ROSARIO ANDREA CURLETTI, Descendant of Dons, Died 25 March, 1986.

The March 27, 1986 issue of the Santa Barbara News-Press, on Pages A-1, Columns 5 and 6, and A-5, Columns 1 and 2, carried an article by Jerry Rankin, News-Press Staff Writer, relating intriguing details of the inheritance, life, interests and activities of one who "was the end of an era and the end of her line." At age 72, Rosario Andrea Curletti, born 18 July, 1913, in Santa Barbara to the well-known architect, Jose Luis Curletti; descendant of a distinguished Italian family that also became prominent in Peru, and his wife, Elisa Elizalde, a descendant of the famed beauty Ramona Carrillo, wife of Romulado Pacheco and mother of the first native California governor under the flag of the United States - who later married John Wilson of Dundee, Scotland, the sea captain one encounters in Richard Henry Dana's "Two Years Before the Mast" - died in the same bed, in the same room, in the same house at 1715 Garden Street where she was born.

Rosario's most prominent public legacy is probably El Mercado - the festive food stalls manned by many organizations in De la Guerra Plaza each August during Fiesta and enjoyed by thousands, organized after World War II and which she served as La Madrina (Godmother). During Fiesta 1949 she wrote a column in the News-Press entitled "La Madrina", in which "she offered the community a daily lesson in basic Spanish" and she also shared early California recipes. In the 1950's she served as local correspondent for the Los Angeles Times and in the 1960s at Santa Barbara Mission she helped preserve Santa Barbara's written history and led a fund-raising drive that helped produce the modern library and archives there and served on the Mission Archives board. She was an early environmentalist and in 1974 was honored by the South Coast section of the Soil Conservation Society of America for "an acute interest in water quality, pollution control or prevention, proper land use, and the use of sewage effluent on farm land." She was one of the co-authors of "The Eye of the Flute," a definitive work on the Chumash Indians. She was also a dedicated volunteer, raising money for Hillside House, the haven for those with cerebral palsy, and helped with many projects of the Junior League, Museum of Art and the Botanic Garden and a supporter of the Santa Barbara Historical Society. In 1985 she was a member of the statewide Serra Bicentennial Commission.

As a member of SBOGS she acquired copies of all issues of "ANCESTORS WEST" and evidenced her interest by submitting corrections of misspelled names appearing in the County Recorder's index of Santa Barbara marriage records.

HEREDITARY SOCIETIES AND GENEALOGY

An article by Donald N. Moran, in the April, 1985 **THE SEARCHER**, Vol.
 XXII, No. 4, pp. 76-77, tells of a Southern California man who became
 interested in genealogy to fill the void left in his life by retire-
 ment. As a youngster he had been told by a late uncle (his mother's
 brother) that he had an ancestor who had served during the Revolution-
 ary War at Valley Forge and Yorktown. A cousin informed him that the
 uncle had been a member of the Sons of the American Revolution. Not
 only were copies of his original application, with cited proofs, made
 available but also 14 supplementals - proven lines to other ancestors
 who also served in the Revolution. Thus he obtained 7 generations
 of his mother's ancestors and from the supplementals 94 additional
 ancestors. The writer urges the leaving of "foot prints". A source
 citation to a manuscript and the Genealogical or Historical Society
 Library in which it is found, for example.

CHRONOLOGY OF LAND OWNERSHIP IN AMERICA

From Central Georgia Genealogical Society Quarterly, Vol.6, No. 5 Dec.1984,pp. 101-103, contributed by Mr. James T. Martin,109 Juniper Rd., Warner Robins, GA 31093 and extracted from the publication of the U. S. Dept. of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, entitled "Historical Highlights of Public Land Management, 1962.

- 1607 First permanent English colony in America founded at Jamestown,VA.
- 1618 Land tenure in Virginia based on head-right system, by which 50 acres of land granted to each person who paid either his own or someone else's transportation from England to America. Larger tracts could be purchased also from the Virginia Company of London. All tracts located indiscriminately, without system of land survey.
- 1620 First English colony founded in New England, at Plymouth, Mass.
- 1624 First Dutch colony founded in New Netherlands, at New York.
- 1630 Land grants to immigrants in New England made by General Courts. Settlers granted tracts of 10 to 100 acres. English officials voted themselves tracts of 1,000 to 9,000 acres.
- 1634 English colony founded in Maryland. Land tenure similar to head-right system of The Virginia Company of London.
- 1636 Settlers in New York granted land tracts up to 100 acres each. Extensive tracts awarded for importation of as many as 60 families of Dutch immigrants.
- 1662 Connecticut issued corporate charter. A year later, Rhode Island issued corporate charter. All land grants determined by New England Council.
- 1664. After creation of New Jersey, land tenure established according to the head-right system of The Virginia Company of London. After the English assumed control of New York, land tenure established similar to head-right system of Virginia.
- 1670 English colony founded in Carolinas, at Charleston. Land allotted similar to head-right system of Virginia, with each colonist granted 20 to 80 acres. Much larger tracts sold to affluent buyers. All tracts located indiscriminately,without system of land survey.
- 1676 Sale of lands first introduced in New Jersey.
- 1681 Pennsylvania founded as colony of England, by William Penn,adopted the head-right system of land allotment, with each colonist granted 50 acres of farmland.
- 1683 Sale of lands first introduced in Maryland.
- 1687 Sale of lands introduced in North Carolina.
- 1694 Sale of lands introduced in South Carolina.
- 1801 Sale of lands introduced in Virginia.
- 1713 First regular use of rectangular system of surveys in New England. Townships of 6 miles square, surveyed beyond settled frontier for future expansion.
- 1715 First State land grants to veterans of colonial wars by New England.
- 1732 Georgia founded as English colony. Granted 50 acre farms to each colonist and 500 acres of land to a settler with family of

CHRONOLOGY OF LAND OWNERSHIP IN AMERICA

- six or more.
- 1763 England acquired right to all lands east of Mississippi River as result of the Seven Years War, which cancelled all claims of individual colonies. Pioneers prohibited from entering region west of Alleghanies.
- 1764 Settlers moved to Vermont and New Hampshire, and later Maine. (Until 1821 Maine was a part of Massachusetts)
- 1770 First colonists from Virginia and North Carolina began illegal settlement of eastern Tennessee and Kentucky.
- 1774 First local land offices open western Virginia for direct sale of tracts of land to settlers in that region.
- 1775 Virginia promised land bounties of 100 acres for enlistment in the Continental Army.
- 1776 First act of Continental Congress pertaining to disposition of public lands. Act of August 14 offered deserters from British Army - both English and Hessians - 50 acres of public lands plus citizenship. Act of September 16 promised land bounties for military and naval services during the Revolutionary War. Land warrants, subsequently issued to veterans, were confined to a "military district" of 2,560,000 acres of public lands in the Northwest Territory.
- 1777 Continental Congress urged all States to seize and dispose of land owned by Loyalists and adherents to English King. All States had followed this advice by 1782, and were in the real estate business.
- 1780 New York ceded all western land claims to the new government. Virginia surrendered vast regions north of Ohio River in 1781. Massachusetts ceded all western claims in 1784. Connecticut followed in 1786, South Carolina in 1787, North Carolina in 1790, Georgia in 1802. All of these areas, collectively, constituted the public domain.
- 1785 Land Ordinance established rectangular system of cadastral surveys of public lands in Northwest Territory, north of Ohio River. Ordinance of May 20 reserved the Virginia Military Land District which could be used for location of military bounty lands.
- 1786 First Government survey of public lands began in east part of the Northwest Territory. Using rectangular system, region under survey included the "Seven Ranges" north of the Ohio River.
- 1800 Acts of May 10 authorized first Federal system of district land offices for transfer of surveyed public lands in Ohio Territory.
- 1801 Act of March 3 instituted first of many laws on pre-emption or preference rights of pioneers. Pre-emption favored squatters, and discriminated against land speculators and investors.
- 1801 Cumberland Road authorized for construction between Potomac and Ohio Rivers. Completed in 1818.
- 1807 Government first recognized and so confirmed to claimants, land titles originally granted or issued under foreign governments of Spain, France, Mexico and other countries.
- 1812 Act of April 25 established the General Land Office in Washington, D.C., as a bureau of Treasury Department. Act of May 6 established system of warrants or land bounties for military service during War of 1812 by veterans or heirs. Military land warrants could

- 1812 be located upon any of the public lands within a military district. Three new military districts, each about two million acres, reserved in Illinois, Arkansas and Missouri. Military warrants and land grants administered by the General Land Office.
- 1814 After War of 1812 settlers began major migration westward to occupy public lands subject to sale.
- 1842 Military land warrants could be located on any vacant, unreserved public lands subject to sale.
- 1845 Texas became a State, but retained title to all unoccupied lands. Thus Texas was not a public-land State.
- 1848 Mexico ceded a vast territory in the Southwest, providing the United States with additional 118 million acres of public lands to include present States of California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, and portions of New Mexico, Colorado and Wyoming.
- 1850 Oregon Donation Act granted as much as 320 acres to each single male, or 640 acres to a husband and wife, on condition of settlement for 4 years, in undeveloped parts of Oregon. Act later extended to include Washington. Act expired by limitation in 1855.
- 1850 Act of September 28 authorized land bounties of 160 acres to any veteran of Indian Wars, War of 1812, or Mexican War.
- 1862 Act of May 20, The Homestead Act, authorized unrestricted settlement on Public Lands to all settlers, requiring only residence, cultivation and some improvement of a tract of 160 acres. Any person was eligible who was head of a family or had reached the age of 21, who was a citizen or intended to become one, and who did not own as much as 160 acres. After living on the land and farming it for six months, he could buy the homestead for \$1.25 per acre. Act of July 1 granted lands for railroads and telegraph systems. Act of July 2, The Morrill or Land Grant Act, authorized granting of public lands to help establish and support State Vocational Schools.

GERMAN RESEARCH - From Cornsilk, Gen.Soc. of DeKalb Co.IL, Vol 4, No. 1

North Americans of German and Eastern European descent have a new and comprehensive way to search for their roots: The Museum for Hamburg History, which has opened Germany's first Historic Emigration Office, (HEO).

Nearly five million names have been stored on 274 microfilm files, which include the only complete German emigrant records from 1850 to 1914 known to exist. For more than two hundred years, Hamburg was one of Europe's major embarkation points for millions of migrants to the New World, though German emigration actually began from another port. On 6 October 1683, thirteen Mennonite families of Krefield, had sailed from Rotterdam, Holland, in search of religious freedom, landing near what is now Philadelphia, and founded Germantown, PA. They were followed by over 7 million immigrants over the years. Today, more than 60 million people can trace their roots to Germany, more than any other country. Copies of these films are available at the Library of Congress, and through the LDS libraries. (From Decatur GS Newsletter).

A TIMELY REMINDER Also from the Spring, 1985 issue of Cornsilk.

Prior to 1752, March was the 1st month, April the 2nd and so on, with December being the 10th, January the 11th, and February the 12th month. There was a loss of eleven days at the time of the calendar change from the Julian (Old Style) to the Gregorian (New Style) calendar. The day following 3 September 1752 became 14 September 1752.

Note: In many of the older dates found in Vital Records of Massachusetts to 1850 very early dates show the month by number not by name and care must be taken in working with such records. Quakers also used the number of the month - rather than the name - in their records.

CAUSE OF DEATH - MISSOURI STYLE Also from the Cornsilk

Causes of death listed on Missouri death certificates found by a researcher:

1. Died suddenly - nothing seriously wrong.
2. Worn out.
3. Went to bed feeling well - woke up dead.
4. Don't know - never been fatally ill before.
5. Don't know - died without the aid of a physician.
6. Blow on the head with an axe - Contributory cause another man's wife.

TRACKING IMMIGRANT ANCESTORS - Chapter 15, THE SOURCE

A Guidebook of American Genealogy, edited by Arlene Eakle and Johni Cerny, ISEN O - 916489-00-0, Ancestry Publishing Company, Salt Lake City, Utah, 1984

Pages 453-516 (Chapter 15, by Arlene H. Eakle,) should be consulted particularly by persons seeking to trace European ancestors. There are illustrations of Capital and small German letters used in Immigration lists, two 3-columned pages of German Genealogical words and abbreviations, Listings of many source records and papers and specialty genealogical periodicals and research aids. and from p.495 to 516, a Country-by-Country Summary of Aids, illustrated with U.S. maps showing settlement patterns of immigrants from many of these countries, and supported by bibliographies.

UNIQUE LAND RECORDS BEING MICROFILMED - From Orange County (CA) Gen. Society Quarterly vol 22, no. 3 Sept 1985, pp 107-108

On 18 April 1906 the fire that ravaged San Francisco also destroyed 1549 books of records kept in the County Recorder's office, more than 1400 volumes of mortgages, over 225 volumes of releases of mortgages, more than 65 volumes of homestead declarations, 95 volumes of notices of liens and many volumes of marriages, maps, pending action notices and other miscellaneous records. It was a loss rarely heard of in the accounts of the 1906 earthquake and resulting conflagration. It was a loss that had a devastating effect on the property owners of San Francisco. In some cases, a family's home may have survived the destruction, but proof of ownership of the property was destroyed instead.

To rectify this situation, the California Legislature approved on 16 June 1906 "An Act to Provide for the Establishment and Quieting of Title to Real Property in Case of the Loss or Destruction of Public Records.": The result was that San Francisco property owners could once more prove they had title to the property they claimed to own.

Basically, the procedure was for the alleged property owner (Plaintiff) to file a complaint in which he identified the property by lot number, block number and boundaries as well as how and when he acquired it. He next filed an affidavit identifying himself as the legal owner. The court then directed the publication of a summons which in effect called for any counter claims. If none were forthcoming and there were no other irregularities or complications, the court issued a final decree. The alleged property owner thus became the legal owner once more.

The procedure could be completed within days or perhaps months, but when complications arose it could be years. One case opened in 1908 was not concluded until the 1920s. Another opened in 1911 and was finally closed by a dismissal in 1955. On the average, a case was settled in one or two years. The original records were not actually restored, but the new records and legal documents that were created often dealt with and described the same information as contained in the originals. Creation of these court records was an obvious benefit to the property owners. It was also a lucrative source of information for genealogists and historians since the earthquake no longer need be considered as the proverbial stonewall which hindered pre-1906 records searching.

The collection consists of approximately 50,000 cases, known as judgment rolls, dealing with early California names, dated and places. The locality is limited to the City and County of San Francisco, but names and dates are myriad. A quick scan of these cases revealed

that the property owner's family was often listed, a spouse was identified even if deceased and heirs had to be named if the property owner died before the proceedings were completed. As in the case of other court and land records, when irregularities arose it always resulted in more documents and sometimes more genealogical information.

The records are familiarly known as the McEnerney Papers, after Mr. Garret W. McEnerney, a well known San Francisco attorney and friend of the mayor, Eugene E. Schmitz.^{1,2} The Act of 1906 also became known as the McEnerney act even though he was not a member of the Legislature that passed it. Apparently he was a strong force behind the drafting of the Act and a lobby for its passage.

Of major concern to a genealogist whenever he or she learns of a new record-source is its specific location and whether or not it is indexed. The McEnerney papers are indexed. There are 16 volumes in the San Francisco City Clerk's Office labeled "Index of Actions". The plaintiffs (property owners) are listed in alphabetical order therein. The answer to the specific location of the records involves some good news and some bad news. At the present time the judgment rolls are not available for inspection by the general public because they are being microfilmed and this is much welcomed good news. The Genealogical Society of Utah (Mormon Library) has also recognized the value of these McEnerney papers and early in 1984 a crew started the tedious task of microfilming. To date approximately 800 reels of film have been completed. There are between 55 and 60 judgment rolls per reel. The indexes will be filmed next and the project is expected to be completed in October of November, 1984. When the photo work is done the film will be carefully reviewed for clarity and to insure that the records have been thoroughly covered. Following this, the original records will be destroyed, but the information permanently preserved. Another obvious advantage is that the records will be available on interlibrary loan through the Mormon Library System and not restricted to only the San Francisco City Hall.

Many people are involved in this records filming and preservation project. It may be unfair to mention names, because some may be mistakenly omitted, but this author has been directly in contact with the following: Noel C. Barton, Dennis Galbraith, Bill Perry, Barbara Perry, Shawn Le Seuer and Elaine Le Seuer. These people and their efforts will be appreciated by genealogists and historians for many, many years to come.

SUGGESTIONS AND ITEMS TO CONSIDER IN WRITING YOUR PERSONAL HISTORY
 Seattle Genealogical Society Bulletin, Vol. 34, No. 1, pp.205-6,

1. Your birth: when, where, parents, surrounding circumstances and conditions.
2. Your childhood: health, diseases, accidents, playmates, trips, associations with your brothers and sisters, unusual happenings, visitors in your home, visits to grandparents, relatives you remember, religion in your home, financial condition of parents.
3. Your brothers and sisters: names, date of birth, place of birth, accomplishments, names of spouses, date and place of marriage, children.
4. Your school days: school attended, teachers, courses studied, special activities, associates, achievements, socials, report cards, humorous situations, who or what influenced you to take certain courses or do things you might not otherwise have done.
5. Your activities before, after and between school sessions; vacations, jobs, attendance at church, other church functions, scouting, sports, tasks at home, fun and funny situations.
6. Your courtship and marriage: meeting your spouse, special dates, how the question was popped, marriage plans, the wedding, parties and receptions, gifts, honeymoon, meeting your in-laws, what influenced you most in your choice of spouse.
7. Settling down to married life: your new home, starting housekeeping, bride's biscuits, spats and adjustments, a growing love, making ends meet, joys and sorrows, your mother-in-law, other in-laws.
8. Your vocation: training for your job, promotions, companies you worked for, salaries, associated, achievements, your own business.
9. Your children: names, dates and places of birth, health of mother before and after, how father fared, characteristics, habits, smart sayings and doings, growing up, accomplishments, schooling, marriage, vocations, sicknesses, accidents, operations.
10. Your civic and political activities: positions held, services rendered, clubs, fraternities and lodges you joined.
11. Your church activities: as a young person, through adolescence, churches attended, church positions, church associates, church certificates, answers to prayers, necessity and power of love.
12. Your avocations: sports, home hobbies, dramatic and musical activities, reading habits, genealogy, travels, favorite songs, movies, books, writers, poems, etc.
13. Special celebrations or holidays you remember: Easter, Christmas, national and local holidays, vacations.
14. Your plans and hopes for the future.
15. Your ancestors: your impressions of those you know personally; a general sketch of those you did not know; father, mother, grandparents, great grandparents, other relatives.
16. Your encouragement and counsel to your descendants: carrying on family traditions and activities; their obligations to their country, church and family; your suggestions to your progeny and others on honesty, humility, health, diligence, perseverance, thrift, loyalty, kindness, reverence, the Bible and other religious and edifying books; service to fellowman; your belief regarding God, etc.

Never underestimate the effect you may have on unborn generations in helping them through the trials and tribulations of life by the written word of advice you leave your children, grandchildren, etc. If you would like them to live upright, honest lives, give them the benefit of your experiences. Job, of the Old Testament, lamented the fact that his words were not written when he said, "Oh that my words were now written! Oh that they were printed in a book! That

they were graven with an iron pen and lead in the rock forever!" (Job, 19-23). But they were written, and he then gave his beautiful testimony of the Redeemer which has been used countless times as the text of sermons in both Jewish and Christian worlds. Your communications to your descendants must be written. They will also appreciate your life story as a precious treasure, and bless you all their days for it.

17. Hints on writing your life story: tell your story plainly and with directness; write truthfully of uplifting, refined and honorable occurrences and experiences. Humor helps to make for easier reading. If you can give the whys of your decisions and changes in activities, it may help others. Illustrate with as many pictures as possible. Make several copies, or better still, mimeograph (Xerox) or print and give one to each of your children and grandchildren. Place copies in local and national libraries and/or historical societies.

BOOK REVIEWS

GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH DIRECTORY, National and International, 1986, Guide to Genealogical Societies, by Keith a. Johnson and Malcolm R. Sainty, 784 pages. London, Paris, Stockholm, Stuttgart, Sydney, Toronto, Washington, and Wellington. Price \$15.00.

The first 27 pages include: Table of Contents" in English, French and German; concise "Introduction" of this 7th Directory citing 5,850 contributors, 20 countries, over 90,000 entries and thanks to agents who assisted with promotion, mail, and various problems and issues; very adequate directions for "Contacting Contributors" and complete instructions for participation in "1987 & Future Directories"; "Editorial Notes" include further explanations and acknowledgments; 6 pages of helpful information for "When You Travel to Germany"; "Calendar of Genealogical Events 1986-1988"; "Abbreviations - International"; "The Chapman County Codes"; and an "Explanation" of the arrangement of surname listings.

Also included is a complete index and "Directory of Genealogical Societies" throughout the world. The final 17 pages list advertisements for publishing companies and research services.

This is an excellent reference for any library. Many contributors are from foreign countries and will require International Reply Coupons with your self-addressed envelope. There is a minor problem with alphabetizing of the Irish-Scottish Mc and Mac surnames (the "c" and "ac" are ignored). However, an example of the alpha system is included on each page of this section.

BOOK REVIEWS

The Wuerttemberg Emigration Index. Volume I by Trudy Schenk, Ruth Froelke, and Inge Bork, 1986, (\$15.95), Ancestry, Inc., P.O. Box 476, Salt Lake City, UT 84110, 230 p.

Researchers with German ancestry will welcome this new series which lists persons filing emigration applications through the city of Wuerttemberg. Of the 60,000 applications to be covered by this series, 11,500 names of individuals and families appear in Volume I. Vital information such as date and place of birth, residence at time of application and reference to the original source is included. The time period covered is late eighteenth century to 1900. This helpful new book lists emigrants bound not only for North America, but for various other points - Australia, South America and Russia for instance. (Some became disenchanted with life on the Russian steppes and resettled again to America. Check this source for your German/Russian connection!)

In the original form, these handwritten records were not alphabetized nor were the pages numbered, proving a most difficult source to research. We are indebted to the authors for providing this very useful finding aid to an important record group for the family historian.

Summer Soldiers: A Survey & Index of Revolutionary War Courts-Martial by James C. Neagles, 1986, (\$16.95), Ancestry, Inc., P.O. Box 476, Salt Lake City, UT 84110, 293 p.

If you've exhausted the familiar sources, try this! James Neagles has done the work for us in abstracting from 168 sets of orderly books, the account of 3,315 courts-martial during the Revolutionary War. (Reference is given to the original source for more comprehensive details.) Not all entries pertain to those found guilty. Acquittals and even a few commendations are also included. So, take your chances and have a look! This may be just the color needed to paint your family history.

Polk County, Arkansas: 1860 Census by Georgia D. Helderlein, 1986, (\$12.00, post paid), 22118 Trotter Road, Grass Valley, CA 95949, 92 p.

Polk County is one of those 'hard to research' areas where civil records were destroyed during the Civil War and again in 1883. In this compilation of the 1860 Census, Ms. Helderlein provides a much-needed aid for the genealogist and historian. Entries are given by household, in order of listing, and include such information as age, sex, color, occupation, value of real and personal estate and state of birth. An everyname index appears at the end of the book.

Another work by the same author is Polk County, Arkansas: 1870 Census (\$11.00, post paid), 72 p.

NOTE: Some 1913 marriage records remain to be transcribed. There is only one viewer available at the County Recorder's office and since someone else wished to check records Doris Crawford was unable to complete the 1913 records. 11 November 1913 is the latest date included above.

Comment is requested as to the number of pages members wish to have devoted in ANCESTORS WEST to these transcriptions. Beginning with 1913 the number of marriages in Santa Barbara County greatly increased.

VOLUNTEERS for transcribing these records from the microfilms at the County Recorder's Office are also needed. Presently preferable hours are 10:30 to noon on Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays.

The Santa Barbara County Recorder's Office has marriage records to 1923 - all now on microfilm - lists of which have never been printed. The importance of continuing this feature of ANCESTORS WEST is emphasized by the recent loss of valuable references in the burning of the Los Angeles Central Public Library.

SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

One of California's 27 original counties. While the county was actually created in 1850, the history of the area dates back to 1542. In that year Juan Cabrillo discovered the Santa Barbara Channel and later, according to legend crossed to San Miguel Island, where he died and was buried. A second Spanish explorer, Sebastian Vizcaino, entered the channel on the Feast Day of Saint Barbara in 1602 and named the area accordingly. Fr. Junipero Serra founded the Santa Barbara mission in 1786. Santa Barbara Royal Presidio, established April 21, 1782, was the last of four royal presidios in Alta California - San Diego, Monterey, San Francisco and Santa Barbara. Santa Barbara had all three Spanish forms: Presidio representing the military; Pueblo, civil and Mission, religious.

In 1873 Ventura County was established from the southern portion of the original Santa Barbara area.
