I called my cousin Nelly in San Francisco, to arrange visit and interview with my Uncle Tom, the patriarch of the Chinese side of my family.

Also, through the second cousin I had found through the Internet, I was able to find my father's surviving cousin living in Tiburon. So I plotted a four day trip to the Bay Area, to see Uncle Tom, Cousin EmmaGail, and stop by the National Archives in San Bruno.

My interview with Tom went well, he said that the affidavits swearing that my grandfather was born in the U.S. were part of a scam. In my subsequent digging in the files at the Archives it appears that my grandfather, Hom Gin, was involved with my grandmother's father-in-law, Hom Hoy. I was able to find business records based on

And though Tong societies were not present before the 1930's according to Tom, he said that Hom Hoy was definitely well connected in the Chinese communities in the Bay Area.

I haven't been able to puzzle out the many deceptions and the thin paper trail left by these men, but I have my theories. I will keep brooding over them.

To change the subject, many thanks to Maner L. Thorpe for sending in his Ahnentafel. It is extensive—twenty generations! You will be awed by this document and the research it represents.

I hope you're having a good summer. Take the time to clean up your files and send in articles, or tips that you find interesting.

Mr. Sperry has given us an extensive and scholarly guidebook to the historic and genealogical repositories of Ohio.

Holdings of the major Ohio libraries and archives are described as well as other resources from probate and land records, church records and military records to tax records and township records.

The coverage is so extensive that included is a 100-page bibliography of Ohio books and periodicals. Maps are provided as well as a full index. Records and indices are available on publications of genealogical and historical organizations. Endnotes are given.

This is a "how to" booklet on how to get started in genealogical research. It presents seven basic steps in tracing your family tree. These are well written and direct the beginner on the path of collecting information.

It does not cover research in other countries nor does it get to the ultimate problem of what to do with all those pieces of paper now that the file cabinet is full.

The final pages are a brief catalog of the products available from the publisher. Many of these items would be helpful and supportive to an insecure and overwhelmed beginning genealogist.

Rule of 8870

Using the 8870 Formula to ascertain a birth date can be a tremendous help to the genealogist when checking tombstone dates.

If a tombstone records that a person died 6 May 1889 and was 71 years, 7 months, and 9 days old, but no date of birth is listed, in order to correctly arrive at their birth date, one only has to use the 8870 Formula to quickly get the date of birth rather than taking time to count backwards.

Researching Slave Ancestry

It is often quite difficult to trace the ancestry of slaves through the 1800's. The 1870 census was the first to list slaves by name and many "free persons of color" were not even listed. But in this census they noted the name, age, sex, color, place of birth and occupation of all Americans.

According to David H. Streets, in his book *Slave Genealogy. A research Guide with Case Studies* (Heritage Books, Inc. 1986), "There are many individuals grouped together in a single household unit who were not related. This is particularly true of households comprising former slaves." For social and economic reasons, former slaves and free blacks were classed together.

Often the data recorded in the censuses was only as reliable as the knowledge of the census taker and since little significance was attached to a slave's actual birth date, the ages stated can be quite incorrect. This applies to the color as well. Often they are listed on one census as white, the next as mulatto, and the next as black.

One of the most valuable sources, ironically, is provided by the slave owner himself in his Last Will and Testament. Since slaves were considered as property, they are often mentioned in the probate records when the owner's will is filed. If a slave were sold, there might be recorded a Bill of Sale in the County Deed Books. A review of the County Tax Records may also reveal information if the slave became a person with economic value. Church records offer recorded marriages and births, along with family relationships.

Diligent research may open up new avenues for the stalwart seeker. "Seek and Ye Shall Find."

Genetic Proof Of Ancestry

Stanford University researchers have found a mutation of the Y chromosome that exists only in the Indians of North and South America and Eskimo groups.

The eyes of American Indians and Blacks carry a melanin pigmentation particular to their ethnic group which an optometrist can identify on the retina of the eyes.

One's dentist can tell whether or not one has a "Carrabelli cusp" on their maxillary first molars. This is present on persons of strictly western European origin, but missing on Asians or American Indians. (What about those of us of mixed races?—Ed.)

Gunboat Lost in 1776 Found on Lake Floor

Vermont—A Revolutionary War wooden gunboat that was part of the 15-vessel fleet commanded by Benedict Arnold (before he turned traitor) has been found largely intact at the bottom of Lake Champlain.

The 54-foot vessel, which was either abandoned or scuttled by retreating American forces after they lost the October 1776 Battle of Valcour Island to the British, is astonishingly well preserved after 220 years in the cold, deep water, according to its discoverers, a team from the Lake Champlain Maritime Museum.

No decision has been made on whether to raise the boat, whose name is not yet known.

Ship Listings

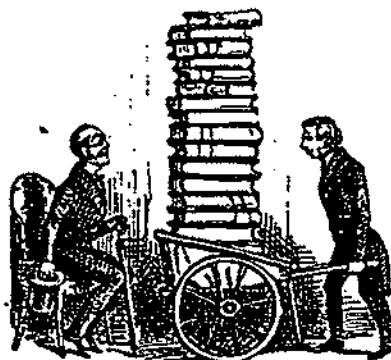
If your immigrant ancestor came into New York between 1847 and 1897, and is not included in a series such as *Germans to America*, the search for the correct list can be frustrating. The arrival lists themselves are intact, but they have not yet been indexed for this period.

In a recent column, Myra Gormley reviewed ways to get around this large gap. The Morton Allan Directory, which covers the years 1890 - 1930, gives the dates of arrival for various ships according to year and shipping line. National Archives microfilm series M 1066 is another listing of ships entering New York from foreign ports, covering the years 1789- 1919.

If you do not know the name of the ship or the shipping line, but do know the approximate year of arrival from the 1900 - 1920 census returns, you can still narrow the focus. It will help if you know the port(s) your ancestor might have sailed from. If you do not know this, eliminate all ships sailing from ports that you do know your ancestor would not have used. Still, the search will entail a tedious checking through several rolls of film. Naturalization records, if you can find them, may include the date and port of arrival.

If you are hunting for passenger lists, do check the chart on pages 48-59 of *Guide to Genealogical Research in the National Archives* to get a better picture of what exists to help you.

Mistake about 'OSB' and 'osp'

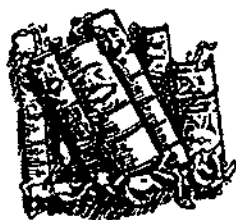
In a recent letter (April 1997) to the editor, Dennis Ebblewhite, of the Cleveland Family History Library, South Durham & North Yorkshire, England, *Ancestors West* was unmasked for perpetuating misinformation. In the Fall 1994 issue, (I still see the same information in other journals) an article was reproduced from another journal listing tombstone translations. It was wrong on one count. The article said, "If you find 'O.S.B.' or 'Orbin Sine Priol' on your ancestor's tombstone, you have a real problem as it is Latin for 'died without issue.'"

The Rev. Brendan Hodgson of Bushey, Hertsforshire, sent a clarification to Mr. Ebblewhite. He states:

OSB stands for "Ordinis Sancti Benedicti," (or the Order of Saint Benedict). "OSB" has nothing to do with offspring. The letters "osp" (lower case) stand for "obiit sine prole" (NOT "Orbin Sine Proie") and they mean: Obiit = died; obit= death (hence our 'obituary'); sine = without; and prole = issue, children. In many pedigrees, this often appears as 'sp' against a person's name. I can find no words in my Latin dictionary equivalent to "Orbin" or "Proie...."

The Benedictine Order was founded circa 540 AD and there must be hundreds of grave-stones worldwide bearing the letters "O.S.B." For the most part, we hope and expect them to have died without issue (osp) as it has never been customary for monks of the Order of St. Benedict to marry and raise families!

In short, "OSB" and "osp" have nothing in common and must not be taken to mean the same thing. They are quite different. The quoted text says "if you find OSB or Orbin Sine Proie (i.e. 'osp') on your ancestor's tombstone, you have a real problem as it is Latin for 'died without issue.' Simply, "Orbin Sine Proie" isn't Latin, and even corrected to "obiit sine prole" it is not the same as OSB!

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The Census/St. Catherine's Move



In early November it was announced that the new premises for the Office of National Statistics and the PRO Census Rooms are to be at Myddleton Place, Myddleton Road (off Rosebery Avenue) Islington EC 1.

The given date of opening the new facility, after the program of refurbishment, was April 1, 1997. (Don't know if this has been the case.--Ed.) The new location, which will be known as the Family Records Centre, is a few minutes walk from the Angel tube-station (buses 19, 38, 171, 196, 259, 279 ply nearby). It is also close to the Greater London Record Office and the Society of Genealogists. Open Monday-Saturday with the possibility of being open late on Tuesday and Thursday (to 7.30pm).

Records held there will include the 1841-91 censuses for England and Wales, the pre-1858 PCC wills, the Birth, Death and Marriage indexes for England and Wales and the electoral registers for the UK for the preceding year.

The Scottish BDM indexes will also be available at Myddleton Place via computer link; however consulting these will cost money in London as it does in Edinburgh.

The basement will contain refreshment rooms, cloakrooms, lockers, bookshop and facilities for disabled readers.

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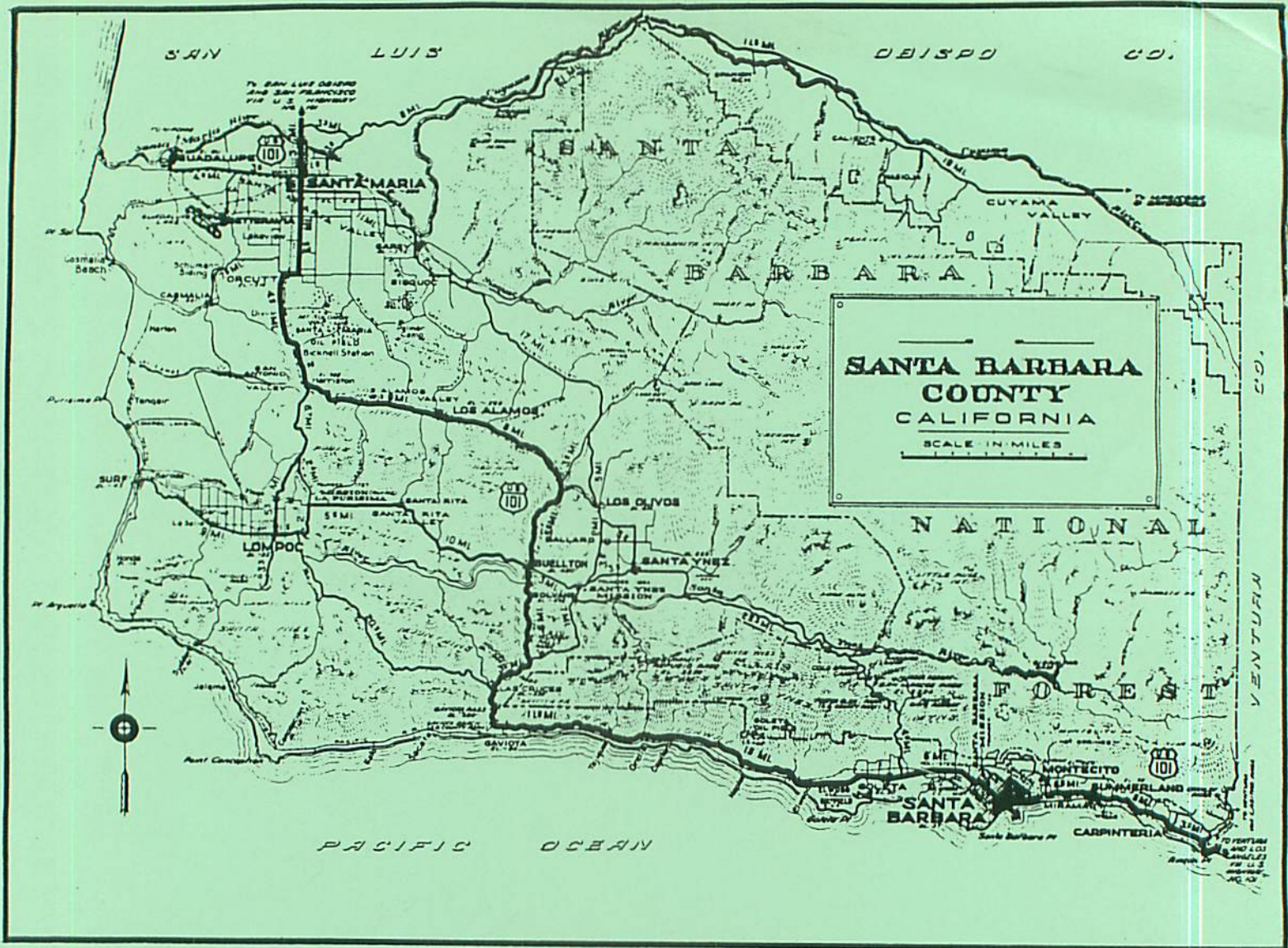

Santa Barbara County

One of California's 27 original counties. While the county was actually created in 1850, the written history of the area dates back to 1542. In that year Juan Cabrillo discovered the Santa Barbara Channel and later, according to legend, crossed to San Miguel Island where he died and was buried. A second Spanish explorer, Sebastian Vizcaino, entered the channel on the Feast Day of Saint Barbara in 1602, and named the area accordingly. Fr. Fermin Francisco de Lasuen founded the Santa Barbara mission in 1786. Santa Barbara Royal Presidio, established April 21, 1782, by Fr. Junipero Serra, was the last of four royal presidios in Alta California: Santa Barbara, San Diego, Monterey, and San Francisco. Santa Barbara had all three Spanish forms of administration - Presidio representing the military, Pueblo the civil, and Mission the religious. In 1873, Ventura County was established from the southern portion of the original Santa Barbara area.

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
