

### **About the Program:**

Ahoy mateys! Were yer ancestors land lubbers or did they be pirates? Even if your ancestors weren't pirates, their lives would have been affected by Atlantic piracy. This presentation covers the history of piracy in North America and how it affected trade from Halifax to Spanish Main. This presentation also looks at the types of records that exist because of piracy.



I got my start in family history at age 10 when my father took me to the grave of my great-grandfather; that sparked a lifetime of interest in family history. I have spent the last 25 years researching my own family history and helping others make history a part of their sto-



### Recognizing Our Volunteers: Pat Park



This month, SBCGS recognizes and thanks **Pat Park**. Pat is a longtime member, having joined the Society in 1995. In addition to being a Library Volunteer, she is a mentor for England. Thank you, Pat, for sharing your most interesting story.

"'I was born in December 1940 during WWII & lived in the tiny village of Iver, Buckinghamshire,

England. I don't remember much about the war, as it never bothered us little kids. I clearly remember one night when I was 4. Noises kept me awake so my mother took me outside, and to my astonishment there were all the neighbors! Bedside lamps were all shining outside the windows. Everyone was dancing and singing! Mum & I were pulled into a circle and soon we were dancing and singing "Knees Up Mother Brown." I danced and sang along with them. Years later I found out that was VE day. The war had ended!!!

We lived in England until I was almost 12, then emigrated to Montreal, Canada to the small town of St. Eustache-Sur-Le-Lac. I attended high school there, but being very shy, with an English accent, I was the subject of much teasing. So at age 16, I quit school & got a job at Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada in Montreal. I met my husband, Howard Park there, and we emigrated to the US, Los Angeles, on our wedding day in 1962.

Our children, Christine & Michael were born in Santa Barbara, and Howard & I divorced in 1979. I worked at several insurance companies and agencies in LA and Santa Barbara, finally retiring in 2009. That didn't last!! I was offered a part time job at Mike Kelly Insurance Agency in SB in 2012, but in 2013 the agency was sold to Alarm Insurance Agency in Charleston, SC. I thought that was the end of my career, but the new agency sent a company computer to me, so I now work from home (from "Charleston") handling insurance for alarm installation contractors all over the country..... I love it!!

I became interested in genealogy in 1996, when my friend, Muriel Graham was studying her family history chart during a break at work. I was intrigued!! She took me to Jan Cloud's class at the SB Library. I joined the society, and I've been hooked ever since. I've made several trips to England, Canada, and Ireland locating new relatives (& filming them talking), finding graves, and going through original documents at record offices. I've traced my family back to the mid to late 1700's in England, but any farther back than that really can't be proved with any accuracy. I'm now enjoying writing about my life and those of my parent's & grand-parent's, and editing the films.

I currently live in Santa Maria, and belong to the Insurance Professionals of Santa Barbara, as Secretary, and I volunteer one morning a month at the Sahyun Library. Besides my two children, I have 5 grandchildren, and 3 great grandchildren, with 2 more expected this summer." *Pat Park*


