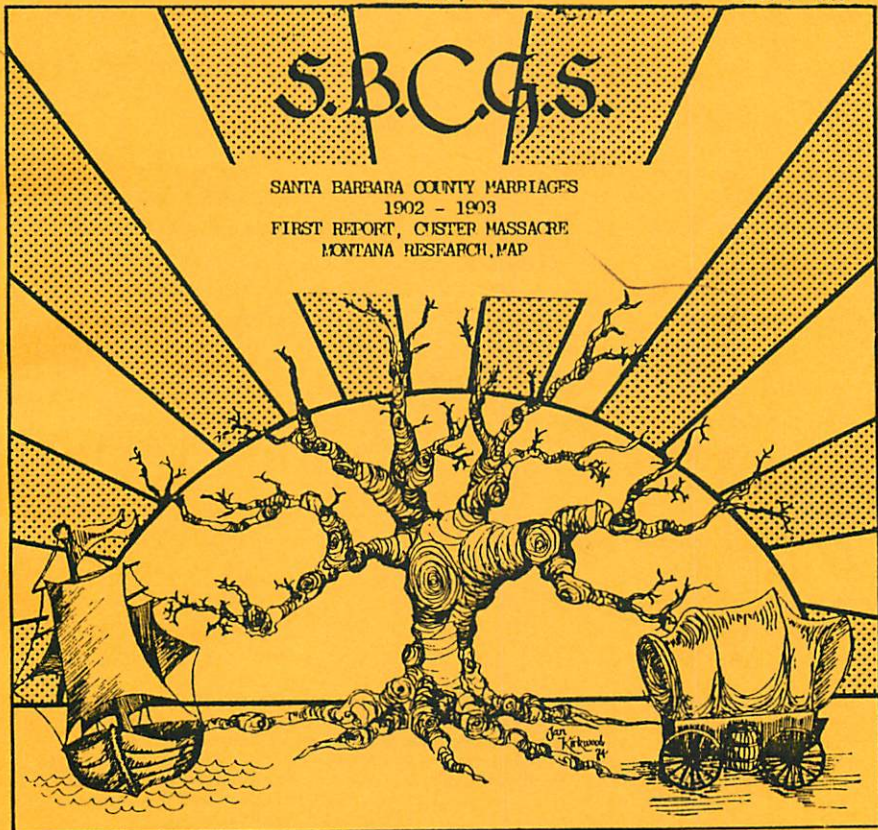

MULTIGENERATIONAL SURNAME NUMBERING SYSTEM - Lillian M. Fish

Attention is called to an article in the SEATTLE GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY BULLETIN, Vol. 33, No. 1, Fall, 1983, p. 28, by Ida Skarson McCormick, member of the SGS Computer Interest Group, entitled: *Modified Henry Multigenerational Numbering System*.

This particularly caught your editor's attention due to the fact that she has been attempting to influence Melinde Lutz, the young relative who induced her to collaborate on a Mann family history, to use a different numbering system than Melinde used in her *Hayes Family of Virginia* - one which would be compatible with computers and which would indicate the progenitors by numbers representing the generation from John¹ Mann b. 4 June 1753 Elgin, co. Moray, Scotland; m. 24 Dec 1776 Janet Laing, dau of William Laing and Elizabeth Douglas, dau of James Douglass and Marjory Skeen; John arrived Gloucester, Mass. 1811 with his youngest son, James, some of whose descendants removed to Virginia in the 1850s or from the first to emigrate to America: William Mann b. 26 Oct 1777, Elgin, co. Moray, Scotland, who married 25 Jan. 1802 at Woodford, Co. Essex, England the sister of a shipmate in the East India service, Mary Weald Okendon, daughter of John Okendon and his wife Martha Weald, of Woodford, England. William was rescued from an island off the eastern shores of Africa after pirates had seized the East Indiaman on which he was serving and brought to Salem, Essex Co., Mass. by a ship from that port. He arrived in Salem, Mass. 4 December 1803. His wife and son, John William Mann, b. 24 April 1803 at Woodford, Essex Co., England, arrived Boston, Mass. 23 October 1806, preceding the father and younger brother by several years.

The method described in the McCormick article would designate William as 1. His father as 2 and his younger brother as 3.

The explanation set out in the McCormick article runs:

- "2 is the 2nd person in the 1st generation (maybe the 2nd progenitor of the surname rather than a sibling of #1)
- 25 is the 5th child of #2.
- 25A is the 10th child of #25
- 25AB is the 6th child of #25A "
- 25A6E is the 14th child of #25A6

The proposed modification of the Henry system would allow all the descendants of an individual to be on a print out before his/her next sibling (unless only one or two generations are specified) and gives the following example:

The Henry system is mentioned in *Write It Right: A Manual for Writing Family Histories and Genealogies* (1963) by Donald R. Barnes and Richard S. Lackey, but that work does not discuss modifications made to the Henry system to accommodate the use of computers. Under the Henry system the last number in the first example would be written 25(10)6(14), which is not computer oriented. Don Galt of the Seattle Society uses a period every 5th generation to make the modified Henry number easier to read. For example, 25A6E.6954F.18 is a person in the twelfth generation.

Multigenerational Surname Numbering System

Harry Titus of SBOGS tells the writer that he uses a system in which each individual is assigned a file number and also a generation number. He drew the following explanatory chart:

It is to be hoped that before the Mann Family history goes to printing a consensus will be reached on the most feasible method of adapting a family numbering system to the computer.

SBOGS has "in the works" a computerized listing of queries which have appeared in ANCESTORS WEST since the present format was adopted by former editor Virgil Cooper, together with names of those who submitted the same, and their addresses.

PROPOSED CHANGE IN FORMAT FOR ARTICLES PUBLISHED IN ANCESTORS WEST AND ADOPTION OF POLICY ON ADVERTISING BY ORGANIZATIONS AND SOCIETIES.

Comment on changing the format for articles to be published in ANCESTORS WEST or suggestions for improvement are solicited by the editor.

A sample of a two-column page with reduction (74) is included in this issue, in order to meet the criticism that the print is too small for easy reading. The two-column page could only be used for articles as it does not lend itself to printing of Ancestor Charts, Marriage Records, etc. Those items would continue to be printed as at present.

Other than the courtesy exchange offerings now on the inside back cover, ANCESTORS WEST has not published advertisements for organizations or societies offering publications or supplies for sale and has never set a schedule of prices for such displays. Since the entire 36 or 40 pages includes in each issue are vital to a continuance of ANCESTORS WEST as an informational source, and all additions must be made in 4 pages or multiples thereof, it has been suggested that an additional four pages might be allotted to advertisements, strictly limited to genealogical connected offerings. If less than 4 pages of advertisements materialized, the unused portion would remain blank. Recently one inquiry has been received regarding a half-page advertisement. The matter was discussed at one board meeting, but no recommendation or conclusion reached. It is requested that interest in such a project be made known by correspondence with the editor.

To those of you who do not receive the Newsletter and Digest of the International Society of Family History Societies, it was thought you might be interested in reading Collin Chapman's report of his 1983 genealogical lecture tour on the North American continent, and that it could be used as example of the proposed new format for ANCESTORS WEST articles.

A brief account of his visit to SBOGS was included in the June 1983 ANCESTORS WEST.

Proposed New Format for ANCESTORS WEST! Articles

In California, I walked in the 1983 footsteps of Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip, and in Ontario in the 1953 footsteps of William Clayson and his family. These experiences were at two two extremities of my Spring 1983 genealogical lecture tour on the North American continent on which I gave 23 lectures in 21 days, covering over 12,000 miles

Flying initially to Calgary and then to Vancouver in Canada, to exchange ideas with the Federation Liaison Officer of the British Columbia Genealogical Society, I had no time to recover from the 10-hour time difference before flying on to Portland, Oregon, and then San Francisco. By car to San Lorenzo and then San Jose where I was presented with hundreds of 19th century photographs - many identified but totally unsorted - of some distant cousins. The flight to Santa Barbara in a 15-seater aircraft flying at roof-top height was an unexpected experience but my reception at Santa Barbara airport by their Genealogical Society was truly regal. Two lectures, locked in a charity supermarket whilst a pick-pocket was being detected, and a look at the devastation caused by the storms during the Queen's tour only six weeks before, added to my experiences in this part of California. A morning lecture in Santa Barbara and, grabbing a sandwich I collected my thoughts for afternoon lectures to Ventura County Gensoc. A Mexican meal and an organ recital by the Mormon Tabernacle Organist completed that hectic but fruitful day during which I displayed and distributed Federation publications and explained the idiosyncracies of specific English archives, record offices and Family History Societies.

The following day I had no lectures and used it to visit Hollywood, Los Angeles and Las Vegas before flying on to Salt Lake City. I had planned to do some personal research in the Mormon genealogical library, but discovered that other 'plans' had been made for me and I ended up presenting five lectures in Salt Lake City and at Brigham Young University, besides visiting friends I had made on previous visits to the

US, particularly during the world conference on Records in 1980.

A short flight to Denver and a drive by car through a snow storm to Pueblo in Colorado, where there was just time for a wash before my evening lecture. I gave two lectures the next day and that evening was taken to a dance of the local German Club. I was overwhelmed when the German band played "Happy Birthday" in honour of my anniversary that weekend - my hosts had done their research on me!

Although a trip to the desert was intended for the Sunday my exhaustion determined that the day be spent relaxing with a farming family, having 16th century Bedfordshire ancestors. Next morning it was back to Denver by road and then to Kansas City by air and directly to TV studios for an hour's interview and then four (!) lectures. There was no time to see any of Kansas or Missouri as the following day I flew into Chicago to give lectures at the Newberry Library - what a marvellous collection of works on British local and family history, none on open shelves but all available on request. I was privileged to be shown the miles of bookshelves - including one volume by a Brimley cousin written in the last century of which I know of only one copy in this country! There were a few hours to see some of Chicago, which reminded me so much of Cheltenham and so little of the gangster impressions I had previously. A quick look at the grave of Pullman (of rail-coach fame) was possible before my flight to Toronto to complete my lecturing engagements.

Besides my four lectures at a seminar on English research, I was able to visit a preserved and recreated pioneer village and also the country railway station where a Clayson cousin is reputed to have dropped dead at the turn of the century. A trip to another cousin's farm and a visit to friends made on my 1981 lecturing tour of Canada completed my 1983 genealogical visit to America; leaving, I hope, several thousand researchers better informed on British ancestry. I flew through the night back to England for a complete change - I had to give a lecture on Nuclear Physics at 9 am the following morning!

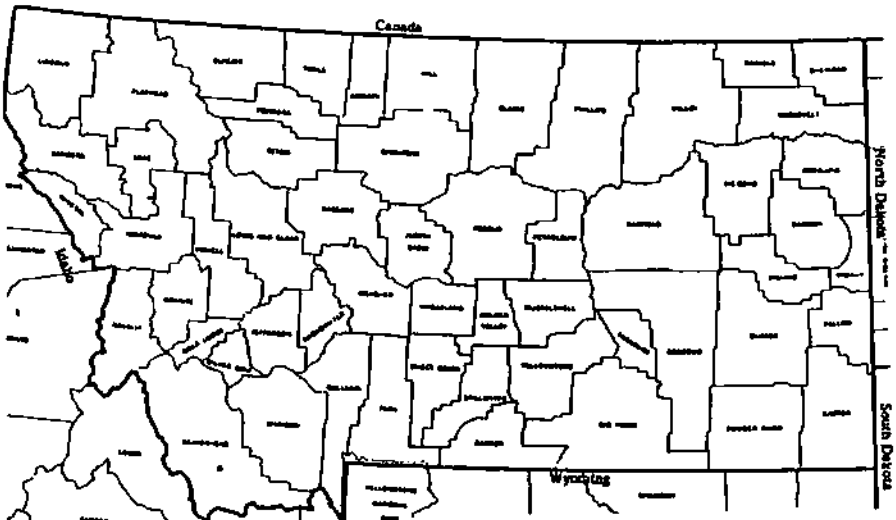

MONTEANA RESEARCH AND REFERENCES
Capital, Helena Territory 1864 41st State 1889



When white explorers first came into the area, at least 16 tribes of Indians roamed over Montana. The first whites to visit there were traders from France, Scotland and England. In 1803 Montana was part of the Louisiana Purchase. In 1805 members of the Lewis and Clark Expedition crossed the state en route west and also on the return trip in 1806. The western part of Montana was included in the section that came to the United States in 1846 through the Oregon Treaty. In 1862 when gold was discovered in what is now Madison County, southeast of Butte, an influx of people was attracted. Copper and silver were found in the Butte region some twenty years later. Many mine workers came from Ireland, Germany, Austria, Poland and Czechoslovakia. Prior to 1864 when Montana was organized as a Territory, various parts were at varying times included in surrounding territories such as Missouri, Nebraska, Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

Birth and death records from June 1907 to the present are at the Bureau of Records and Statistics, Montana Department of Health and Environmental Sciences, Capitol Station, Helena, Montana 59620.

The Handy Book for Genealogists, 7th edition, contains a list of Montana histories showing organization dates for counties and types of records held by County Clerks and Clerks of District Courts and the U. S. Census Reports.

The Custer Battlefield Highway extends from Des Moines, Iowa, to Glacier National Park, Montana, a distance of about fifteen hundred miles, including along its course national parks, forests and monuments, the Custer Battlefield national cemetery, the Bad Lands of South Dakota, the Black Hills, the Roosevelt monument at Deadwood, the "Devil's Tower" and cities such as Fort Dodge, Iowa, Sioux Falls, South Dakota, Billings, Roundup, Lewiston and Great Falls, Montana.

Carl Lauritsen has furnished a copy, reproduced in this issue, of the first account of the Custer Massacre published in the Bismarck, D. T., Tribune July 6, 1876. Given are the names of 261 killed, including 14 officers—the name of George A. Custer, Brevt. Major General heading the list, also the acting assistant surgeon J. M. DeWolf, 257 enlisted men; 5 civilians; Boston Custer, a brother of Gen. Custer, Arthur Reed, Custer's nephew, Mark Kellogg, correspondent from the Bismarck Tribune, Charles Reynolds and Frank C. Mann; and 3 Indian scouts. The list of wounded includes Private Davis Corey; Patrick McDonnell; Sergt. John Paul; Priv. Michael C. Madden; Wm. George who d. July 3; 1st Sergt. Wm. Horn; Priv. John McVay; Patrick Concoran; Dan Miller; Alfred Whitaker; Peter Thompson; Jacob Deal; J. H. Meyer; Roman Muller; Daniel Howell; Jas. Muller; Elijah T. Strouds; Sergt Patrick Carey; Privt. James R. Glenn, emptying several chambers of his revolver, each time bringing a red-ink before he was brought down—through the breast—there was here bloody knife surrounded his spirit to the one who gave it fighting the natural and hereditary foes of his tribe, as well as the foes of the whites.

The Sioux dashed up beside the soldiers in some instances associating them from the horses and killing them at their pleasure. This was the case with Lt. McIntosh, who was unarmored except with a saber. He was cut from his horse, tortured and finally murdered at the pleasure of the red devils. It was here that Fred Orand was separated from the company and lay all night with the screeching Scods feeding death and destruction to his comrades within a few feet of him, and but time will not permit us to relate the story through some means succeeded in saving his fine black stallion in which he took so much pride. The ford was crossed and the summit of the bluffs having Col. Reno and the stoutest sides that he ever saw succeeded by a horse or mule, reached, though the ascent was made under a galling fire.

The combatants were in this affair were those of Captain Boylan, French and McIntosh. Col. Reno had gone ahead with these companies in obedience to the order of Gen. Custer fighting most gallantly, driving back repeatedly the Indians who charged in front, but the fire from the bluffs being so galling, forced the movement heretofore allowed to, Squaws were given and soon bent down with the four companies in recovery came up in time to save Reno from the fate with which Custer about this time met. The Indians charged the hill time and again but were each time repulsed with heavy slaughter by its gallant defenders. Soon, however, they reached bluffs higher than those occupied by Reno; and opened a destructive fire from points beyond the reach of cavalry carbines. Nothing being heard from Custer, Col. Welf was ordered to push his command along the bank of the river in the direction he was supposed to be, but he was soon driven back, retiring with difficulty. About this time the Indians received strong reinforcements, and literally swarmed the hill sides and on the plain, coming so near at times that stones were thrown into the ranks of Col. Reno's command

he terribly mortified. The accounts seem to have passed over the field and crushed the skulls of the wounded and dying with stones and clubs. The hands of some were severed from the body, the privates of some were cut off, while ribbons bore traces of torture, arrows having been shot into their private parts while yet living, or other means of torture adopted.

The officers who fell were as follows: Gen. O. A. Custis, Colo. Geo. Yates, Alvie Knapp, James Calhoun, W. W. Cook, Capt. Merriam, A. E. Smith, Lieutenant Riley, Critchfield, Sprick, Harrington, Hodgson and Porter, Asst. Surgeon D. Wolf. The only officers killed were Boston Custer, Gen. Fred, Chiefly Raymond, Isiah, the interpreter from Ft. Rice and Mark Kellogg, the latter the Tribune correspondent. The bodies of Kellogg and Raymond retained strippers of his clothing, and was not mutilated. Perhaps as they had learned to be the General, Chief, Custer, had for that reason did not mutilate the remains they had in like manner treated in respect to the remains of the slain, and to that fact may be attributed this result. The wounded were sent to the west side of the bluffs, where many Indians standing the Far West sixty odd miles up the Big Horn which they left on Monday at noon reaching Bismarck nine hundred miles distant at 10 p. m.

The burial of the dead was and work but they were all decently interred. Many could not be recovered, among the latter class were some of the officers. This work being done the command was ordered to march to Allen. The men were Gen. Terry, supplies and approval of his plans for the future campaign.

The men and the outfit with marching and fighting, and are almost wholly destitute of clothing. The Indians smothered at least sixteen hundred bodies of their perished camp, while those who fought Crook seems to have joined them, making their effective fighting force nearly four thousand. Many were led by chiefs carrying signs of various colors, nine of whom were found in a burial tent on the bank of the river. Many other dead were found on the field, and near it ten squaws at one point in the ravine—evidently the work of Red or Crow squaws. The Indians dead were great in number, as they were constantly annihilating an inferior force. The camp had been abandoned, and the remains

of Gen. Custer, Colo. Calhoun, Yates, Capt. Smith, and Lt. Porter. The unhappy Mrs. Calhoun, loses a husband, three brothers and a nephew. Lt. Harrington also had a family, but no trace of his remains was found. We are indebted to Col. Smith for the following full list of the dead; to Dr. Porter for the list of wounded, which is also full:

It will be remembered the Big Horn Tribune sent a special correspondent with Gen. Terry, who was the only professional correspondent with the expedition. Fellow's best records to the writer were: "We leave the Rosebud tomorrow and by the time this reaches you we may have been killed."

It and MUDGUTT, the red devil, with what result remains to be seen. I go with Custer and will be at the death. How true! On the morning of the 23d Gen. Custer took up the line of march for the trail of the Indians, reported by Reno and the Rosebud scouts. General Custer told us to be on hand for a banding danger, urged Custer to take additional men, but Custer having full confidence in his men and in their ability to cope with the Indians, in whatever force he might meet them, declined the proffered assistance and marched with his regiment alone. He was instructed to strike the trail of the Indians, to follow it until he discovered their position, and report by courier to Gen. Terry, who was at the mouth of Little Horn by the evening of the 23th, when he would set in concert with Custer by the final wiping out. At four o'clock the afternoon of the 24th, Custer scouts reported the location of a village recently deserted, whereupon Custer went to camp, marching again at 11 p. m., containing the march until daylight, when he again went into camp for coffee. Custer was two dozen miles from the village located on the Little Horn, one of the branches of the Big Horn, twenty miles above his position, which could be seen from the top of the divide, and after lunch General Custer pushed on. The Indians by this time had discovered his approach, and soon were seen mounting in great haste, riding here and there, it was presumed he fall retraced. This idea was strengthened by finding a freshly abandoned Indian camp with a deserted tent, in which one of their tents had been left, about six miles from where the battle took place. Custer with his usual vigor pushed on making seventy-eight miles without sleep, and started the village near its foot with companies C, E, F, I, and L, of the seventh cavalry, Reno having in the mean time attacked it from the rear, with three companies of cavalry which, being surrounded, offered a desperate hand to hand conflict, in which many were killed and wounded, and their way to a bluff about three hundred feet high, where they were reinforced by four companies of cavalry under Col. Sibley, in gaining this position Col. Reno had to retrace the Little Horn, and as the ford the hottest fight occurred where Lieutenant McIntosh, Hodgson and Dr. DeWolf fell; where Charles Reynolds fell in a hand to hand conflict with a dozen or more

Charge after charge in quick succession, the fight being such that they were unable to retreat. They were finally taking to the hills and ravines. Col. Sibley charged a large party to reverse their line from it in confusion. They evidently trusted in their numbers and did not look for so bold a movement. They were broken up in the confusion, and wounded several officers. J. C. Warner, among the number, in the head, while many horses and mules were killed. About 10 o'clock the fight closed, and the men worked all night strengthening their breastworks, in line between the cups and places in place of spikes and picks, taking up the fight again in the morning. In the afternoon of the second day the men were again in the line of battle, but the wounded were becoming intolerable. The wounded were begging piteously for it; the tongues of the men were swollen and their faces were blue, and from lack of rest they were almost exhausted. So a bold attempt was made for water. Men volunteered to go with coffees and camp kettles, though to go was almost certain death. The attempt succeeded, though in making the case was killed and several wounded. The men were relieved, and that night the animals were watered. The fight closed at about opening action on the morning of the 25th, and continuing until the afternoon of the 27th. Meantime the men become more and more exhausted and all wondered what fate became of Custer. A panic all at once was created among the Indians and they stampeded, from the hills and into the waters, and the village was soon deserted except for the dead. Reno and his brave band held that position for a night and then fled. His men were in such a state of mind that strong men went upon each others necks, but no word was had from Custer. Head shaking and consternations followed, and rumors were heard. Bradley reported that he had found Custer dead, with one hundred and sixty men, and that he had seen the effect. Words cannot picture the feeling of these, his comrades and soldiers. Gen. Terry sought the spot and sent word that he had found the remains of those brave men who followed Custer, all perished; no one lives to tell the story of the battle. Those who developed a trail, lay as they fell, about down from every side, having been entirely surrounded in an open plain. The men were killed in place, some with their arms and like those on the skirmish line, lay as they fell, with their officers beheaded them in their great power. General Custer, who was shot through the head and body, seemed to have been among the last to fall and several men near him were found the bodies of Col. Tom and Boston, his brothers, Col. Calhoun, his brother-in-law, and his nephew, young Custer, who he insisted on accompanying the expedition for pleasure. Col. Cook and the members of the non-commissioned staff all died—all stripes of their clothing and many of them with bod-

in haste. The snow progressed rapidly in the mountains and the soldiers found chills and hundreds of flies dressed and painted robes and skins were thrown about the camp. The Indians were certainly severely punished. We said of those who went into battle with Custer that they were killed. Crow stood his ground in the field, and witnessed and survived the battle. His story is plain and clear. We were thrown about the camp. It is now. The names of the wounded are as follows:

The number of killed was two hundred and sixty one; wounded 33. Thirty-eight of the wounded were brought down on the Fur West three or four carried for at the field hospital.

De Rodio had a narrow escape, and his escape is attributed to the noise of beavers, jumping into the river during the engagement. De Rodio followed them, not out of sight, and after his retreat he was held for some time, and then the command in safety.

The body of Lt. Hodgson did not fall into the hands of the Indians, that of Lt. McIntosh was, and was badly mutilated. McIntosh, though a half-breed, was a gentleman of culture and education, and was very much liked. He leaves a family at Lincoln, as does

The name did appear in the 1902 Grooms' Index, but this points up the importance of making the listings for publication from the index volumes, rather than attempting to circumvent the official indexing volumes and "making a more accurate transcription from the original licenses"

To resolve differences in spelling - sometimes two different versions appear in the one index entry; sometimes the spelling in the Brides' Index differs from that in the Grooms' - workers do check the original license to verify the accuracy of the official index entry.

BOOK REVIEWS

GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH DIRECTORY, the 1983 Directory is the Fourth published by the Library of Australian History, 17 Mitchell Street, North Sydney, N.S.W 2060 (P. O. Box 795, North Sydney 2060 Australia, edited by Keith A. Johnson and Malcolm R. Sainty (ISBN 0 908120 52 4). The names and addresses of the 2089 contributors are listed (pp.1-30). Of the 91 USA addresses, 18 are in California, including SBCGS member Ms. B. C. Della (p.29, No. 2063). As from 1 September 1983 the Agent for U.S.A. and Canada is Mrs. L. Kivitt, 2707 West Clark Ave., Burbank CA 91505. The subtitle, A Key Work for Worldwide Family History Research, expresses the purpose of the listings in the 243 pages and the belief that there is no better means of putting distant relatives in touch each other. The remarkably detailed shipping lists during the 19th century and civil registration records of birth, marriage and death compiled in Australia, particularly in New South Wales from 1856 have solved numerous queries relating to parentage and exact place of origin of emigrants. This information is frequently not officially recorded in the country of adoption of a brother or sister or in official records in their native land. In the back of the paperback book are 20 pages of advertisements of services and available published guides and reference books, followed by a two-page Invitation to Participate in a Bicentennial Research and Publishing Project (1788-1988), Australian Biographical & Genealogical Record. The Scope of the Project is described as:

Series 1. A Pocket Biography on each person who lived in Australia before 31 December 1841. These will be compiled from two major sources: (a) Information submitted by descendants or other interested persons, please register all eligible persons from your records including children; (b) From the transcription of major source records by the Project's research team. Volumes will be published progressively and entries, alphabetically per volume, will be included on an earliest/first received basis. Concise Biographies in the above time scale will also be published in Series 1, if they are sponsored by the contributor (see Costs), these may include a photograph.

Series 2. Pocket or Concise Biographies (with photograph of subject where extant), on any Australian submitted and sponsored by individuals, as edited by AEGR. The subject must have arrived in or been born in Australia after 1841 and must be deceased. All biographies in this series will need to be financially sponsored. Volumes will be published progressively with entries appearing alphabetically in each volume. A master index will be produced in 1988. Early Registration will ensure inclusion in the first volume which will appear in 1983. As only a limited number of volumes will form Series 2, late entries will be rejected.

Series 3. Group Biographies, i.e. Pioneers of a particular district or professional, ethnic or social group.

Series 4. Associated Projects, i.e. Biographical works being compiled by companies, community groups or private individuals who wish to publish their own material but who would like their volume to form part of an overall Biographical Series for the Australian Bicentennial.

POCKET AND CONCISE BIOGRAPHIES. A pocket Biography will contain up to 130 words, compiled from information submitted on the special Biographical Detail Forms supplied to contributors. A Concise Biography will commence with the same details as a Pocket Biography, followed by additional material written by the contributor. The maximum length will be 750 words. Registration forms are available by post from AEGR, P. O. Box 795, North Sydney, NSW 2060, Australia.

Editor Keith Johnson, F.R.A.H.S., F.S.A.G., was Vice President 1975-77, has been President of the Society of Australian Genealogists since 1978, and a Councillor since 1970. Since 1975 he has been a Councillor of the Royal Australian Historical Society. Editor Malcolm Sainty, F.S.A.G., was Vice President of the Society of Australian Genealogists 1973-76 and has been a Councillor since 1970.

The June issue does not include a Table of Contents. Pages 50-60, inc. are reproductions of entries on 3 x 5 cards for the main family lines; pages 61-65, of entries on cards for allied lines. It is proposed to print available information and then update cards as new information is obtained. Samples for cards are given:

A card is made up separately for each child in a family, making it possible to prepare family group sheets from the cards.

Abbreviations to be used for the source of entries is set out at pp. 94-98, and includes a list of names and addresses of participants, as well as designations allotted to published sources. These abbreviations are shown for submitted material, with the source (also abbreviated). Several Family Sheets are reproduced.

P148 (cont. from Vol. 1, No. 1) commences with Joseph Peck², but without indication as to the names of his parents, unless his father may be inferred to have been William Peck, one of the founders in 1638 of the Colony of New Haven, from the references given. (pp. 74-84).
