COMPENDIUM OF HISTORICAL SOURCES by Ronald A. Bremer ..THE HOW AND WHERE OF AMERICAN GENEALOGY organized by Dee W. Hadley and published by Butterfly Publishing, Inc. P.O. Box 21116, Salt Lake City, Utah 84121. The cost of this genealogical reference book is \$100.00 plus shipping charges of \$2.93. There are 1003 pages in a trimmed 9 x 12 format. Orders may be sent to Butterfly Publishing, P.O. Box 21116, 5505 South 900 East, Salt Lake City, Utah 84121. Attractively bound in blue cloth hardcover with gold lettering on front cover and on the backstrip. The compiler is a wellknown and well accepted genealogist and his efforts in compiling this reference work are most noteworthy. When the compiler first started working with genealogical records he found that much of the material left a lot to be desired..both as to context and certainly the method of presentation. He endeavored to improve on the methods and techniques and the comprehensive book presented is a good illustration of the results of his efforts. He has had direct contacts with all major genealogical sources and depositories of genealogical material. He also has maintained contacts with many genealogical societies. He has uncovered little known and seldom used material that has been hidden away in private collections and archives. This has resulted in the establishment of an excellent bibliography. The book is divided into five sections and covers the subjects of available material and where located in an expert fashion. A series of 41 questions are answered in an expert fashion and offer many answers to genealogical problems. The book has many maps and charts which will aid in solving research problems. This book is a definite must for all those libraries who have an adequate budget to permit a purchase,

A flyer for Vol. III, Scarecrow Press, Inc., P. O. Box 656, Meluchen, N.J. 08840 reads in part: ". . . Following the format of the earlier volumes, it lists hundreds of newspaper indexes in nearly 200 repositories- libraries, historical and genealogical societies and in the possession of individuals. The guide is in two parts. The first is a listing of the newspapers indexed, arranged by state, county and town in which the paper was published, with dates of index coverage and letter symbol designating index location. The latter half of the book is a listing of the repositories, arranged alphabetically by symbol, with subjects indexed, cost (if any) of having an index searched, and charges for photocopying specific articles found in an index. Newspapers available through interlibrary loan are also noted. In addition to the categorization by state, county and town, there are listings for foreign newspapers, American foreign language newspapers, specialized subjects and other miscellaneous papers, information and prices quoted are generally valid for the latter part of 1980. . . ."

Anita Cheek Milner received an M. A. in special education with emphasis on the gifted, from San Diego State University. A lecturer and freelance writer, her articles have appeared in The San Diego Union, and in national genealogical publications. She is also the author of Newspaper Genealogical Column Directory. Her letter also adds that the previous Sunday (May 12, 1985), she received her J. D. (law degree).

RECORD INVENTORY AND MICROFILMING PROJECTS (RIM)

A release from East Bay Genealogical Society states its volunteer workers are presently working in Alameda County and that others in nine additional counties in Northern California are compiling an inventory of all records of value in genealogical research. The intent is that the activity will spread throughout the entire state. Betty Turk, Vice-President of the Ventura Genealogical Society, and a regional director of the California Genealogical Alliance at the SBOGS October 12 meeting will discuss the techniques and procedures involved in the Records Inventory and Microfilming Project.

An extensive search is being launched for records of value in family history research. Such records are found in churches, cemeteries, schools, commercial organizations, libraries, museums, private homes, fraternal orders and community service organizations and are being sought for a massive inventory and microfilming project involving the California State Genealogical Alliance, the Genealogical Society of Utah and the California State Archives.

The first phase is an inventory in which the records are identified and recorded on a prepared form. The local society volunteers then work with the records custodians to establish a schedule and work out the logistics for the filming. The final phase is the actual filming by a camera crew from Salt Lake City who will set up their equipment at some prearranged site in the area.

Those inventoried records selected for filming will be identified by the Genealogical Society of Utah, which will assume the cost of filming. A copy of the film will be given to the Alliance which will in turn present it to the participating local society providing there is a local facility, such as the public library, in which to house the film and make it available to the general public.

This project, originally started in Sonoma County and being extended through the State, is viewed as an outstanding opportunity to locate records which might otherwise be lost and to preserve these records for all time.

Both this release from the East Bay Genealogical Society and an extensive statement as to the project from the Napa Valley Genealogical and Biographical Society emphasize that while Genealogical Society of Utah is implementing a program for microfilming valuable government and non-governmental records of California, the California State Genealogical Alliance is the overseeing organization for locating and listing NON-GOVERNMENTAL records of California. The program will generate two very valuable sources:

THE INVENTORY. The first stage, the Inventory, will produce a card file of records available in a specific County, including such data as type of record, location and extent (not individual names). A copy will be filed with the local society and one with the CSGA.

THE FILM. As the second stage in this project, GSU will film selected records. A copy of these films will be entered in their Library system (Mormon Libraries) and a copy will be given to CGSA for placement with the local society, providing a place of public access can be guaranteed.

The East Bay G S release states there probably will be only one location in the county where filming will be done and that it will be necessary for its members or the custodians of the records to transport them to that location.

The possibility of dividing the Santa Barbara County project between SBOGS and Santa Maria Valley Genealogical Society & Library, for the northern portion of the county, should be considered.

MORE RIM

In the NEWSLETTER, California State Genealogical Alliance, July 1985, p. 5, RIM PROJECT UPDATE: Wayne Morris, newly appointed coordinator, reports that a second camera is scheduled to be on site in So. Calif. about 1 September, 1985; a study is being conducted to determine the feasibility of getting a "flow camera" in California, capable of photographing card files at a rate of 3000 to 5000 cards a day. Possibly this could travel throughout the State filming just card files. A meeting is planned with Wayne Morris for 10 August following the conference in Salt Lake City, to plan a series of RIM briefings for each region. Being considered is a presentation in which CSGA representatives will review the inventory procedures, GSU staff will describe the microfilming process and both will handle questions from the audience. Regional Directors will be trying to arrange meeting sites and dates, covering the State from September to December, 1985. The SBCGS meeting is scheduled for October 16, Betty Turk, Ventura, ND.

Another article reports holdings at the California State Railroad Museum and Library, 111 I St., Sacramento. Cataloguing of the files has not been completed and access for RIM inventorying could not be obtained, but the custodian-librarian offered to fill out the inventory forms herself and has done so, making a wealth of railroad archival material available through the RIM project. The library operates on a closed stack basis and in the case of some files, their use is subject to advance appointment. Included are approximately 50,000 employee record cards showing birth date and place, address, wages and previous employment history from 1900 to about 1950 of the Southern Pacific Company (missing H-K and T-Z blocks). About 70,000 payroll vouchers of employees in the Sacramento and New York offices of the Central Pacific, 1861-1889, and the Southern Pacific c.1879-1910. 1032 volumes (1 per month) of payroll ledgers for 10 So. Pacific divisions, the General Office and 12 subsidiary companies, from Jan. 1915 to May 1921, "Pocket List of Retired Officials", a quarterly, 1895 to the present; Biographical Directory of the Railroad Officials of America, 1885, 1906, 1913 and 1922, continued in Who's Who in Railroading, 1930, 1940, 1946, 1949, 1954, 1959 and 1964; photograph collection, filed alphabetically by surnames, if known, otherwise by the railroad company for which the individual or group worked or by railroad occupation (1860 to the present).

It is also reported that to date a Colusan has inventoried records in Sacramento and Humboldt Counties; an Alamedan has acted in San Francisco and San Mateo Counties; a Sonoman in Trinity County, and a member in Butte County is working on Tehama County records.

SUPPLIES AVAILABLE AT SECGS REGULAR MONTHLY MEETINGS

At each meeting a table is set up displaying various forms and publications available for purchase. These vary from month to month. Staffing is supplied by the Sales Committee, headed by Ruth Pelch and Nona Armstrong. Proceeds go into the SECGS Book - Library Fund. Among the items available at the August meeting were large 23 x 22" family Pedigree Charts, supplied by Chet and Geri Young Explorations, 1901 Morgan Ave., Claremont, CA 91711. The chart can be folded to fit into most typewriters and is described as a working "score sheet" presenting a quick summary of one's knowledge of his/her ancestors and listing of information derived from primary sources. The chart was developed over a number of years by finally combining a normal "Pedigree Chart: with part of a "Family Group Sheet." By filling in the spaces as information becomes available, the genealogists can keep a record of their work and anyone following can easily build upon their work.

FAMILY PEDIGREE CHART- Chet and Geri Young Explorations

In addition to the direct ancestors normally shown on a Pedigree Chart, all the children for the first four generations, i.e. the uncles and aunts of persons on the next lower pedigree portion of the chart. The listing of children is given starting with the oldest as No. 1. This might show that the ancestor was the 8th child of the family and his "score" would be indicated in that position. Where more than 12 children were born, some areas have room to squeeze these names above or below the list. Pedigree Charts traditionally have paternal names as even numbers and maternal as odd numbers. Hence one always knows that the father of No. 3 (who is a daughter) is No. 6 (from child to parent always doubles the number). The mother would be No. 7 and the maternal grandfather No. 14. This chart is also unique in that lines are given upon which to write Source References (particularly if they are not birth, marriage, or death ctes), e.g. obituaries, funeral programs, birth announcements, wills, probate records, census records, etc. One way of entering these items is to use a number made up of the parent's Pedigree Number and the child's position number such as 4.3 for the 3rd child of parents No. 4 and 5. Such an entry might be:

4.3 - Will of Penelope Smith probated 1903 in my possession.

The above is condensed from an explanatory sheet accompanying the forms.

CAVEAT EMPTOR (Buyer Beware)

More warnings are being circulated. THE SEARCHER, July, 1985p. 136, A CAVEAT EMPTOR section by the Editor, Items mentioned include a \$1,995 per person tour of the ol' sod emanating from Halbert's of Bath, Ohio on behalf of "your Ancient and Royal Clan" . A legal chain-letter because no money is promised in return, just "hundreds of cards will accumulate". You might be lucky enough to be invited to make 5 lists of every name you are researching and send \$2 with each of them for each of the 5 names listed with the invitation. You also make 100 copies of the letter and mail them. You just might be able to find a better research use for the \$10 fee and the cost of making and mailing the 100 copies of the letter. A half-page is devoted to Beatrice Bayley Inc., run by 78-year old Beatrice Schneider and her son; the accusation by the Wisconsin Justice Dept. that the firm has reneged on promises regarding misrepresentation made at the time of a consent judgment in 1980, regarding the book titles and value of the genealogical content.

CAVEAT EMPTOR

MANHATTAN TRACERS aka James W. and Grace Branch of St. Nicholas St., New York City. Member Doreen Dullea reports there is no such street and that she received from a friend a warning from the St. Lawrence Valley Genealogical Society received from its member Edna Finn of Saranac Lake, NY., reading:

"A friend of mine in Tupper Lake INHI had placed a query in GENEALOGICAL HELPER for information on one of her families. The only response she has received so far was from this MANHATTAN TRACERS. They carry an address of PO Drawer #5528, New York, N.Y. 10027. They told her for \$25 they could supply her with this or that birth/death certificate. !Shel was apprehensive, but she did eventually send a check for \$25 and as you probably have guesses, she received nothing for her money. They did cash her check (if my memory serves me correctly it was through a Utica bank.)

"I took one step further and wrote Manhattan Tracers a letter and asked what information they had on my Hunt family of Westchester County. My letter was dated April 28th and only today !1 June 1985 did I receive my letter back marked "Box Closed - No Order." So maybe they have moved on, or taken another name."

MANTLE SURNAME ORGANIZATION

(Incorporating Mantell, Mantel, Mantil Surnames)

Henry J. Mantell, 131 Isabella Drive, Farnborough, Kent RG6 7UF England, a member of the Guild of One Name Studies and of the Society of Genealogists, in London, writes that the surname organization aims to study the origins of the surname with its spelling variations and to coordinate the efforts of those researching ancestors bearing the name. Current efforts are devoted to compiling extracts of all civil registration of births, marriages and deaths from 1837 to the present and identifying the distribution of the surname in England and Wales during the 19th century. Counties of Gloucestershire, Hereford, Shropshire, Worcestershire and Warwickshire have been covered thus far. Also the district of Radnorshire in Wales (now part of the administrative county of Powys). Part of the study is to write each person listed in the telephone directory with the surname in the areas covered. Local newspapers have carried letters from others with the surname. The surname is not common. Responses have revealed that emigration from Britain to Canada, USA and South Africa took place in the families of many of those who have replied. The writer is interested in hearing from any of the ANCESTORS WEST subscribers who might have ancestors from England bearing the name.

The surname is English and can be found in the Domesday book. (1086) It is commonly thought to have been fixed for several centuries and is most probably not a nickname but a trade name - a designer or manufacturer of cloaks or mantles. The spelling variations are not significant and can be found to be widespread in the 19th century. His own GGGrandfather's birth, marriage and burial have been found recorded with different spellings.

Although up to this time the study has concentrated upon only a few counties and a relatively short period, it is hoped that work will extend into other counties where the name can be traced back to the medieval period. The name is rare in most counties but occurs in Devon, Somerset and Cornwall, Sussex, Kent and Surrey and of course in London. Elsewhere the name is hardly found.

In addition to the indexes of births, marriagea and deaths, an index of wills covering the period from 1858 to the present is underway. In due course it is hoped to catalogue all earlier wills for counties where the surname is most common.

BOOK REVIEW

In their recently published book, **COMPUTER GENEALOGY--A guide to Research through High Technology**, authors Paul A. Andereck and Richard A. Pence provide a valuable tool for the genealogist considering purchase of a personal computer for management of genealogical data. In the few years since genealogy met the computer, there has been an incredible proliferation of hardware and genealogical software. How to select wisely from the vast array of products is the emphasis of the book. Many genealogists, intimidated by the computer and fearful of their ability to cope with the new technology, will be encouraged by the practical application presented by the authors as the reader is led step by step through 'Family Roots', used as an example of a good genealogy program. Because word processing is a major genealogical use of the computer, the first software purchase will likely be a word processing program. Of great importance, then, are chapters in which the authors assign a numerical value to features of word processing and genealogical software programs. These 'Adequacy Scales' provide a standard against which the purchaser may measure various components of the computer system. Based on the authors' experience and a survey of users, a 'genealogically adequate' computer will include a minimum internal memory capacity of 64K; an 80-character per line, 24-line monitor; a good typewriter-like keyboard; TWO disk drives, and printer. The book contains a directory of genealogy software programs available (1984) as well as directories of computer genealogy periodicals and computer interest groups. 296 pages, paper, \$12.95. AHSGR - American Historical Society of Germans From Russia. 631 D St., Lincoln, NEB 68502 is reported as having more than 20 chapters in the U. S. and may be of interest if your German ancestors went to Russia as colonists between 1763 and 1862 and then came to the USA.

Heritage Review, by North Dakota Historical Society of Germans from Russia, Box 1671, Bismarck, N.D. 58501, features material about Germans from Bessarabia, Odessa and the Black Sea region.

Mennonite Family History, Box 171, Elverson, PA 19520-0071, is a quarterly (\$12.50 annually) devoted to Mennonite, Amish and Brethren genealogy and family histories.

German Genealogist, Augustan Society, Box P, (1510 Cravens Ave) Torrance, CA 90507-0210, costs \$15 for 4 issues and is for intermediate and advanced researchers.

The German Connection, Box 11293, San Diego, CA 92111 (\$10 a year) is packed with research tips and a good source to locate others researching the same families.



p. 117 LAND GRANTS FROM THE REPUBLIC AND STATE OF TEXAS

BOUNTY GRANTS were given for the actual months of service in the Army of the Republic of Texas. 320 acres were given for every 3 months of service.

DONATION GRANTS of 640 acres were given for special service during the Texas Revolution. Men who fought at any battle, such as the Siege of Bexar, Goliad, Alamo, San Jacinto were eligible, and other donations were given later to widows and surviving veterans.

HEADRIGHTS were given to the heads of families and single men who settled in the Republic of Texas.

FIRST CLASS grants were given to any man who arrived in the Republic prior to March 2, 1836. Married men received one league (4,423.4 acres) and one labor (177.1 acres) and single men received one third a league (1,476.1 acres).

SECOND CLASS grants were given to any man who arrived in the Republic of Texas after March 2, 1836 but prior to October 1, 1837. Married men received 1,280 acres and single men received 640 acres.

THIRD CLASS grants were given to any man who arrived in the Republic after October 1, 1837, but prior to January 1, 1880. Married men received 640 acres and single men received 320 acres.

FOURTH CLASS grants were given to men who arrived in the Republic after January 1, 1840 but prior to January 1, 1842. Married men received 640 acres and single men received 320 acres.

PRE-EMPTION GRANTS (Homestead of Settler's Claims) were granted to individuals who actually resided on a tract of no more than 320 acres for at least three consecutive years from January 22, 1845. Under an act of 1854, pre-emptors could locate no more than 160 acres. Under an act of 1870, married men could locate no more than 160 acres and single men no more than 80 acres. The last pre-emption was approved in 1899.

SCHOOL LANDS were sold to individuals under an act of 1874 and the proceeds went into the common school fund.

PATENTS cover most of these land grants. The patent is the final title issued by the Republic or State of Texas on a survey.

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
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
