Happy Holidays Members and Friends!


I trust your stomachs were filled to the brim at Thanksgiving and now you are shopping 'til you are dropping for the winter holidays. Such fun!

Speaking of giving thanks, the Santa Barbara County Genealogical Society held its inaugural major donor appreciation luncheon on November 12th to honor those whose significant financial gifts help sustain and advance the mis-

sion of our organization. Nearly 20 people attended the event at the Santa Barbara Club.

I opened with a PowerPoint presentation of the Society's recent accomplishments, highlighting its financial stability, the value of its volunteer core, and the benefits it provides to the community. Besides the annual appeal that provides crucial funding for ongoing operations, donors contributed to special outreach exhibits and events, the Memorial Patio and Garden renovation, upgrading our educational technology and displays, and Tyler Frishknecht's Eagle Scout project of cleaning up the Santa Barbara County Hospital "Potters Field" Cemetery.

Featured speaker Janet Garufis, President and CEO of Montecito Bank and Trust, then shared her philosophy and experience with philanthropy in Santa Barbara. She emphasized how she has witnessed the three core values of sharing one's time, talent and treasures build up our vibrant nonprofit community. Ms. Garufis shared stories about how donors and volunteers have created and sustained cornerstone nonprofit organizations like the Santa Barbara Symphony, the Scholarship Foundation of Santa Barbara, Sansum Clinic Healthcare, the Santa Barbara Museum of Art, and CALM, all of which strengthen the fabric of the abundant community in which we live. But volunteer time is only one side of the coin that sustains a nonprofit Society such as ours; the other is treasure. Ms. Garufis emphasized the importance of donations to ensure our ability to deliver critical services in the near and distant future. She learned the lesson of giving to others as a little girl when she donated the precious pennies she had saved to a special project for the needy at her church. Reflecting on her childhood experience, Ms. Garufis realized that this simple act of giving to others would later become a crucial part of her career at Montecito Bank & Trust where she proudly oversees the Community Dividends program and other charitable initiatives.

As she wrapped up her keynote address, Ms. Garufis told the gathering how impressed she was with our Society calling it "the best kept secret in Santa Barbara." She praised the major donors who attended the luncheon, while also challenging us to double our major donor ranks to 40 by next year's luncheon. That should be doable for, as Development Director Mary Jacob has noted, the SBCGS' major donor threshold is only \$1,000 per fiscal year  $\Box$ .





### How Alphabetical is it?

Always check any printed alphabetical list for additions at the end, names out of order and other irregularities. In the days of manual type setting, lists of names (particularly those of post office letters) may not be as alphabet-

ical as a person thinks. There may be omitted names that were placed at the end simply because it was easier than changing all the type.

I include here a short voter registration list from 1871, small portion of "K" names in San Jose, CA:
