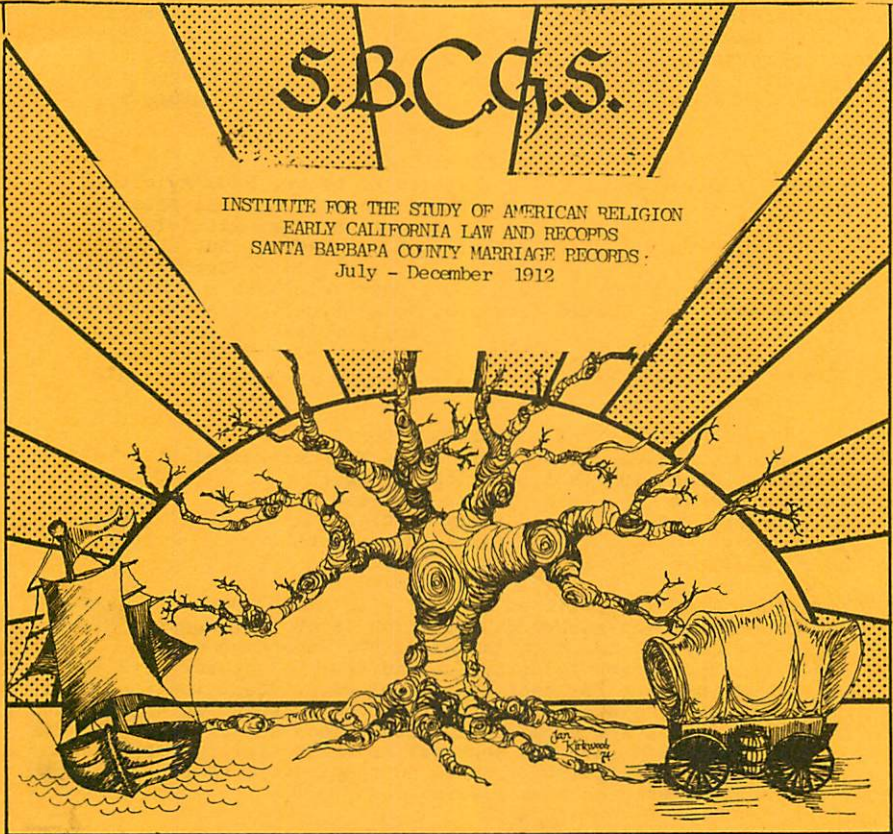

FROM THE PRESIDENT

A big THANKS to all who have contributed to make our Society the vital organization it is! Officers have given unstintingly of their time and effort, and many others have offered their help where needed. Thank you one and all!!

Our membership now stands at 195 - an increase of approximately 75 new members over previous years! And, there are still genealogists out there who haven't heard that the Santa Barbara County Genealogical Society is the place for action, information, inspiration, and -- (what else shall we provide?). Spread the word - bring a friend. Each new member enriches our organization.

One of the greatest assets we possess is our fine genealogical reference library. As our valuable collection grows, space continues to pose a problem. We would like to expand into the area of microfiche (as a space- and often cost-saving means), and in line with this, purchased a microfiche reader last year. In our current location, however, we have not been able to put it into operation due to constraints of space and the problem of secure storage.

We really need more spacious and permanent quarters for our valuable library and Society. Does anyone know of space that might be available for such use? At the moment, a time-sharing situation would parallel our current operation. However, should we be able to locate space for our exclusive use, we would then be able to expand the activities of our Society in more creative ways. More frequent library openings, small workshops, special interest groups are just a few of the directions in which we could expand.

Thoughts naturally turn to the Public Library, but this has been explored extensively in the past. The current director feels that they also have space problems and that genealogy is not an area in which they wish to expand.

Please give this some serious consideration. The advantage of our growing membership is the diversity of knowledge and contacts which it provides. Our Board of Directors has given this much thought, but has not yet come up with a suitable place. Can you help? Is there a commercial building with proper space (we could do some remodeling), a church (our time-share operation would fit their schedule), a non-profit organization from whom we could sublet? Perhaps you can think of other possibilities. Please contact any of the Board members or me (965-7423) with your ideas. We're really eager for suggestions!

INSTITUTE FOR THE STUDY OF AMERICAN RELIGION

(Note: In his October 26th seminar for our Society, Ronald Bremer alerted us to the presence of Dr. Gordon Melton in Santa Barbara. ANCESTORS WEST thought it prudent to contact Dr. Melton and obtain more information about the Institute which he directs.)

Dr. J. Gordon Melton has recently relocated his Institute for the Study of American Religion from Evanston, IL to UCSB. The Institute's 25,000 books and 12 file cabinets of additional material will be housed in Special Collections on the third floor of the University Library. The library staff will be cataloguing the collection according to the Library of Congress system. This will be a time-consuming task as approximately half the collection is what Dr. Melton refers to as "fugitive" material - i.e. privately printed publications for which a LC classification was not previously assigned.

Dr. Melton's work, the ENCYCLOPEDIA OF AMERICAN RELIGION, describes the many and varied religious groups as they have appeared in America. Two volumes, as well as a supplement to the first volumes, are now in print. The thrust of the collection, therefore, supports research of this nature. The Institute collects material concerning the history, doctrine, organization and statistics of religious groups in America.

For those of you interested in computers, Dr. Melton uses Wordstar on an IBM PC to produce his manuscripts (perhaps computerscripts would be more accurate). He forwarded copy for the recent supplement to his current publisher, Gale Research, by mailing them his floppy disks. Shortly, he will begin transmitting to them directly via phone modem. Gale is providing substantial support toward the research necessary for forthcoming publications.

Dr. Melton has graciously consented to answer brief, specific questions that might pertain to the Institute's collection (home 682-9317). If your ancestor belonged to an "odd" or obscure religious group, he may be able to direct you to information or historical accounts of that body. (In order that his work not be interrupted unnecessarily, please first check his two volumes + supplement of the ENCYCLOPEDIA OF AMERICAN RELIGIONS at the UCSB Library.) And, if you cannot find the proper reference in THE SOURCE (by Eakle & Cerny) or Bremer's COMPENDIUM OF HISTORICAL SOURCES, he will try to advise you concerning the location of archives for a specific religious body. Dr. Melton will undertake longer term projects for a reasonable hourly fee, if time permits.

We are pleased that Dr. Melton will speak at our January 11th meeting on "The Diversification of Religion in 19th Century America".

HALF AND HALF BOOK BUY PROGRAM

The book committee inaugurated a cooperative book-buying program at its last meeting. The program allows member contributions for specific books to be matched, up to fifty percent of the book's cost, from the book budget. Books of general interest will be given top priority, and ordinarily, no family genealogies or county-level titles will be considered. Approximately twenty per cent of the annual book budget will be set aside for the half and half program.

The committee will keep five titles on the program's acquisition list. When enough matching funds are donated to purchase a book, it will be removed and another title added. Donations are tax deductible. You may turn in specific requests to the book committee but please list the book's title, author, publisher, date, and price accurately in order to prevent confusion.

A MATTER OF SEMANTICS

Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary, 1977, G.&C. Merriam Co., (Springfield, MA) gives the following definition:

"secret society: any of various oath-bound societies often devoted to brotherhood, moral discipline, and mutual assistance."

ANCESTORS WEST printed a list of "secret societies" in an earlier issue which included, among others, the Masonic Order. MASONIC RECORDS MAY PROVE HELPFUL

In his October 26th Seminar at SBOGS Ronald Bremer several times mentioned Masonic records as a source of help in genealogical searches.

A case in point from your editor's own family:

In the Boston Herald of July 2, 1916 there appeared an article, with a reproduction of a 1796 certificate of membership issued by a Masonic lodge in Elgin, Scotland, to William Mann, signed by his father John Man, Sec'y.

In 1920 this led to correspondence between the editor's father, Samuel Eleazer Mann, then of Pelham, Hillsborough County, New Hampshire, a descendant of William Mann, and William Hamilton Gage Mann, a Civil Engineer, of Concord, New Hampshire, a descendant of James Mann, younger son of John Man(n) and his wife, Janet Laing, and comparison of family Bible records. Prior to 1860 descendants of James were resident in Orange County, Virginia. There probably are still members of the family living in Virginia. Also there may be descendants of James Douglass, a cousin of Janet Laing Mann, who was located in Columbia, S. C. in 1822. Hopefully, further information may be gleaned of this branch.

NEW BOOKS

SARAH CLAPP - LOVES CALL TO CHINA

DOROTHEA SMITH CORYELL, granddaughter, author-compiler, 8 1/2 x 11, double-spaced making for easy reading, 218 pp.

Sara's letters to her parents, the Rev. and Mrs. Luther Clapp of Wauwatosa, Wisconsin and an older sister, written during Sara's first 10 years in China (1879-1889) tell of travel to the mission at Kalgan, some distance from the capital city of Peking by houseboat, rickshaw, mule litter and sedan chair, a journey of 5 days; traveling by houseboat on China's Grand Canal to Tungchou, one of the largest mission stations of the American Board; there, some 12 miles from Peking; her first meeting with the Rev. Mr. Chauncey Goodrich, their guide in Tungchou; their engagement and marriage in May 1880 in Peking; some of his letters to the Wisconsin family; the birth of their son, Chauncey Ellsworth, during the 1885-1887 Sabbatical in the U. S. A.



SARAH CLAPP

Sara's vibrant personality greatly enhances these reports of life as Congregational teaching missionaries. A final chapter, "Harvest Years" tells of her later life in China. She died Nov. 2, 1923, and Chauncey two years later in Sept. 1925, at the age of 89. Copies of old photographs lend added interest. A final 38 pages is devoted to SARA REMEMBERED, as gleaned from oral and written reminiscences of son, L. Carrington Goodrich, Dean Lung Professor Emeritus of Chinese at Columbia University and author of *A Short History of the Chinese People* and editor of *A Dictionary of Ming Biographies*, daughter-in-law Ann Swann Goodrich, and daughter Grace Goodrich Smith, and several colleagues. One colleague, Rowland Cross, tells of Chauncey Goodrich's Chinese-English dictionary in the pocket of every missionary and of his taking up the fight for the use of the spoken language of the people in his Bible translations, rendering a service similar to that of Martin Luther when he put the Bible into the German language.

The author-compiler is the daughter of Sara's daughter, Grace and Ernest K. Smith, a professor of English at Tsing Hua College whom she married in 1914. The book will be available soon at a cost of \$17.50 and may be ordered from Dorothea Coryell, Theaburr Press, Box 662, Santa Barbara, CA 93102-0662.

A companion book, *THE SMALL MOUSE PERSON IN CHINA*, 218, IX pp. 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 also by Dorothea Smith Coryell, same address as above, \$10.00. Account of growing up in China, where she lived for 22 years, finally leaving in 1943 on the S. S. Gripsholm and repatriated in a U. S. civilian prisoner exchange with the Japanese. Tells of her love and marriage to Norman Hanwell, a political scientist, his early death in Oct. 1941; of joining the teaching staff of Yenching University in the Women's Physical Education Dept. as teacher of Modern Dance, studying Chinese martial arts—learning how to wield a spear, a sword and rapier and also the stylized walks and manners of Chinese opera, following the advice of Martha Hill, her Bennington College teacher and adviser not to try to impose Western culture on Chinese students but to build up a form of Chinese dance. Also of the years under the Japanese internment camp, and her later life in the U. S. A. and revisiting China.

EARLY CALIFORNIA LAW AND RECORDS

As population from the eastern states poured into California during the goldrush days of 1850, commercial and real property transactions were entered into under the common law of England as modified and administered in the United States and without regard to the unknown laws of the Republic of Mexico and the equally unknown customs and traditions of the Californians. The rule of law in California at the time of admission as a state was the civil law - of Spain and of Mexico. The first session of the state legislature in 1850 at San Jose was confronted with the problems of searching authorities in an unfamiliar language and an unfamiliar system of jurisprudence. It was necessary to examine the codes of Spain; the royal and vice-royal ordinances and decrees; the laws of the Imperial Congress of Mexico; the presidential regulations; decrees of dictators; and acts of pro-consular governors. Every frequently the legality of contracts entered into during the interregnum between the signing of the treaty and the passage of the statute adopting the common law was attacked on the ground that such transactions were inhibited by principles of the civil or Mexican law.

The legislature met the complicated legal situation by enactment on April 13, 1850, of a statute adopting the common law of England as the rule of decision in the courts of the state. This act was followed on April 22, 1850 by the passage of an act repealing all laws in force excepting those passed at that first session of the state legislature, saving, however, the rights of parties under former laws.

Section 22 of the present Civil Code, declares:

"The common law of England, so far as it is not repugnant to or inconsistent with the Constitution of the United States, or the Constitution or laws of this State, is the rule of decision in all the courts of this State."

To this day problems arise in construing the statute. What is meant by the term, "common law"? When is a common law rule so inconsistent with conditions within the State as to be inapplicable? An allied problem may be the meaning of "common-law marriage". Under the English and early Colonial system in America it was applied when a man and woman, without the benefit of a civil or religious ceremony, commenced living together and openly held themselves out to be "man and wife". Early in California state history, the legislature enacted statutes requiring a license to be issued and recorded with a report of the date of marriage by the officiant, civil or religious, performing the ceremony. Ages of consent were established, changed from time to time from 15 to 16 to 18 for females and up to 21 for males, then reduced to 18 on the recent change of majority (now expressed in Section 4101, Civil Code). Sec. 4102, Civil Code, provides for a verified application by a minor having no parent or no parent capable of consenting and the making of a court order consenting to issuance of a marriage license.

There also is a provision for "confidential marriage" (Sec. 4213, Civil Code) when an unmarried man and an unmarried woman, not minors, have been living together as husband and wife, eliminating the necessity of first obtaining health certificates. Requirements as to applications, filing, etc. are stated in considerable detail. Authorizations are valid for a period of 90 days only and are to be used only in the county where issued.

In the 12 Marriage Declarations (1884-1895) this situation is not disclosed - one show marriage on "high seas" in Santa Barbara Channel; another shows date of marriage "about 3 years ago" and the rest state the same date for marriage, affirmation and recording.

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THE GREAT REGISTERS : SOURCE OF CALIFORNIA BIOGRAPHY

The Orange County California Genealogical Society Quarterly, v.22,no. 3, September, 1985, contains an article titled as above, by Dianne L. Maccary, reprinted from SCAN, (So. Cal. Answering Network) Scannings, Nov/Dec 1979, pp.1-3, which should be of interest to those looking for information regarding California male citizens who registered to vote between 1867 and 1898. There are several copies of the Great Register in the Gledhill Library at Santa Barbara Historical Society Museum.

The Great Registers have their origin in the "Registry Act" of March 19, 1866, which required the county clerk to provide suitable books in which were to be recorded the names of all domiciled inhabitants of the county who were qualified electors and legal voters. The entries are set forth in separate columns showing the name of the person in full, his age, the country of his birth, his occupation and exact residence and, if a naturalized citizen, further details regarding naturalization. Another column provided for cancellation of the entry with the words "dead", "removed," "insane," or "infamous." In 1895 even fuller information was required: business or occupation, age, height, complexion, color of eyes and hair, location of visible marks or scars, place of residence (ward and precinct), time and place of naturalization if naturalized, date of entry, post office address, whether or not able to read the Constitution in the English language, to write his own name and whether or not prevented by any physical disability from marking his ballot. The Great Register was discontinued by an amendment to the Political Code approved April 19, 1909. The California State Library at Sacramento has the largest collection of the Registers. An incomplete record of county court house holdings is in the California Historical Survey Commission's Guide to the County Archives of California, Sacramento, 1919. The Los Angeles Public Library has a set of the LDS Salt Lake City microfilm of the California State Library's collection and its Genealogical Dept. indexes periodicals for their inclusion of the Registers.

SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

One of California's 27 original counties. While the county was actually created in 1850, the history of the area dates back to 1542. In that year Juan Cabrillo discovered the Santa Barbara Channel and later, according to legend crossed to San Miguel Island where he died and was buried. A second Spanish explorer, Sebastian Vizcaino, entered the channel on the Feast Day of Saint Barbara in 1602 and named the area accordingly. Fr. Junipero Serra founded the Santa Barbara mission in 1786. Santa Barbara Royal Presidio, established April 21, 1782, was the last of four royal presidios in Alta California - San Diego, Monterey, San Francisco and Santa Barbara. Santa Barbara had all three Spanish forms: Presidio representing the military; Pueblo, civil and Mission, religious. In 1873 Ventura County was established from the southern portion of the original Santa Barbara area.

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
