# "An Introduction to Forensic Genetic Genealogy" Speaker: Dr. Penny Walters SBCGS General Meeting Saturday, April 15, 2023, 9:30 - 12 Noon



Investigative genetic genealogy is the emerging practice of using genetic information from direct-to-consumer DNA test results for identifying potential suspects or victims in criminal cases. The resultant method of super-sleuthing familial relationships and then apprehending a potential suspect seems to divide the genealogy community. How can we take advantage of new technologies while maintaining an ethical approach?

#### **About the Speaker:**

**Dr. Penny Walters** has been a University lecturer for 35 years, currently teaching Masters Business studies at Bath Spa

University, England; and previously undergraduate Psychology and Ethics. Penny's interest in genealogy started after having her first baby and then wondering about her biological parents, as she was adopted. Penny has six mixed-race children, who have all enjoyed discovering their roots through DNA ethnicity results. Penny lectures internationally in person, including throughout America, Australia, and Ireland. Penny is sought after for a wide range of conference and webinar topics. #### President's Message Ted Tazer-Myers

Sunshine has returned to our beloved Santa Barbara county and the blooms are going to be incredible this spring after all that wonderful rain! Besides getting a bit soggy at times this past month during my daily constitutional with my wife, I have also continued to guzzle from the firehose of all the important activities that our Society is engaged in.

The following are just some of the things I've learned that I would like to share with you:

#### **Membership**

Like other nonprofit organizations, our Society's membership dropped during the COVID-19 pandemic. However, thanks to the enthusiastic and skillful work of the Membership Committee, Education and Programs, and Communications Team members, we have steadily grown in membership to the point where we are 484 strong as of March 1, 2023. These figures can be broken out at the following membership levels: 57 Lifetime members, 12 Patrons, 29 Donors, 38 Friends, 116 Family Members (58 families), and 232 Individual members. Kudos to the leadership of Kate Lima, Elizabeth Swanay-O'Neill, Holly Snyder, Diane Sylvester, Kristin Ingalls, and Liz Smith for putting together such excellent publications, educational events, speaking engagements and supportive services for our new and continuing members. It takes a village to raise a genealogist!

#### **Technology Team**

As everyone knows, we live in an increasingly digital world—and sometimes that world can be both amazing and frustrating at the same time! Thankfully, we have a talented corps of tech-savvy volunteers who love to work on our computers, peripherals, and website. Molly Gleason, who was only recently appointed as our IT Committee chair, has gathered an outstanding team of IT professionals with great ideas for improving our technology capabilities to better serve the membership. One of those folks is Rosa Avolio, who has taken the baton from Dorothy Oksner as webmaster and continues to make our new website better than ever. I want to give a huge thank you on behalf of the Society to all of the people who have worked on the website over the last several years, especially Milt Hess, Robin McCarthy, Rosa and Dorothy. The Website 2.0 Development Steering Committee will meet one last time to wrap up the project. In the meantime, please continue to send your feedback about how the website looks and functions (or you would like to ideally function) to webmaster@sbgen.org.

#### **Property**

The Property Committee, led by Fred Marsh, has a lot of important responsibilities in its portfolio: landscape, building maintenance, property management, and capital improvements, among other things. Recently, security has been added to the list. We have had an incursion of homeless encampments on the Society's campus, though the vast majority have been located on the periphery. Al-

most a dozen camps have been removed in the past several weeks at some expense to our Society. The Santa Barbara police have responded to our calls, but none of the trespassers has yet been apprehended. We are actively partnering with the City's Homeless Outreach team (part of the Community Development Department). The Property Committee consulted with a security professional and, as a result of his recommendations, has embarked on a series of prioritized actions. Please be advised that there does not appear to be any threat to the safety of our members, which is our top concern. In addition, no material damage has been observed to the Library and other buildings on campus. However, trespassing and homeless encampments can escalate to more serious problems, so we are doing our best to "nip this in the bud." We will keep you apprised of our progress in future issues of Tree Tips.

- · Point of origin.
- Destination point.
- Date of move.
- Possible, probable, or known reason for moving.
- Distance travelled.
- Citation.

# All About Our Books at the Sahyun by Chris Klukkert



I am all about books. So that is why I was delighted to help a library patron last week pull some Butte County, California books off our shelves for her research. She said to me that although you can find the book on-line, there is "nothing like the feel of a real book in one's hand," and she was busy taking her notes before making a copy of the pages she found of relevance.

In Tuesday's Lunch and Learn, Rosa Avolio had pulled a book from our shelves that had been talked about as a book club selection for the Virtual Genealogical Association. It was *Discover Your Ancestors Using Land Records*.

Coroner's Inquests, Medical Certificates, Livestock Brand Registrations, Supported Aged Persons, Sheriff Arrest Records, Squirrel Liens, and numerous marriage records were among the 26,857 entries that were added to the database.

We would especially like to thank Alice Hoyt Veen, CG of Prairie Roots Research (https://prairierootsresearch.com) for helping us to correctly cite the sources used in our database records. Some of her webinars can be seen on Legacy Family Tree Webinars.
