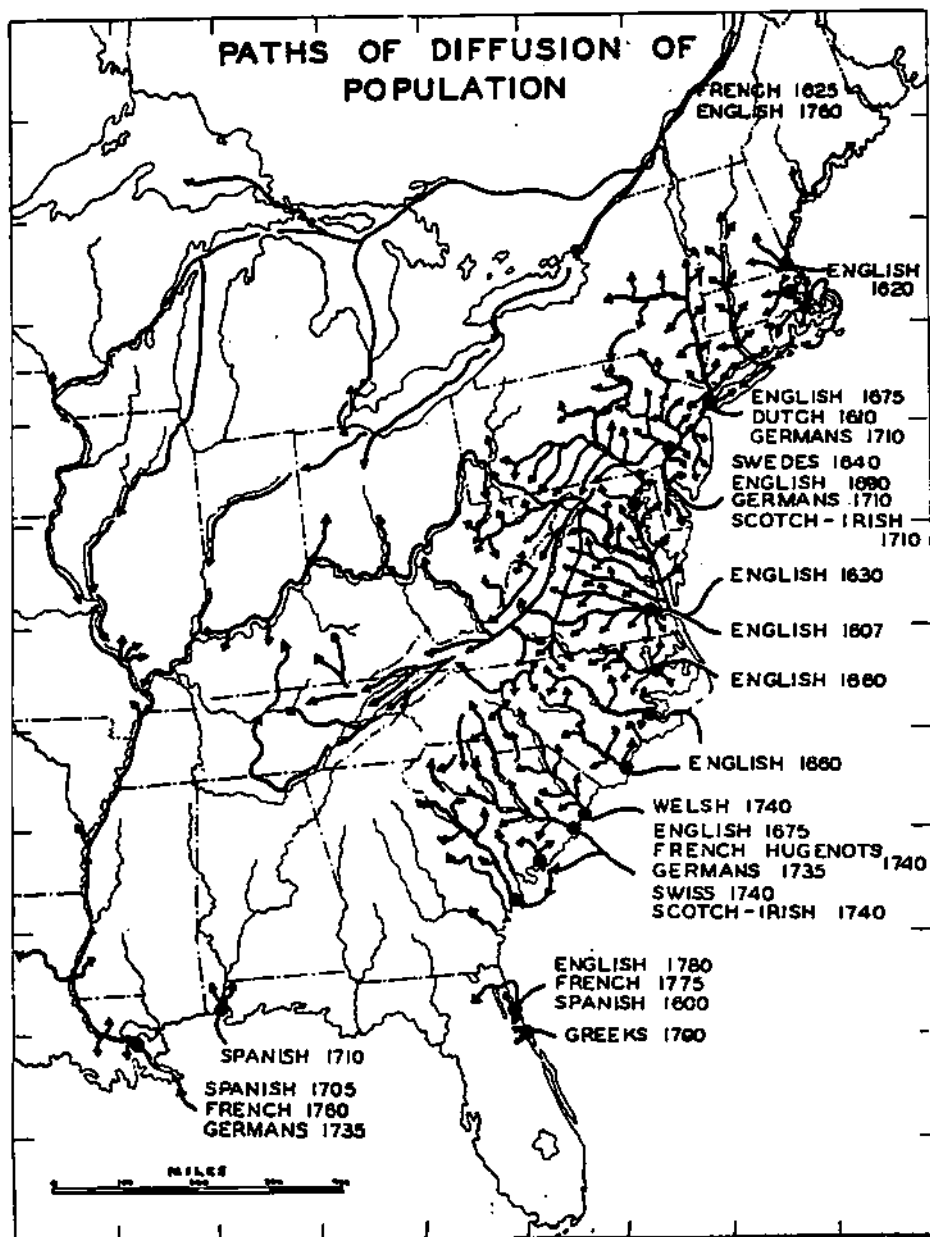

BOOK REVIEWS

THE EARLY SETTLERS OF NANTUCKET 1659-1850, comp. Lydia S. Hinchman, Charles E. Tuttle Company, Rutland, Vt. and Tokyo, Japan, Ptd. USA, 330 pp. Lib. Congress No. 80-54078 Intl Standard Book No. 0-8048-1354-X 1st pub. 1896; 1st Tuttle ed. 1980. Introduction to new (4th) edition by Edouard A. Stackpole refers to the preface to the second (1901) edition, in which Mrs. Hinchman states that she had no intention of treating the early history of Nantucket exhaustively or of compiling a complete genealogical record of the early families, but her intention was to "follow to some extent the wanderings and manner of life, not only of the early settlers . . . but of their descendants." The intermarriage of those early families brought a closer relationship to the community than in any other place in New England and the almost complete acceptance of the philosophy of the Society of Friends brought a distinct quality to Nantucket. The development of "deep-sea whaling" by these people and the life of the islanders has given our American maritime history a particularly valuable chapter. All these interests are reflected in the pages of this reprint, adequately footnoted.

Very few of the early settlers came directly from the old world to Nantucket. The opening chapter deals with early exploration and grants, including the patent to Thomas Mayhew from William, Earl of Sterling and Sir Fernando or Ferdinand Gorges, reference to which is found in the records of New York, to which Nantucket belonged until 1690. Among these is the deed, dated July 2, 1659, from Thomas Mayhew to the nine Purchasers: Tristram Coffin, Thomas Macy, Christopher Mussey, Richard Swayne, Thomas Bernard, Peter Coffin, Stephen Greenleaf, John Swayne and William Pike. Thomas Mayhew retained an interest and associates chosen were: Tristram Coffin, Jr., Robert Pike, Thomas Coleman, Nathaniel Starbuck, James Coffin, John Smith, Robert Barnard, Edward Starbuck, Thomas Look, and Thomas Mayhew, Jr.

A chapter is devoted to the families of many of these early settlers. Marginal notes with coded references supply vital statistics. A list of other Nantucket ancestors for each is also given. In the chapter on Christopher Russey there are several pages concerning the Rev. Stephen Bachelor, whose daughter Theodate Christopher married, and another daughter, Deborah, married John Wing. An inserted page corrects statements from Rev. Conway Phelps Wing's "John Wing, of Sandwich, and His Descendants", it being clearly established that he died before emigration of the family and that the widow, Deborah, came with four sons to America. Also that some question has arisen with regard to the lines of descent and that no conclusions could be published. In the chapter on John Greenleaf Whittier, a descendant of Stephen Greenleaf and Elizabeth Coffin, the wife of Stephen Greenleaf's father, Edmund, is given as Sarah Dole. Attention should be called to an article in the New England Hist. Gen. REGISTER, Vol. 122, Jan. 1968, pp. 28-36, identifying the first wife of Edmund Greenleaf as Sara Moore (More), sister of Samuel More, who mentions her in his will, and granddaughter of Nicholas and William Moore, of Maldon, co. Essex, England, whose wills are copied as are extracts from parish records.

Appendix I pp 245-306 contains genealogical listings arranged alphabetically from Adams to Wing. Appendix II Comment on break in Coffin records, a contested will of uncle John Coffin, to show that Tristram had more education than many of his contemporaries and a pedigree chart of three generations in England; also will of John Stevens, father of Robert, father of Dionis (Stevens) Coffin. Pages 317-330, lists by years from 1664 to 1847, Ministers of the Society of Friends and their Companions who visited Nantucket.
