The Society kicked off October with our annual Open House on the 1st. Almost seventy people attended the festive and welcoming event. The Outreach Committee did a terrific job collaborating with our partners like Daughters of the American Revolution, War of 1812, and Sons of Union Veterans, Daughters of Union Veterans, FamilySearch Center of

Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo Genealogical Social, Santa Maria History Society, Chinese Historical Society, Los Californianos, NikkeiGen, and Santa Barbara Trust for Historic Preservation, among others. Our very own DNA Special Interest Group had a table. Thank you to all the volunteers who greeted visitors and worked so hard behind the scenes to make this event such a success!

Upcoming Events and Classes

Family History Month events continue full steam ahead with many interesting workshops given by our very own skilled and knowledgeable presenters, including Genealogy Jump Start at the Sahyun Library on October 7th and the Seminar, as the high point of the Education and Program year will be held all day on October 14th at St. Raphael's Church in Santa Barbara. Gena Philibert-Ortega will be our keynote speaker—and she is excellent! Due to the all-hands-on-deck effort that the Seminar requires, the Board decided to cancel to the October General Meeting. We will reconvene in November.

Board News

The Board made a number of policy decisions at the September meeting. The first was to approve a revised Library Facilities Use Agreement and Fee Schedule. The rate for outside groups with up to ten attendees went up to \$35; the rate for groups with eleven to thirty-five increased to \$50. Both rates are still well below market rate and designed to encourage our valued partners to use our wonderful Library.

The Board also approved a motion from the Property Committee to terminate our relationship with Spectrum Realty and enter into a new contract with William Noack for to manage our rental units. The rentals are expected to gross over \$85,000, which is helps fund the high-quality programs and services that our Society provides its members.

The President and Secretary Mary Jacob, upon review and approval of Karen Ramsdell as Chair of the Governance Committee, proposed a new standing rule for the Secretary to post the most recent approved Board of Directors' meeting minutes on the member's only welcome page of the SBCGS website. The Board encourages anyone who is interested in being "in the know" to check them out!

Finally, the Board will be appointing a Nominating Committee on October 19th. The Committee will be looking for a few good women and men to play leading roles in our Society! Please consider if you or someone else you know would like to ensure our organization remains the leading hub for conducting family research in our County.

New Resources Added to SBCGS Website by Robin McCarthy

Last month SB City Returns of Death and burial permits from the SB County and Calvary Cemetery were added to the database. Returns of Death are similar to death certificates. They are handwritten forms submitted by the attending physician, or informant, to the City of Santa Barbara for recording the death. The returns were loaned by the Santa Barbara County Recorder's Office in the Courthouse to the SBCGS for digitizing by the Records Preservation Team headed by Dorothy Oksner and Helen Rydell.

This month we honor the cultures and contributions of both Hispanic and Latino Americans.


Hispanic generally refers to a person who is from, or a descendant of someone who is from, a Spanish-speaking country.


Latino, *Latina*, *Latine*, *or Latinx*, generally refers to a person who is from, or a descendant of someone who is from, a country in Latin America.

Gena Philibert-Ortega is an author, researcher, and instructor specializing in the use of social history and material culture to tell the story of historical women's lives. She holds two Master's degrees: Interdisciplinary Studies (Psychology and Women's Studies) and Religion. As an author, Gena has published two books, *Cemeteries of the Eastern Sierra* (Arcadia Publishing) and *From the Family Kitchen* (F+W Media), and hundreds of articles in print magazines and online publications. Her writings can also be found on her two blogs, *Gena's Genealogy* and *Food.Family.Ephemera*, as well as the GenealogyBank and Legacy Family Tree Webinars blogs. A highly sought-after instructor, Gena has taught material culture and social history at the Genealogical Research Institute of Pittsburgh and the Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy and is a frequent presenter throughout the United States and Canada. Gena has conducted research for PBS, HGTV, and the Travel Channel and has collaborated on research for the Gemological Institute of America. Gena's current research projects focus on American cemeteries, cookbooks, signature quilts, and 20th-century women's lives.


