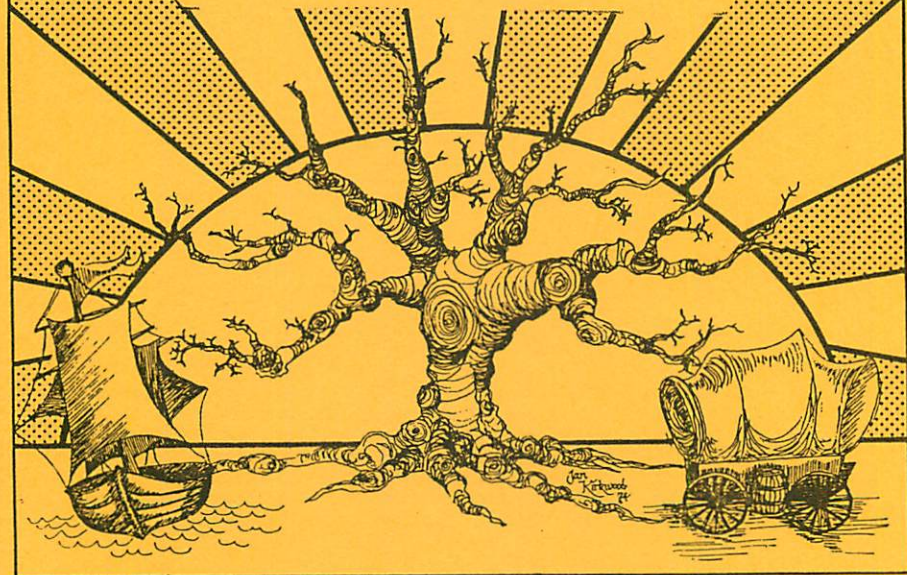

TRIBUTE TO A FOUNDER  
MRS. ELMER WESLEY KIRKWOOD  
(Jocelyn Lorraine Morgan)

On September 27, 1982, SBOGS and many other organizations lost a most dedicated member in the passing of Jocelyn Morgan Kirkwood, more familiarly known as Joyce, the wife of Elmer W. Kirkwood ("Kirk") of 3063 Foothill Road, Santa Barbara, 93105. She was one of the original members of SBOGS and served as Secretary for several years during the time that meetings were held at the Goleta Branch of the Santa Barbara Public Library. She also donated many reference books and copies of various periodicals, including the Vermont Branches and Twigs, to the Society Library. Joyce was born 15 November 1923 in Titusville, Crawford County, Pennsylvania, the site of the first oil well in 1841, and went to high school in nearby Oil City. "Kirk" and Joyce met in High School and sat side by side in Chemistry class - which he says "worked". He was born 6 June 1923 in Rouseville, Pennsylvania to Wesley Merritt Kirkwood and Josephine McSparren Kirkwood. They were married 16 March 1942 in Orchard Park, New York. Their children are Carol Anne, born 25 December 1944, married Michael Logan; David Edward, born 28 November 1946, married (1) Jan Manning (who designed the ANCESTORS WEST cover), (2) Gloria Palden; Susan Diana, born 13 January 1948, married Alan Burke; Kathleen Joan, born 21 November, 1947, married David Anderson; and Sandra Lynne, born 17 August 1964, married Joseph Bohnett. Joyce came to Santa Barbara in 1944 and for many years was employed as a secretary and bookkeeper. He was manager of the Santa Barbara office of the Carpenters' Union until his retirement. Presently he is taking a real estate pre-licensing course. For years we have all admired Joyce for her courage and determination in the face of surgery, radiology and chemotherapy, loss of mobility and finally dependence upon leg braces and a wheel chair. Her chief interests were her family, patriotic and genealogical organizations. Her four daughters are junior members of Mission Canyon Chapter, NSDAR, as is her sister Barbara Morgan Harvey of Oil City; her grandchildren have been enrolled in GAR; and her husband is a member of the SAR. July 4, 1978 she was awarded a statuette as Patriot of the Year for her support of the July Fourth Parade and other activities. She served two terms (1974-1979) as Regent of Mission Canyon Chapter; served on the Board of the Patriotic Council, a group composed of representatives of patriotic organizations sponsoring and arranging parades on Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Veterans' Day and memorial services; in the early 1970's was President of the Carpenters' Auxiliary 308; in DAC (Daughters of the American Colonists of the 17th Century) worked on public relations; served as treasurer of the DUJ (Daughters of Union Veterans); during the organizational period of the Rereditary Society of Santa Barbara spent many hours manning its library and making research facilities available in its quarters in the Canada Adobe at the Presidio site.

One of Joyce's outstanding attributes was her ability to work with people who had experienced conflicts in larger groups and then proceeded to form new organizations with somewhat similar objectives. Also she did not over-extend herself. When serving as the chief officer or worker of one group, she refrained from committing herself to a similar position in another organizations. One person said that while she was serving as DAR regent she was approached by the nominating committee of the DAC to serve as its chief officer, but declined. This is a most commendable attribute in a person so well qualified to assume leadership.

She was a member of the First Presbyterian Church. Other service and patriotic memberships included Hadas Madrinas, Marguerite Chapter 78 of the Order of the Eastern Star, National Society of the Dames of the Court of Honor (descendants of commissioned officers from Colonial days through the Civil War), New England Historic and Genealogical Society, and Dames of the Guild of St. Margaret of Scotland to name a few. She is deeply missed and will be long remembered by her many friends and colleagues.

Even our own 'clan' in California seem to avoid the issue so perhaps an historically minded member of your society can come up with the answer.

To be brief, what were the Plumas Rangers?

I read that when David Hambly brought his family overland in 1852, he arrived at Henpeck Flat. His son William became a member of the Plumas Rangers operating against thieves, outlaws and Indians.

Were they similar to the Texas Rangers, and I cannot place Henpeck Flat on my map so suppose it had long since become a ghost town? Who was 'Plumas' and were they full time paid law agents?

Any help would be more than welcome.

The above inquiry has been referred to the editor (at her own request). Several hours of research at the Gledhill Library, Santa Barbara Historical Society, at the Santa Barbara Public Library assisted by its Reference Department, and scanning of "A Self-Governing Dominion, California, 1849-1860," by William Henry Ellison, U of Cal. Press, Berkeley and Los Angeles, California, and Cambridge U Press, London, England, 1950 (the recurrent theme of this book is the principle of self-government. The early American immigrants to California considered themselves a people apart, independent and beyond legal authority. Throughout the decade dealt with in this volume they repeatedly stated or implied that they owned the lands of the area, that the Indians had no rights, and that the federal government should aid California lavishly but leave the people of California to themselves.) Dr. Ellison, a native of Falls Church, Va., for some forty years taught and researched California history. For many years he was head of the History Department at Santa Barbara State College and UCSB into which it developed. The Ellison Building at UCSB honors his name. His daughter Margaret (Mrs. Roy C. Beckman) majored in Journalism and met her husband, now deceased, while both were employed by Arizona Highways and she later served in Washington, D. C. as a section under Edwin Murrow in Voice of America days. In retirement she lives in Easton, Maryland, and has received honors as a member of the Coast Guard patrol unit, and service of the "Margroy". In the foreword credit for critical reading of the manuscript is given her, long-time friend of the editor. Plumas is the Spanish name for the Feather River. The annual index of volumes through 1977 of the California Historical Society Quarterly, following the comprehensive Vols. 1-40, was examined. A possible solution to the problem may be found in "The Feather River in '49 and the Fifties," a 50-page booklet by George C. Mansfield, Oroville, Calif.; published by the author (Press of the Oroville Register), 1924, with many illustrations, quarto, distributed by the San Francisco News Company and the Van Nuys Company, and reviewed in 3 Calif. Hist. Soc. Quarterly pp 262-263. Perhaps a reader will examine that book and report to ANCESTORS WEST the results of the search. The book is not in the collections of the Santa Barbara Public Library. Also where was Henpeck Flat? Several Feather River maps and references are being mailed to Douglas Hamley. Also a request for identification of his "clan" members.

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SANTA BARBARA COUNTY VITAL RECORDS

Lillian M. Fish

With the completion of the 1897 marriage record listings, as Editor of ANCESTORS WEST, a decision must be made as to continuing with transcriptions of marriage records only or whether an attempt should be made to carry birth and death record lists beyond the 1897 date reached by the previous editor.

For all recorded vital records between the late 1800's and 1963, there is in the County Recorder's office at Santa Barbara a Soundex System, and for records after 1963 all are on screen. In order to use these name must be furnished. A description of the system is set out separately.

Two hours were spent at the Recorder's office, examining 1896 records. On the first visit a record book containing pasted-on record slips for births was produced, with a number of loose sheets. These were mostly of children not named at the time of registration. However, two were found to have been reported by males designating themselves as "fathers", but in the space for name of mother appeared the word "unknown." Having failed to note the date of one birth, on the next visit to inspect 1896 death records, it was found that two index volumes for 1896 had not been produced on the previous visit. One of those had no alphabetical tabs and would be very difficult to use; the other had a number of notations of corrections, with date (but not content) of correction. Presumably those supplied some of the names of those unnamed at the time of the original registration. Inquiry by name and use of the Soundex System Index should be employed.

Reporting of the death listings has not been entirely consistent. Readings used by member Victor M. South for 1894 were as follows: Name, Age, Place born, Residence, Cause of Death, Date. Those for 1895, 1896 and 1897 give Name, Age, Birthplace, Date. None give the place of death. The cause of death is important and is receiving more and more attention.

Much can be learned from the Mortality Schedules attached to the Federal census, copies of which are in the Gledhill Library at the Santa Barbara Historical Society. 34 names are included in the 1860 schedule. Those 16 or over were:

There may be a story behind the "Hung" as cause of death of Francisco and Jose Bardillo. The name "Jack Powers" in connection with Jose Ramon Malo is of interest. The August-September 1982 *Santa Barbara Magazine*, carries an article on the *Decade of the Desperado*, by Santa Barbara historian and author, Walker A. Tompkins. One was Jack Powers, who at 19 in 1846 enlisted in the First Regiment of New York Volunteers, Col. J. D. Stevenson, for occupation of California. Powers had won his Sergeant's strips in Company F, the unit Col. Stevenson assigned to occupy the sleepy little seaside town of Santa Barbara. Young *caballeros* challenged the *yanquis* to a horse race on East Beach. Don Jose de la Guerra, the town's wealthiest citizen, loaned fine horses from his abundant supply. Handsome, black-bearded Jack Powers won race after race and de la Guerra offered him a job training horses and managing his stables as soon as the regiment was mustered out of service. On deactivation of the regiment in 1848, most of the soldiers hurried off to the Sierra Nevada gold mining camps, including Jack Powers. He found it easier to use dice and play poker to separate successful miners from their gold dust and nuggets. Heading for San Francisco on a river boat, Powers amassed

more than \$175,000 in poker and roulette winnings, which he planned to take back to New York to finance a business venture. But his luck changed and before the boat reached the embarcadero his fortune had dwindled, ending his dream of becoming a New York entrepreneur. He then turned to highway robbery, aligning himself with the "Hounds", in San Francisco. Escaping a vigilante roundup he retreated to Santa Barbara and accepted the de la Guerra family's offer of honest employment as groom and trainer of their horses. Thus he had a perfect cover of respectability and an excuse for being away from town without arousing suspicion.- also an unlimited number of fast horses for getaways following robberies. He gathered a band of outlaws around him. Their exploits are detailed in the Tompkins article.

The 1870 Mortality Schedule for Township No. 2 (Santa Barbara) listed only 23 deaths, of which 5 were those of adult persons. In addition to the items shown in the 1880 schedule, this gives the number of the family as given in the census. They were

At the time of the 1870 census Township No. 1 in Santa Barbara County was Ventura. Ventura County was set off from Santa Barbara County in 1873.

In checking the marriage records copied for this issue, curiosity was aroused by the listing of two dates for the T. W. Halley, Belle Wilson marriage - 2 Mar. Santa Barbara and 11 Nov. Summerland 1896. Although the March 2 listing appears in the index, the only record is that for the marriage in Summerland Nov. 11, 1896. A copy is reproduced as it does indicate the extent of information sometimes disclosed in the record.

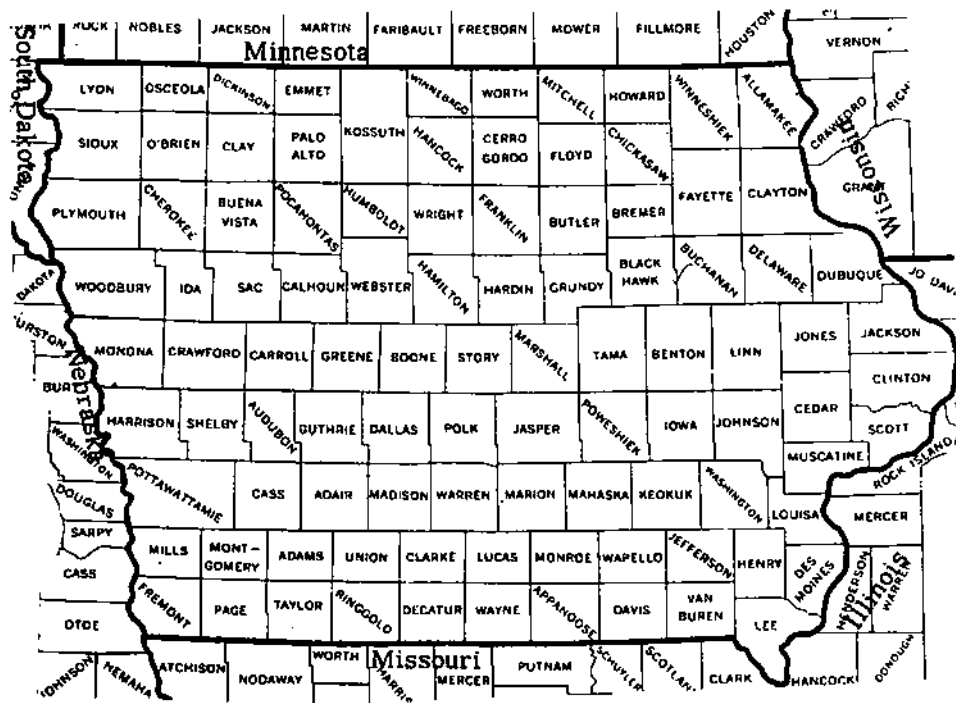




## IOWA

29th State - 1846 Terr. 1838

Capital - Des Moines



The first permanent settlement was at Dubuque, 1788. Before Iowa became a territory in its own right in 1838, it had been part of the Missouri Territory, 1812-1821; unorganized territory, 1824-1834; Michigan Territory 1834-1836, and Wisconsin Territory, 1836-1838. An Indian treaty about 1833 made white settlements possible. An influx of settlers from Eastern and Southern states, most of them originally from the British Isles, resulted. Immediately prior to and after gaining statehood in 1846, thousands of immigrants arrived in Iowa; Scandinavians located in the central and western portions of the state, Hollanders in the south-central section, Germans along the Mississippi, Scotch and Welch in the mining towns of the southern counties, and many Czechs in the east-central region. Until 1857 Iowa City, Johnson County, was the capital. In 1857 the capital was moved to Des Moines, Polk County, in the south-central part of the state.

The Division of Vital Statistics, State department of Health, State Office Building, Des Moines, Iowa 50319, has birth, marriage and death records. Early birth records are incomplete. Marriage records since 1880 are available. Death records, incomplete, from 1880 and complete from 1905. The office of the Clerk of the District Court in each county has similar records of birth, marriages and deaths - some marriages as early as 1832. Also records of all probate matters, wills and divorce proceedings in the particular county. Real estate records are in the offices of the county recorders. The Adjutant General, State House, Des Moines, Iowa 50319, has war service records.

A flyer received by SBOGS member Shirley Cobb describes in detail the purposes and holdings of the Society, its quarterly HAWKEYE HERITAGE, and mailed to members in the last weeks of January, April, July and October. Each issue has approximately 50 pages of genealogical and related information most of which pertains to Iowa. A Topical Index for Volumes I through last year may be obtained for \$1.00 and a large (No. 10) envelope, stamped and self-addressed. Copies of back issues from 1966 to the present time may be purchased by members at \$2.00 per copy of \$8.00 per volume (of 4 issues published in 1 year) or by non-members for \$2.50 per copy of \$10.00 per volume. GENEALOGICAL QUERIES are published in HAWKEYE HERITAGE free of charge to members and \$1.50 per query to non-members. Rules for queries are stated in the flyer. Dues are \$7.50 per person annually, payable on or before December 1 and delinquent Jan. 31 - 4 issues of HAWKEYE HERITAGE included.

SURNAME FILE AND INDEX. The Society maintains a file of family surnames and data submitted by members. From these records, the Society periodically publishes THE SURNAME INDEX. Surname Index Vol. I lists about 21,000 names, Vol. II lists more than 25,000 names, and Vol. III lists 50,000 names, all three companion volumes are different names with the exception of additions and correction of information from previous volumes. These names are not necessarily Iowa connected but are from everywhere in the U. S. and Europe as early as the 1500's and late as 1977. All names are cross-indexed and coded to their contributor's name and address, listed in the back of the books. Vol. I, 1973 \$7.50; Vol. II 1975 \$8.50; Vol. III 1977 \$10.00 (sales tax to be added by Iowans) IOWA PIONEER CERTIFICATE. The Society will issue an Iowa Pioneer Certificate to any person who can prove direct descent from any person who lived in Iowa in 1856 or earlier. To obtain an Iowa Pioneer Certificate an applicant must present acceptable proof of descent from his/her pioneer ancestor. The applicant need not have lived in Iowa. Application forms are available from the Society upon request accompanied by a self-addressed stamped envelope. Chapters of the Society are located in more than fifty counties in Iowa.

The November 1982 DAR Magazine contains about 16 1/2 pages, with a number of illustrations of historical personages and sites, including several relating to "Mark Twain" (Samuel Clemens), his older brother Orion Clemens who came to Muscatine as co-owner, co-editor of the *Muscatine Journal*, and his mother, Jane Lamp-ton Clemens. Also the birthplace of the bandleader, Glenn Miller, Clarinda, Iowa.

The National Law Journal, November 15, 1982, carries an article on litigation involving a March 1982 amendment by the state General Assembly of the state rules of criminal procedure to give judges the option of importing jurors from another county rather than moving the trial itself. Iowa apparently is only the second state to pass such a law. Pennsylvania has a "change of venire" law since 1980. The intent is to reduce trial costs while permitting defendants in publicized cases to be judged by jurors who have not been exposed to pretrial publicity.



## IOWA

Iowa, "The Beautiful Land", signifies a magnificent and fruitful region west of the "Father of Waters". Eastern and western boundaries are determined by southerly flowing rivers, the Mississippi on the east and the Missouri on the west. The present boundaries and Constitution were approved by Congress on December 28, 1846 when Iowa was admitted as the 29th sovereign state in the American Union. James K. Polk was President.

Iowa City was the territorial capital when the year 1856 marked a new era in the history of Iowa. The Chicago & Rock Island Railroad had been completed to the east bank of the Mississippi River, opposite Davenport in 1854 and on the 1st day of January, 1856, this railroad was completed to Iowa City. On May 15, 1856, Congress passed an act granting to the State certain sections, six miles on either side of proposed lines, to aid in the construction of railroads.

Frontier settlements were rapidly pushing west and there was a great deal of discussion to relocate the seat of government near the geographical center of the State. Moving to Fort Des Moines was barely defeated in 1853 but on January 15, 1855 a bill relocating the capital to Des Moines was successful. However, when in 1857 the removal of archives and offices commenced, there was not yet a mile of railroad to facilitate the work so the undertaking was of no small magnitude passing over hills and prairies, across rivers, through bottom lands and timber. The season was unusually disagreeable with rain and snow and it was not until December that the last of the effects - the safe of the State Treasurer - loaded on two large "bob-sleds" drawn by ten yoke of oxen was deposited in the new capital.

SUMMIT GROVE

In these pioneer days of the early 1850's when the settlers were arriving and bound for points further west, Guthrie County was formed on July 8, 1851.

One high point where the prairie and the timberlands met formed a natural landmark for the covered wagon emigrants. It was soon settled by Quakers from Indiana and Ohio as the tall timbers could be seen for miles in every direction. The community was known as Summit Grove and later all the little towns in the country around became known as Quaker Divide.

In 1856 these Quakers needed a meeting house. Five acres was donated by Cyrus and David Bowles and on one bright moonlight night, when the lumber was on the ground, the new structure was dedicated where the foundation had been laid out that afternoon. Eloquence was at fever heat, orators told of how and why, and with a flourish of trumpet and prayer, the meetinghouse was set apart for church services and school. It soon became the social center of the Summit Grove Settlement. Twice a week for over twenty years these faithful worshippers gathered there. No "clear ringing bell" to call worshippers together was needed for they all knew when meeting time came and turned out on time.

This beautiful spot amid the tall oaks, fringed about with wild forest growth, named Summit Grove, is now the present Stuart North Oak Grove Cemetery and today may be read on the headstones the names of those old Quaker pioneers who lived above the surrounding countryside on Quaker Ridge before the coming of the "Iron Horse" and the town of Stuart.

STUART CENTENNIAL

The town of Stuart, Iowa, celebrated its first hundred years on August 7-8, 1970 with a commitment to look back at the eventful history of Stuart on its 100th birthday. Since my maternal and paternal ancestors were pioneers of this area, I share some of the highlights and amusing sides of "where I grew up."

The town was named in honor of its founder, Captain Charles Stuart, who first came across the fertile acres in 1852 as the Illinois and Iowa agent of the Fairbanks Scale Company. In 1854 he made extensive investments in Iowa and with the extension of the Rock Island Railroad through Iowa in 1868 he bought additional land "near the site, at the juncture of Adair and Guthrie Counties: and on these various pieces of land, Mr. Stuart laid out the original town of Stuart in December 1868 and January 1869. His name appears on the deed of dedication filed in the Court House in Guthrie Center on August 5, 1870.

Stuart has the distinction of being in two counties. North of the railroad is Guthrie County and south of the railroad tracks is Adair County created by act of the legislature in 1851. The Mormon Trail passed through Adair County.

## IOWA

Prior to the coming of the Rock Island Railroad another "Train" crossed diagonally from Adair County on the south to Guthrie County, striking Summit Grove, where Stuart is now located. Slavery was recognized as a product of Missouri, south of Iowa, and Iowa, being a free state, naturally proved a high-way for the Underground Railroad. Slaves made a run for the North Star and many times colored men and women crossed the prairie from Middle River to Summit Grove. After John Brown came through Iowa, stations were known and accounted for and my father has pointed out a house in west Stuart many times known as such a station.

## POLK FAMILY

It was to this land that Edmund Polke of McDonough County, Illinois came in 1854 and purchased 240 acres in Section 15, Township 76, Adair County, on November 24, 1854 for \$1.25 per acre, entry #10,600 at the land office at Fort Des Moines. About ten miles south of Summit Grove, at the time a few families were crossing Middle River in ox drawn covered wagons and building simple log cabin homes. Friendly Indians were still riding out of the woods.

Edmund returned to Illinois and died in 1861. His Polk ancestry descended from Captain Robert Bruce Polk (Pollock) and Magdalen Tasker who came to America from Ireland in 1672. Their second son, William Polk, Sr., is also ancestor of James K. Polk, 11th President of the United States (1845-1849). William's son, Charles Polk, the Indian trader, was the father of Captain Charles Polk who married Delilah Tyler, and followed the tide of emigration to Kentucky. On one of the Wabash Indian forays into that part of Kentucky Delilah and four of their children were taken prisoner. She was far advanced in pregnancy and her son, Charles Polk III, was born in Indian captivity in Detroit on October 20, 1782. Capt. Charles Polk rescued his family about a year after their capture and Charles Polk III, the little white papoose, grew up in Nelson County, Kentucky. He married Margaret McQuaid and they migrated to Indiana. Edmund Polk was one of their 13 children. He married Jane Elliott and went from Indiana to Illinois.

In 1865 Edmund Polk's daughter Clara married Andrew Haynes and they immediately set out for Iowa to live on this land in Adair County. While coming through Des Moines they refused an opportunity to trade the team and wagon for forty acres of land adjoining the city on the west. Their journey to Adair County was completed with a team of one horse and one cow.

## HAYNES FAMILY

When Andrew and Clara Haynes arrived at their farm on Middle River, just a few miles away at Port Union there was a grist mill where farmers took their grain to be ground. Wheat for flour, corn for cornmeal, and other grains into pancake flour. Mail had been received at a small farmhouse post office with the Indian name of Wah-ta-Wah before Port Union, and the name changed again with a relocation so it could be served by a daily mail route between Stuart and the county seat of Greenfield. Now it was Arbor Hill and one of only four post offices in Adair County. The big event every September was the Old Settlers Reunion with races of all kinds, ball games, speeches, horseshoes, contests in nail driving, egg carrying and horse pulling. At certain seasons there were fox hunts and often a circle wolf hunt. There was fishing in the river and swimming in the hole at the milldam site. Now, except for memories, Arbor Hill - Port Union is no longer a thriving community.

It was a great place for my Granddad Farris Haynes to spend his boyhood. This son of Andrew and Clara Polk Haynes was born on this farm October 23, 1866. He married Mary Alice Roads, a neighbor girl of Pennsylvania Dutch ancestry October 17, 1888. This ancestry is noted for well-tended farmland, magnificent produce and I can vouch for the "Vunderful Goot" cookies my Grandma made. They were the parents of five sons: Hilton, Coleman, Lester, Ray, Edwin and one daughter, Florence, my mother.

Farris Haynes, farmer, served on the City Council of Stuart 1915-1919 when the administration was called, sometimes in derision and sometimes with affection, "BOY Mayor and BOY Council". But they made many municipal improvements, the first deep well was completed; the municipal light plant was enlarged so the citizens could have electricity seven days a week; water and sanitary systems were installed; disposal plant built; business district paved; City Hall built, and perpetual care established for the cemeteries.

## DEVELOPMENT OF STUART

THE IOWA DAILY STATE REGISTER of December 26, 1869 reported: "The Chicago Rock Island & Pacific Railroad is erecting its various shops and engine houses at Stuart, and business houses are springing up daily."

The stage coach had been discontinued through a little village north of Stuart, Morrisburg, which had been laid out in 1855 by J. J. Morris and James Moore. At one time it was one of the most promising little towns on the road with a telegraph office, newspaper, dry goods store, blacksmith shop, saloon, hotel, school house and a church. A cemetery was also laid out. Then it began to dwindle away, the remains destroyed by a tornado in 1871 and never rebuilt.

The Ben Noland family had come to Iowa from Ohio, stopping first in Boone County. The 1875 Map of Stuart area, Guthrie County, shows them with an 80-acre farm. There are my father's maternal Great Grandparents, buried at Morrisburg Cemetery in 1894 and 1896.

Among other things going on in Stuart, in the year 1871, was the planting of nearly five thousand shade trees. Quoting from the Locomotive Sparks newspaper: "We are now robed in living green - even the trees of the forest find "it is good to be here."

Meetings were being held with a view to organization of a Congregational Church Society and the erection of a church edifice. On March 16, 1871, the newspaper wrote: "Can't we have in Stuart one of those new fangled sociables which are all the rage in other places? If not, why not? For the benefit of our young folks we will give a description of the manner of getting up these enjoyable little affairs: Each lady procures and makes for herself an apron of some cheap material, and the more outlandish the pattern the better the fun, from the same material the apron is composed, she manufactures a necktie, of any pattern she chooses; this is placed in an envelope and sealed up without any address. These envelopes are all collected together and when the time arrives, the gentlemen walk up to the Cap'n's office and each pay 25 or 50 cents, whatever sum may be agreed upon, for one of the envelopes, which he opens. It now becomes his duty to find the lady wearing the apron which matches his necktie and to her he is duty bound to act as an escort for the evening, be she matron or be she maid, and when a mismatch takes place, then the laugh comes in. Just now when Stuart is in so much need of a church, this would be an excellent way to raise some money." I don't know how much this helped, but the lovely brick church with stained glass windows and a pipe organ is still there. My paternal Grandparents, Frank Barringer and Elizabeth Sanford were married at the Congregational parsonage on Sunday evening, January 20, 1868. My daughter was baptized in the church, 1950.

June 1, 1871 a new Livery Stable, 22 x 40 feet, capable of accommodating 15 span of horses was commenced. A trip was made to Illinois for horses and buggies. This would make two first-class Livery Stables in Stuart, second to "none in the state for style."

This same month it was stated "we like cows; they are a very useful animal, and so docile. The bells they wear around their necks are so large and so musical." We don't find fault with cows for making a practice of rousing for the night on the grass plot underneath our window, nor for scratching their fleecy sides against the corners of our house, but when we arise with the lark in the morning to the music of cow bells we have been calmly listening to all night, find our shade tree before our door, in which we took so much pride, broken off, trampled down and chewed up, it makes one feel like forever swearing off from the use of milk in any form and become a vegetarian. But it is just our luck -- in conclusion we will only say, should this tree-breaking, side scratching, bell-ringing continue much longer in our neighborhood -- we will be tempted to pray that an ear of corn finds itself cross-wise into eachthroat and cause each cow to cough-er-dam head off. "Coffer-dam" is not swearing!

Stuart's First July 4th Celebration, 1872 was a glorious affair with the citizens turned out en masse. A thousand yards of gay bunting unfurled to the breeze from the tops of various buildings and a large crowd gathered around the depot where a brass cannon was stationed. As six o'clock drew near the evening train could be observed rounding the curve a short distance from the town, the cannon began firing a salute, the Stuart Brass Band stuck up a lively air, and as the cars reached the depot, at the rear end of the train was attached a magnificent coach containing Captain Charles Stuart and wife and about 75 invited guests from Illinois. It was estimated over three thousand people were present.

January 4, 1887 - You could talk to Meno five miles away through the little "Tute hole" called the telephone.

January 6, 1892 - Born January 1, 1893 to Frank Barringer and wife, a son. This son was my father, E. G. Barringer.

September 29, 1893 - Mr. and Mrs. H. Lawbaugh presented to the people of Stuart a beautiful plot for a park. Mr. Lawbaugh worked for over two years to secure title to 15 lots, graded, fenced, and planted the entire park to shade trees.

## STUART, IOWA

November 24, 1893 - A telegram was received Tuesday from Tincup, Colorado announcing the death of Wm. Barringer. One of the pioneers of the area, the Barringers had lived on a farm in Stuart's Adair County 1870-1880. They had married in 1852 in New York and moved West, first to Illinois, then to Stuart. About this time there was great excitement over gold in Colorado and Wm. Barringer joined the legendary boom. Tia Cup enjoyed the dubious distinction of being one of Colorado's three roughest towns. He was successful in his strike, had sold it, when he was fatally shot with a bullet in the back and found frozen to death in the yard of his little cabin. December 1, 1893 - the remains of William Barringer arrived Saturday night from Tin Cup, Colorado. He was buried in Stuart's North Oak Grove Cemetery. His sons were harness makers and his daughters married owners of harness shops in Stuart.

July 1, 1898 - The Hartscock Bros. of Bondurant passed through Stuart with their horseless carriage. They were en route to Omaha to place it on exhibition. The motive power is a gasoline engine. They bought five gallons of fuel here and said it would last them the balance of the day (Omaha is 100 miles from Stuart). The outfit makes about as much noise as a threshing machine.

THE TOWN CLOCK - Is it Stuart's Oldest Landmark? The eight-day clock, completed on November 24, 1894 was manufactured in Connecticut by the Seth Thomas Clock Company. It was donated to the town of Stuart on January 11, 1971 by the Masonic Lodge.

In 1896 the railroad shops were gone from Stuart and the town's economy was largely dependent upon the surrounding agricultural territory.

On Stuart's 100th birthday, E. G. Barringer - my father - was "Main Street's Oldest Active Business Man," a charter member of the Stuart Service Club, and had served on the City Council, the Board of Education, President of the Stuart Building and Loan Ass'n., Treasurer of the Four County Angus Ass'n. for more than 18 years - this native son of Stuart, apprentice harness maker at the age of 14, will be 90 years old on New Year's Day, 1983. There have been five generations of Barringers in Stuart. I own the farm that has been in our family since 1854 and it received Century Farm Recognition in 1975.

For the Centennial Celebration the citizens placed in a sealed vault, buried in the town park, many items and messages to the people of Stuart in the year 2070 to serve as a meaningful bridge between 1970 and those who follow across another century.

I liked growing up in Middle America. Life in a small town was fun. The first years I lived away from Stuart, and Iowa, I was terribly lonesome for snow-drifts.

## SANTA BARBARA COUNTY MARRIAGE RECORDS - 1896

A limited number of Bible records and genealogical articles will be included.

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SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

One of California's 27 original counties. While the county was actually created in 1850, the history of the area dates back to 1542. In that year Juan Cabrillo discovered the Santa Barbara Channel and later, according to legend crossed to San Miguel Island, where he died and was buried. A second Spanish explorer, Sebastian Vizcaino, entered the channel on the Feast Day of Saint Barbara in 1602 and named the area accordingly. Fr. Junipero Serra founded the Santa Barbara mission in 1786. Santa Barbara Royal Presidio, established April 21, 1782, was the last of four royal presidios in Alta California - San Diego, Monterey, San Francisco and Santa Barbara. Santa Barbara had all three Spanish forms- Presidio representing the military; Pueblo, civil and Mission, religious.

In 1873 Ventura County was established from the southern portion of the original Santa Barbara area.
