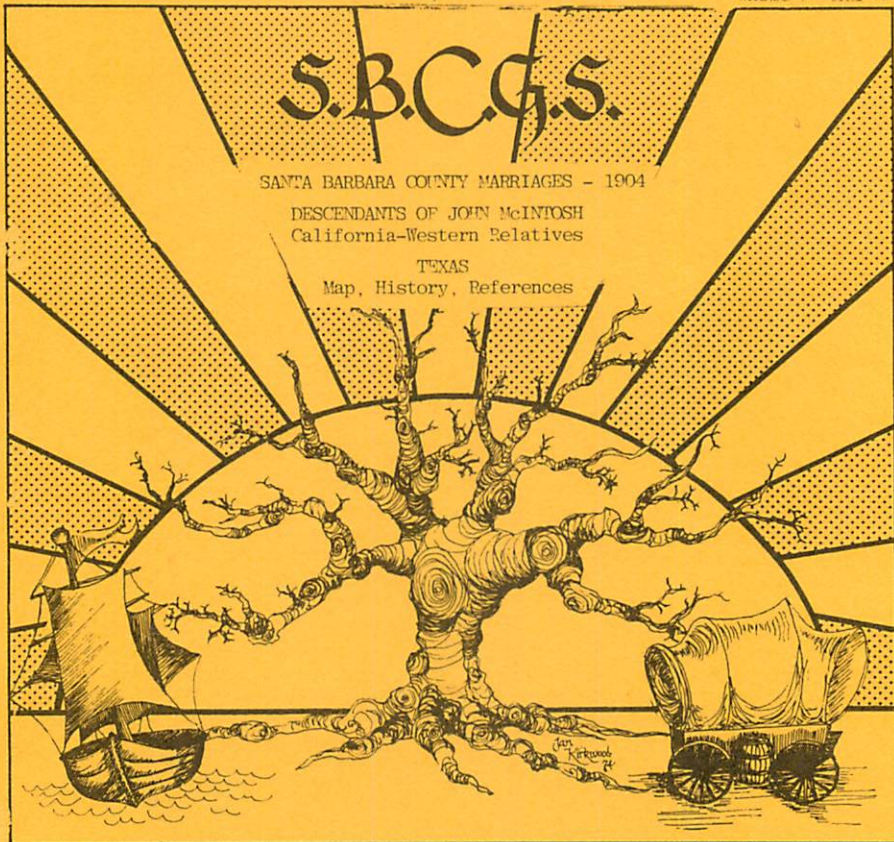

Carol credits her addiction to genealogical research to three things:

Retired 1980 and returned to Santa Barbara, with son John in 1946, following discharge from Army, married Shirley Grace Halverson in Jacksonville, ILL. LILIAN MANN FISH Editor, Director.

Since the publication Vol. 7, No. 1, March, 1981, AW, Lilian has completed her second 6 years of service on the board of directors of Santa Barbara Historical Society. She was involved in organizing and developing the Gledhill Library, which contains the museum's collection of documents, books, official records and genealogical material.

In June 1982, she attended the O'Neill Gathering in Northern Ireland and in July, during the Brit Rail strike visited northern Scotland, going from Glasgow by way of Edinburgh to Aberdeen and Elgin (instead of north by Lake Ness and Inverness), tracing Mann, Laing and Douglas(s) ancestors, largely through baptismal and marriage records from an April visit to the LDS Library in Salt Lake City and through Masonic Lodge records in Elgin, particularly with the help of Mr. McKenzie, the treasurer, who searched minutes back to 1709 and in December telephoned the results to her in Santa Barbara. Librarians in Aberdeen also were helpful with Skeen family references. In July several days were spent with the John and Gwenfa Bradbury family in Sutton-on-Trent, Nottinghamshire, and a week with the Dr. Goose family near Saffron Walden, Essex, and visiting Woodford, the early home of Mary Weald Ockendon (wife of William Mann), and Wicken Bonhunt, and its Bradbury Brick House, and Cambridge, passing through London to Gatwick Airport. 1983 activities—the Colin Chapman visit in April, attending the dinner and lectures with house guest, Melinde Lutz, then of Eugene, Oregon, and now employed at one of the Harvard University libraries, reviewing foreign technical periodicals, with the privilege of time to engage in some professional genealogical research in Boston. She and Melinde are cooperating on a history of the descendants of their

ancestor William Mann 9L777-1845. Melinde has transcribed the original journal of his experiences in the service of the East India Co., capture by pirates off Africa and rescue by a ship from Salem, Mass. and has located additional descendants and family papers and records.

N. BURR CORYELL, Society member, addressed the February membership meeting on his Coryell News Letter and his booklet on preparation and production of a News Letter. In July a truck-trailer trip to the East Coast was made with wife Dorothea and two 10 and 12 year old Boyd granddaughters. His December 1983 News Letter deals with roots in Ontario, Canada, Family group sheets for Michael Coriell (of Ovid, N.Y.) his son Abraham b NY 1 Aug 1773, d. 1 Dec. 1851, So. Whitby (Oshawa) Ont. wife Sarah Annis, and their 5 sons, Michael, Abraham, Jr., Daniel, David Annis, and Charles Emerson; and two grandsons, George J.H. and William F. Coryell are given, with illustrations (photos and maps). On the trip Dorothea's Goodrich relatives were visited at Penobscot Bay, Maine; a visit was made to her Bernington Vt. college campus; a week at the Day Missionary Library at Yale doing China research; visiting China friends in NY state; arriving at Pendle Hill, the Quaker Study Center, near Philadelphia, where Dorothy enrolled Oct. 1st to write a book on her grandmother's early years in China as a Missionary. Burr's journal of the 13,136 journey ending Oct. 15 in Santa Barbara is being digested.

Loan period begins when the film arrives at the institution or individual's home. Orders processed daily. Back orders held a maximum of 15 days before a new roll is produced and sent. Holdings include all Federal Census Schedules 1790-1910 including soundexes and miraclecode, Federal Mortality Schedules, some State, Colonial and Continental Census Records, and Slave Schedules, selected Tax Lists, etc. In all over 60,000 titles. TEXAS REFERENCES AND RESEARCH

Shortly after 1820 former residents of Alabama, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Tennessee were brought into the section under the leadership of Moses Austin and his son, Stephen. By 1830 more than 20,000 Americans had become tillers of Texas soil. Austin has been the capital of Texas since statehood in 1845. Earlier capitals were San Felip de Austin, Washington-on-the-Brazos, Harrisburg, Galveston, Velasco and Columbia during the Revolution, 1835, 1836; Houston, 1837-1839; Austin, 1839; Houston, Washington-on-the-Brazos 1842-45. The Bureau of Vital Statistics, Texas Department of Health, 1100 West 49th St., Austin TX 78756 has birth and death records from 1903 and delayed birth records from about 1850 to 1951, including voluntary registrations made during and since 1929 for births not registered at time of events. The City Clerk of the city, or the County Clerk of the county may have birth or death records prior to 1903.

An article in CASE AND COMMENT (The Lawyers Magazine since 1894) Jan-Feb 1984 issue suggests that an inquirer give the following facts when writing for Birth or Death Records:

1. Full name of person whose record is being requested.
2. Sex and race. 3. Parents' names, including maiden name of mother.
4. Month, day, and year of birth or death.
5. Place of birth or death (city or town, county, and State and name of hospital, if any).
6. Purpose for which copy is needed.
7. Relationship to person whose record is being requested.

Whether Texas has placed restrictions on furnishing certified copies is not known to this editor. The Case and Comment article states that as to Marriage and divorce records certified copies are not available from State office. Fee for search and verification of essential facts of marriage (Records since January, 1966) is \$1.00 by the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Texas Department of Health. Records may also be found in the office of the County Clerk in the county where license was issued. Cost of copy varies. The State office also has divorce records since January, 1968. Certified copies are not available from the State office. Fee for search and verification of essential facts of divorce is \$1.00. Records may also be found in the office of the Clerk of the District Court in county where divorce was granted. Fee for copy varies.

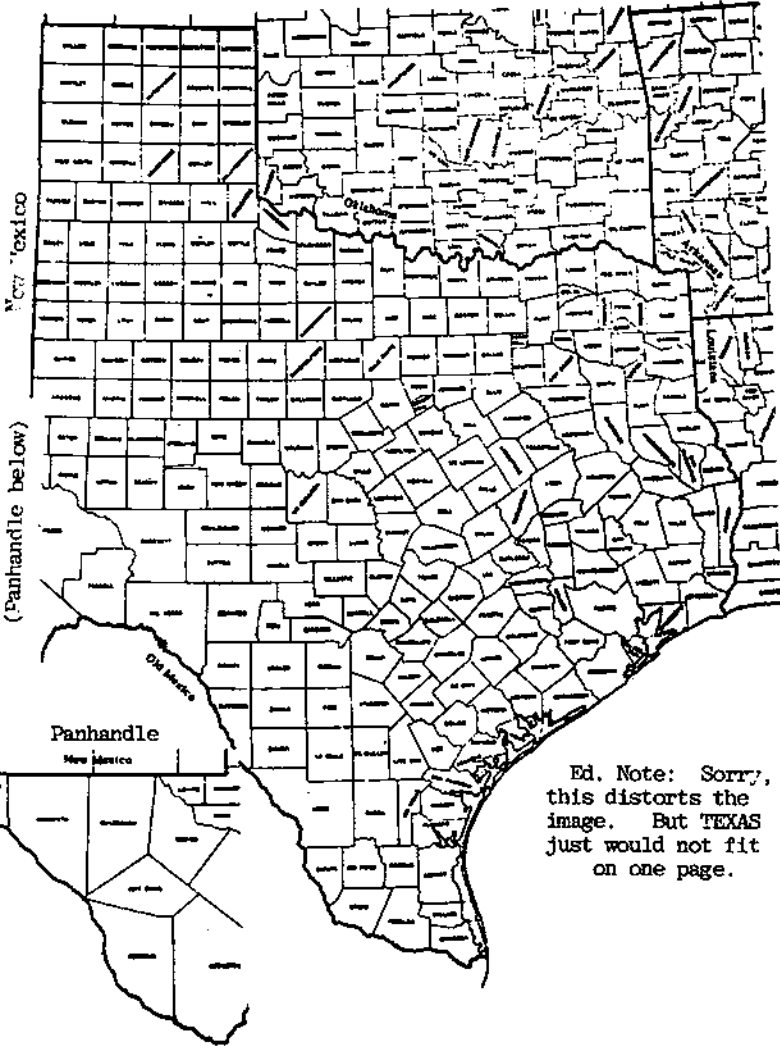

Under PEOPLE IN VIEW, Los Angeles Times, Part V/ Friday, Feb. 5, 1984, carried a headline PEERING INTO U. S. PEERAGE, and an item devoted to the decision of Debrett's Peerage "to take on the United States," its General Manager Martin Stansfeld asserting that it was time for the 214-year-old source of information and final word on the titled nobility of Great Britain to pick up where Darwin left off and has opted to begin with "Texas Peerage," published by Howard-McCann. After starting on the upcoming volume - "Old South Peerage" - they found that "in theoretical terms, we see Texas as having a heroic aristocracy" and that with its "warrior-background", old-line Texas even seemed "rather Homeric." In the fall of 1985, Debrett's will publish "California Peerage", a volume that will include, among other class strata, the "tinselocracy" of Hollywood, and the "cornucopia" of "wine, fruit and veg barons" as Stansfeld describes them.

HISTOIRE DE PATRONYM "WELDE(N)" A. L. Vanwelde, editor
 3, rue J. B. Fr. Denys, 1070 Anderlecht-Bruxelles, Belgium;
 Dec. 1983, vii, 82 pp. Bibliography 80-82. In the preface the
 editor describes his father's book on the patronym Welde(n), in
 French, relating research and family trips to the village of
 WELDEN in Swabia, Germany, the Valley of La Lagna; the site of
 the ancient chateau, Mont Thekla; discusses the meaning of the
 name - "weald" living in a wood or forest; "den", valley, and
 variations of the name found in Norway, Germany, England and Bel-
 gium. His father also traced names of spouses and included Reunis,
 Basmans, Oeyen, Pittonvils, Reinquir, Van Essche, Adams, Roelants,
 Leemans, del Sart, de Ghe and others. The preface closes with
 the statement he would like to talk further of many things, but
 for all that he leaves us to the reading of his father's little
 book and the opportunity to see the numerous illustrations with
 which he progressively augmented his text (photocopies of birth
 records, old manuscripts, diverse writings (printed in German
 script, handwritten in Flemish, etc.), photos of the chateau de
 Welder and other photos, and perhaps to incite us to research.
 Immigrants to America include: William Weldon who debarked in
 Virginia in 1619; Rev. Welde at Boston in 1632; Peter Welden in
 Virginia in 1645; A Samuel Weldon, of London, who arrived with
 his wife, Sarah Efford, in Virginia in 1675; an Adrianus Van
 Welden at Philadelphia in 1876; in Australia in 1855 the first
 Welden disembarked from the boat "The Telegraph" and in Tasmania,
 at Hobard there was already a James Welden at that place in 1835
 when Marry Welden arrived. HISTOIRE DE PATRONYME "WELDE(N)" is

 John McIntosh, born Inverness-shire, Scotland, 1737-40, in
 early 1757 was one of the young Scots persuaded by Simon Fraser,
 Master of Lovat, and others to join the first Highland Regiment
 (78th Highlanders) and was with General James Wolfe at the Siege
 of Quebec in 1759. In the early 1750s Wolfe was commandant of
 the garrison at Inverness. July 1, 1757, transport ships carrying
 the 78th Regiment sailed for North America from Cork, Ireland.

reaching Halifax, Nova Scotia late in August and early in October sailing for winter quarters in Connecticut. In April 1758 the Regiment marched to Boston, embarking for Halifax on April 22nd. The Regiment participated in at least three of the major engagements in the Siege of Louisburg in the summer of 1758 and in 1759 in the Siege of Quebec. The defense of Quebec in April 1760 followed, and the Regiment closed its battle service at St. John's, Newfoundland, Sept. 12 to 17, 1762, disbanding after the 1763 Treaty. Since family tradition is that his final discharge came at Fort Michilimackinac, a frontier post on Lake Michigan, it is assumed that he re-enlisted, joining the 90th Royal Americans and was there when Major Robert Rogers of the Rangers and Northwest Passage fame was commandant and from 1753 identified in the records as a resident of Merrimack, N.H.

The first record of John McIntosh in Merrimack is in a deed dated Dec. 15, 1769, in which "John McIntosh and John McGilveray of Merrymack, in consideration of forty-six Pounds four shillings, lawful money," bought from John Jacobs of the same town, "a certain tract of land in Merrymack of 110 acres." Oct. 23, 1770, John McIntosh of Merrymack, for Thirty-six Pounds bought from Joseph Thomas of Merrymack, a 70 acre homestead lot known as No. 70, a third Division Lot. This, with additions, was the McIntosh farm until John's death on Feb. 3, 1816.

The migration of the McIntosh family from Bedford, New Hampshire, to Bethel, Vermont, started when William, the oldest son, purchased land in Bethel Oct. 25, 1802, in the Gilead section of town. The others followed, with Isaac, the youngest being the last to purchase land March 10, 1817. Full page maps showing locations in Bedford and Bethel are set out opposite pages 1 and 5.

Families, including female descendants and their progeny, are traced in detail down to 1965. The material is presented in an extremely concise manner in about 40 pages (5-45), with 78 notes interspersed, and 8 items of errata and addenda, followed by the McIntosh index (p. 47, and an Index to other family names (49-60)). The balance of the book (pp.63-80) consists of an Appendix and includes: Parentage of John McIntosh and Addenda (63-65); McIntosh Centennial Observance Sept. 3, 1917, in Gilead section of Bethel, Vt. 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SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

One of California's 27 original counties. While the county was actually created in 1850, the history of the area dates back to 1542. In that year Juan Cabrillo discovered the Santa Barbara Channel and later, according to legend crossed to San Miguel Island, where he died and was buried. A second Spanish explorer, Sebastian Vizcaino, entered the channel on the Feast Day of Saint Barbara in 1602 and named the area accordingly. Fr. Junipero Serra founded the Santa Barbara mission in 1786. Santa Barbara Royal Presidio, established April 21, 1782, was the last of four royal presidios in Alta California - San Diego, Monterey, San Francisco and Santa Barbara. Santa Barbara had all three Spanish forms - Presidio representing the military; Pueblo, civil and Mission, religious. In 1873 Ventura County was established from the southern portion of the original Santa Barbara area.



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
