

President's Message Edward Tazer-Myers

Happy December! 'Tis the season for eating, giving (and receiving), and being with family. Speaking of giving and receiving, the Society counts on your generous tax-deductible contributions to help people knit their ancestral families together and discover what their lives were like in the misty past.

SBCGS is the place to get the help you need to fill in the missing pieces in your extended family puzzle. And it is a happy place. Visitors often tell us how good they feel when they come to the library and hear the happy voices and the joy of people making new discoveries. We will have new opportunities for learning and growing together in 2024, too, such as webinars and small study groups.

But we can't do it without your generous support. Roughly, membership fees only cover a quarter of our operating expenses (25%). The biggest contributor (38%) comes from our rental property income, with unrestricted donations (25%) and fees, sales, and restricted donations making up the remainder (12%). All of these revenue sources provide essential funding for the services that you like best when you come to the Sahyun Library, including the ones I already mentioned above plus the following online subscription sites:

But it is those unrestricted donations that really keep us going. This is where the Annual Appeal fits in. The Society is able to keep membership fees down because of our creative development of other revenue sources, but the Annual Appeal is the big once-peryear ask to help fill in the operating gaps. 

Focus on Volunteer Holly Snyder

In this publication we are moving from "Committee Spotlight" to "Volunteer Spotlight." Each month we'll highlight one of our volunteers; you'll get to learn more about these wonderful people.

This month, SBCGS recognizes and thanks Holly Snyder, a member since 2016. Holly serves as a Library Volunteer, but most of you know her as the Outreach Director. I've had the privilege of working closely with Holly on many SBCGS exhibits like the African American Exhibit and the Asian American Pacific Islander Exhibit. She is an organized and fun leader and I'm pleased to showcase her here.

Holly is from Santa Barbara, but has lived all over California for school and employment. Currently, she is an archival processor at UCSB Library's Special Research Collections. Holly processes donated and purchased collections and creates finding aids to make them accessible to the public. Anyone can create a free Special Research Collections account and request to view their collections. There are some real gems there!

Prior to working at UCSB, she was a Family Literacy Librarian at the Santa Barbara Public Library. Holly was also an elementary school teacher in different capacities for 15 years, with the last three being an elementary art

teacher within the Santa Barbara Unified School District.

Holly has been doing genealogical research for over 20 years. Her interest in researching family history began when her maternal grandmother passed away and her mother began to research her family. Holly did not know anything about her father's side of the family so she saw the opportunity to begin her genealogical journey. She started with her dad's birth certificate and baby book and now has a vast amount of knowledge of her dad's lineage. She met new-found cousins, gained many old photographs, plus she now has copies of bible pages of her paternal great-great grandmother's family. Holly has also gone on many genealogical trips with her mother including a journey across the pond visiting the hometowns of their German and Swiss ancestors in 2018. Although there is a lot of planning ahead that is involved for these trips, she loves the serendipitous moments that come along that make the journeys more special—and experiencing these moments with her mother makes it even more special.

Currently, Holly volunteers for the Society as the Outreach Committee Chair and library volunteer. Although challenging while working full-time, she loves to work on the local ethnic and cultural exhibits, planning events for the public, and meeting community members, making new friends, and sharing how great our Society is. Holly appreciates her Outreach team and exhibit committees and all the hard work they put in- all as volunteers! As a library volunteer, she enjoys listening to patrons' stories and assisting them with their research and hard-to-find records.

Outside of genealogy and work, Holly also enjoys traveling, spending time with her family and friends, and playing games and puzzling.

- Please do not store your images and files on them.
 Use a flash drive or print out what you need during each session.
- If you download a document, please delete it from the desktop or downloads file after you have saved it to your flash drive. Computers are wiped clean periodically.
- 3) Please do not add any bookmarks to the bookmark toolbar and please do not change the bookmarks that are already there for everyone to use.
- 4) Subscription Databases—With the exception of two databases, you do not need to log in to any of the subscription databases, but can just start searching. Exceptions:
 - a.**Find My Past** The username is **sahyunli-brary@sbgen.org** and the password is genealogy20.
 - b. Family Search you must log in to your own account, using your username and password. If you don't have an account, you can create a free one.
